New Residential Construction

During 2012, local building permit offices in the 20,000-place universe authorized the construction of 829,658 new privately-owned housing units with a total valuation of \$140.4 billion. This was 1.7 percent above the preliminary annual estimate of 815,512 housing units and is a 33 percent increase from the 2011 total of 624,061.
