> Dear Mr. Monk,  
 > I would like to provide a quick comment regarding one of the changes the

> Census Bureau is requesting to make to 15 CFR Part 30 concerning SED's.  
> We currently file through AES and appreciate the governments endeavor to  
> file electronically. My problem is with US Customs and the use of "Export  
> Summaries". Export Summaries are documents that US Customs makes us fill  
> out, on our letterhead, with the exact same information that prints out on  
> the AES SED once the application has been accepted. What a shipper should  
> be able to do is once the transaction has been accepted, print the AES SED  
> and submit this to US Customs as proof the shipment has been processed  
> through AES in lieu of the Export summary. I would personally like to  
> keep the SED (from the AES transaction) and do away with the Customs  
> requirement. I was under the impression that by placing the ITN and XTN  
> numbers on our export paperwork (invoice/AWB) that Customs would be able  
> to look up the transaction and see the same information that we submitted  
> on AES. This doesn't seem to be the case. Especially since we've  
> fielded calls from Customs requesting copies of the AES email reply  
> showing the XTN, ITN and shipment reference number. It just seems that  
> for everything you do to try to cut down on paperwork, another agency is  
> creating paperwork to substitute for what you delete. If you want to call  
> the AES SED something else then that would be fine, I just think that  
> Customs should accept the AES document as proof of filing through AES  
> instead of the Export Summary. I would welcome your comment or feedback.
