Economic Census Prototype Statistics

Issued May 2014

ABOUT THIS REPORT

In 2011, 24,055 multi-establishment enterprises with at least 250 employees operated in the United States. These enterprises operated 1.3 million individual establishments, earned \$19.6 trillion in revenue, employed 55.8 million people, and had a combined annual payroll of \$2.9 trillion. More than 1,660 enterprises generated a total of \$190.4 billion in revenue from royalties and license fees for rights to use intellectual property. Of the 18,145 enterprises that responded to the contract manufacturing item, nearly 1,100 reported purchasing contract manufacturing services from other enterprises or foreign subsidiaries.

FINDINGS

Industry Highlights

For this report, enterprises were classified into the Enterprise Classification System (ECS) sector in which they paid the largest share of payroll. Within these sectors, enterprises were assigned a detailed ECS industry, again based on the industry in which they paid the largest share of payroll. Auxiliary establishments, manufacturers' sales branches and offices, and managing offices (NAICS 551114) were not included when determining enterprise industry classifications, though

Among the 24,055 enterprises discussed in this report, more than 1-in-5 (5,049) were classified as Education, Health Care, and Social Assistance (ECS 61-62) enterprises. These enterprises operated 140,700 establishments employing 9.3 million people. General Medical and Surgical Hospital enterprises (ECS 622A) had the highest average employment per enterprise in this sector at 5,200.

More than 4,000 Manufacturing (ECS 31-33) enterprises operated 93,100 establishments, employed 8.5 million workers, and earned more than \$5.4 trillion in revenue. Total payroll for these enterprises was \$589.0 billion. The largest number of manufacturing enterprises were classified as Motor Vehicle Parts Manufacturing (ECS 336D) enterprises; these 210 enterprises had revenue of almost \$206.6 billion with total revenue per employee of almost \$547,000. Aerospace Product and Parts Manufacturing (ECS 336E) and Petroleum and Coal Products Manufacturing (ECS 324A) enterprises each operated more than 6,000 establishments.

Department Stores (ECS 452A) had the highest average employment per enterprise at 77,400, followed by Other General Merchandise Stores (ECS 452B), which include warehouse clubs and supercenters, with an average of 39,000 employees per enterprise. Average payroll per employee for these enterprises was \$23,000 and \$26,000, respectively.

Among all sectors, Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction (ECS 21) enterprises had the highest average payroll per employee of \$104,000. Average revenue per employee for these firms exceeded \$1.3 million.

Royalties and License Fees for Rights to Use Intellectual Property

More than 1,660 enterprises generated a total of \$190.4 billion in revenue from royalties and license fees for the rights to use of intellectual property in 2011. Four-in-ten of these were Manufacturing (ECS 31-33) enterprises which earned a total of \$27.0 billion in royalty and license fee income. Enterprises in the Information (ECS 51) sector had the highest total revenue from royalties and license fees at \$86.8 billion.

Income from licensing technological or industrial processes exceeded \$81.0 billion. Royalty and license fee income from rights to use entertainment, artistic, educational, and literary original works was \$54.2 billion. Income from software licenses (excluding end-user license agreements) was \$30.1 billion.

Wholesale Trade (ECS 42) enterprises reported the second highest total revenue from royalties and license fees (\$36.9 billion), the majority of which was from licensing technological or industrial processes (\$35.9 billion).

Contract Manufacturing

Of the 18,145 enterprises that responded to the contract manufacturing item, about 22 percent (3,982

enterprises) reported that they operated manufacturing facilities. Of these, almost 670 reported providing contract manufacturing services. About 1,100 enterprises reported purchasing contract manufacturing services.

Manufacturing activity responses are not available for nearly 25% of enterprises covered by this report due to item nonresponse (4,448 enterprises) or because no survey form was mailed to some enterprises that did not meet mailout criteria for the Report of Organization based on prior-year (2010) characteristics (1,462 enterprises).

Contract Manufacturing Services Provided

Most firms reporting that they provided contract manufacturing services were classified in the Manufacturing (ECS 31-33) sector (444 enterprises), followed by the Wholesale Trade (ECS 42) sector (52 enterprises).

About 50 Manufacturing (ECS 31-33) enterprises reported that 100% of their operating revenue and net sales was from contract manufacturing services. Almost all Wholesale Trade (ECS 42) enterprises reporting that they provided contract manufacturing services also reported that less than 25% of their operating revenue and net sales was from contract manufacturing services.

More than \$53.4 billion in revenue was generated by enterprises that reported 100% of their operating revenue and net sales were from contract manufacturing services provided.

Contract Manufacturing Services Purchased

Of the nearly 1,100 enterprises reporting that they purchased contract manufacturing services, most (757 enterprises) reported purchasing these services from third-parties inside the U.S. About half (560 enterprises) reported purchasing contract manufacturing services from third-parties outside the U.S., and about 440 enterprises reported purchasing contract manufacturing services from foreign subsidiaries or affiliates at locations outside the U.S. Note that enterprises could select more than response to this item.

Fewer than 20 enterprises reported that 100% of their cost of sales were from expenses for contract manufacturing services. Total revenue for these enterprises were \$16.5 billion, and they employed a total of 53,100 workers.

The majority of enterprises reporting that they purchased contract manufacturing services were Manufacturing (ECS 31-33) enterprises (653 enterprises), followed by Wholesale Trade (ECS 42) enterprises (151 enterprises).

