


Domestic Violence

- Includes victimizations committed by intimate partners (current or former spouses, boyfriends, or girlfriends), immediate family members (parents, children, or siblings), and other relatives
- Accounted for 21% of all violent victimization
- Declined 67% from 1994 to 2013
- A larger percentage of females were victims than males
- Most domestic violence against females was committed by the victim's current or former boyfriend or girlfriend or spouse
- More than half of all domestic violence was reported to police




Violence against Intimate Partners Declined Faster than Violence against Other Family Members




Who Commits Domestic Violence?




Why Don't Victims Report Domestic Violence to Police?




Who Receives Assistance from Victim Service Organizations?






13% of Female Intimate Partner Violence Involved an Offender with a Weapon


18% of Female Victims of Intimate Partner Violence Sought Medical Treatment
