

From the American Community Survey: 1999

Population and Housing Profile: Sunrise city, Florida

NOTES: The population estimates in this profile are for people living in households and group quarters.


In the narrative profile below, if one sample estimate is larger than another, it does not necessarily mean that the same holds for their true values for the entire population. These estimates are derived from a sample of housing units and measure the true values with a degree of uncertainty. In the Profiles found at www.census.gov/acs/www/index_c.htm, this uncertainty is represented by the 90 percent confidence interval given for each estimate. Caution should be used when comparing data by race from previous years with those for 1999 due to the Census Bureau's implementation of the October 1997 revised standards for data on race and ethnicity. For the 1999 data, respondents may report one or more races and there are seven (American Indian and Alaska Native, Asian, Black or African American, Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, White, some other race, and two or more races) instead of five racial tabulation categories. The two or more races category includes all respondents who reported more than one race. See the methodology section for more details regarding these changes.

POPULATION OF Sunrise city: In 1999, Sunrise city had a population of 81,780. The median age was 36.3 years. Twenty-six percent were under 18 years and 17 percent were 65 or older. There was an equal amount of women and men.

The Age Distribution of People in Sunrise city, Florida in 1999





For people reporting one race, 67 percent of the people in Sunrise city were White, not of Hispanic origin; 17 percent were Black or African American, less than 0.5 percent were American Indian and Alaska Native, 2 percent were Asian, and less than 0.5 percent were Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander. Two percent reported two or more races. Thirteen percent of the people of Sunrise city were of Hispanic origin. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: In 1999 there were 32,444 households in Sunrise city. The average household size was 2.51 people.

Families made up 65 percent of the households in Sunrise city that year. This figure includes both married couple families (48 percent) and other families with no spouse present (16 percent). Non-family households made up 35 percent of all households in Sunrise city. Most of the non-family households were people living alone, but some were people living in households maintained by non-relatives.

The Types of Households in Sunrise city, Florida in 1999





NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: Twenty-three percent of the people living in Sunrise city in 1999 were foreign born. Seventy-seven percent were native born, including 26 percent who were born in the State of Florida.

Among people at least five years old living in Sunrise city in 1999, 18,391 spoke a language other than English at home. Of this group, 52 percent spoke Spanish, and 48 percent spoke some other language; 45 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well".

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 1999, 82 percent of the people one year or older living in Sunrise city were living in the same house one year earlier; 11 percent had moved during the past year from another house in the same county, 2 percent from another Florida county, 4 percent from another state, and 2 percent from abroad.

Geographic Mobility of Residents of Sunrise city, Florida in 1999



EDUCATION: In 1999, 82 percent of people at least 25 years old had at least graduated from high school and 18 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Among people 16 to 19 years old, 8 percent were dropouts: They were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Sunrise city was 21,857 in 1999. Preprimary school enrollment was 2,928 and 13,751 children were enrolled in elementary or high school. College enrollment was 5,178.

The Educational Attainment of People in Sunrise city, Florida in 1999





DISABILITY: In Sunrise city, among people at least five years old in 1999, 17 percent had a disability. The likelihood of having one or more functional limitations varied by age - from 7 percent of people 5 to 20 years old, to 12 percent of people 21 to 64 years old, to 45 percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES, OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: In 1999, for the employed population 16 and older, the leading industries in Sunrise city were Services, 35 percent, and Retail trade, 20 percent.

Among the most common occupations were: Technical, sales, and administrative support occupations, 41 percent; Managerial and professional specialty occupations, 27 percent; Service occupations, 14 percent; Precision production, craft, and repair occupations, 10 percent; and Operators, fabricators, and laborers, 7 percent. Eighty percent of the people in the employed labor force were Private wage and salary workers; 11 percent were Federal, state, or local government workers; and 8 percent were Self-employed.

TRAVEL TO WORK: Eighty-three percent of Sunrise city workers drove to work alone in 1999 and 12 percent car- or van-pooled. On average it took them 26 minutes to get to work.


INCOME: The median income of households in Sunrise city was \$38,493. Seventy-five percent of the households received earnings and 16 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS: In 1999, 5 percent of all families had incomes below the poverty level, compared with 18 percent of families with a female householder and no spouse present.

Nine percent of the households in Sunrise city received means-tested public assistance or noncash benefits. Thirty-two percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$11,945.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 1999, Sunrise city had a total of 35,201 housing units. Housing in Sunrise city was spread among 18,418 single-family homes (detached or attached), 32 mobile homes, and 16,751 units in multi-unit structures.

The Types of Housing Units in Sunrise city, Florida in 1999





In 1999, 8 percent of the housing units in Sunrise city were vacant. Sixty-nine percent of the vacant units were for seasonal, recreational, or occasional use. Seventeen percent of the housing units were built since 1990. One hundred percent of Sunrise city housing units had complete plumbing and 100 percent had complete kitchen facilities.

CHARACTERISTICS OF OCCUPANTS: The occupied units consisted of 24,604 that were owned by residents and 7,840 that were rented. Three percent of the households occupying these units reported not having telephone service in their home and 7 percent did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Thirty-seven percent had two vehicles and another 12 percent had three or more.

HOUSING COSTS: Twenty-nine percent of owners with mortgages in Sunrise city spent less than 20 percent of their household income on housing; 30 percent spent 30 percent or more on housing. Among renters, 19 percent spent less than 20 percent of their household income on rent and 58 percent spent 30 percent or more on rent. The median gross rent was \$883 per month.