NEXT STEPS

The Census Bureau will conduct outreach with data users to assess these prototype estimates. Based on data users' evaluations and comments, as well as an internal review of methodology, areas of improvement for the

Enterprise Statistics Program will be identified and implemented.

The 2012 Enterprise Statistics releases are tentatively scheduled for publication in February 2016.

DEFINITIONS

Contract manufacturing is an arrangement whereby one enterprise contracts with another enterprise to manufacture a product or component based on the purchasing enterprise's intellectual property.

Enterprises are economic units comprising one or more establishments under common ownership or control. This report only covers enterprises with at least 250 employees and at least 2 establishments in-scope to the economic census.

Establishments are single physical locations where business is conducted or where services or industrial operations are performed. For this report, only data from domestic, nongovernment establishments in-scope to the economic census are included in tabulations.

Foreign affiliates are subsidiaries not located in the 50 states or the District of Columbia.

Intellectual property is an intangible asset owned and legally protected by an enterprise from outside use or implementation without consent. Intellectual property includes patents, trade secrets, proprietary technology,

entertainment or artistic works, rights to reproduce or distribute software, and business format franchise property.

Provided contract manufacturing services describe manufacturing services *provided for* a third-party wherein the product or component being manufactured is based on the purchaser's intellectual property.

Purchased contract manufacturing services describe manufacturing services *purchased from* a third-party, foreign subsidiary, or foreign affiliate wherein the product or component being manufactured is based on the purchaser's intellectual property.

Revenue is operating revenue or net sales.

Royalties and license fees for rights to use intellectual property describe revenue received by an enterprise allowing reproduction, distribution, or use of intellectual property by a third-party, foreign subsidiary, or foreign affiliate. Sales of computer software end-user license agreements are not included.

Subsidiaries are establishments or enterprises who are owned more than 50 percent (by outstanding voting stock) by a parent enterprise, as well as establishments or enterprises in which a parent enterprise has the power to direct or cause the direction of the management and policies of the subsidiary.

Total quantity response rate (TQRR) is the percentage of a given estimate that is derived from reported (or equivalent quality) data.

METHODOLOGY

Sources of the Data

To produce the 2011 Enterprise Statistics Program (ESP) prototype tables, questions were added to the 2011 Report of Organization questionnaire, form NC-99001. Further information about the Report of Organization can be found at www.census.gov/econ/overview/mu0700.html.

The Report of Organization sample is a nonprobability sample. To define a population of inference, the scope of the ESP was limited to include only enterprises selected for the Report of Organization with certainty. For 2011, this includes all multi-establishment enterprises with 250 or more employees and at least 2 establishments in industries in-scope to the economic census.

Reliability of Estimates

All data compiled in these prototype tables represent a complete enumeration of enterprises within the defined scope, and therefore are not subject to sampling variability. However, the data are subject to nonsampling errors. Nonsampling errors can be attributed to many sources including inability to identify all cases in the actual universe, definition and classification difficulties, differences in the interpretation of questions, errors in recording or coding the data obtained, and other errors of collection, response, coverage, processing, and estimation for missing or misreported data.

The accuracy of these tabulated data is determined by the joint effects of the various nonsampling errors. Explicit measures of the effects of these nonsampling errors are not available. However, precautionary steps were taken in all phases of the collection, processing, and tabulation of the data to identify and, where possible, minimize the effects of nonsampling errors.

Treatment of Nonresponse

The ESP used a mixture of methods to account for enterprises that are active and in-scope for the reference year but who do not respond to the questionnaire. For enterprises with missing revenue, administrative data were used whenever possible. If administrative data were not available, an imputation model was used to predict enterprise revenue based on the payroll for that enterprise and the ratio of revenue to payroll for responding enterprises in the same ECS sector.

For enterprises with missing royalty and license fee data, ESP staff first estimated the number of nonresponding enterprises likely to have royalty revenue greater than zero. This likelihood was based on the percentage of responding enterprises reporting royalty revenue greater than zero by ECS sector and size of enterprise, as well as the presence of royalty revenue for the enterprise in the 2007 Economic Census. Next, the total royalty revenue for those enterprises identified as likely to have positive royalty revenue was estimated based on the ratio of royalties to revenue for responding enterprises with positive royalty by ECS sector and size. The detailed items for royalties were estimated by:

Disclosure Avoidance

Noise infusion is a method of disclosure avoidance in which values for each enterprise are perturbed prior to table creation by applying a random noise multiplier to the magnitude data (*i.e.*, characteristics such as revenue, payroll, and number of employees) for each enterprise. Disclosure protection is accomplished in a manner that results in a relatively small change in the vast majority of cell values.

For the 2011 ESP, each published row has an associated noise flag, indicating the relative amount of distortion in the row resulting from the perturbation of the data for the contributors to the row. The flag for 'low noise' (L) indicates the value was changed by less than 2 percent with the application of noise. The flag for 'moderate noise' (M) indicates the value was changed by 2 percent or more but less than 8 percent. Cells that have been changed by 8 percent or more are suppressed from the published tables. Additionally, other cells in the table may be suppressed for additional protection from disclosure or because the quality of the data does not meet publication standards. Though some of these suppressed cells may be derived by subtraction, the results are not official and may differ substantially from the true estimate.

The number of enterprises in a particular tabulation cell is not considered a disclosure of confidential information about an individual enterprise or establishment; therefore, this information may be released without the infusion of noise.
