THESE DAYS SOME TEENAGERS ARE FINDING THAT THEIR PARENTS ARE PLAYING A MORE ACTIVE ROLE IN THEIR LIVES. IN 2004, NEARLY 47 PERCENT OF ALL TEENAGERS HAD RESTRICTIONS ON HOW MUCH TELEVISION THEY WATCHED, WHAT PROGRAMS THEY WATCHED, AND WHAT TIME THEY WATCHED TELEVISION, UP FROM ONLY 40 PERCENT WITH TELEVISION RESTRICTIONS 10 YEARS EARLIER. THE U.S. CENSUS BUREAU'S LATEST LOOK AT A CHILD'S DAY COVERS EVERYTHING FROM LIVING ARRANGEMENTS TO ACADEMIC EXPERIENCE.
