Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders

February 1992

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(All figures in text are in seasonally adjusted current dollars)

Summary

New orders for manufactured goods in February increased 1.2 billion or 0.5 percent to \$236.4 billion, the Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census reported today. The February increase follows a 0.5 percent January increase and 3.7 percent December decrease. An increase in nondurables more than offset a decline in durables.

Shipments were up \$4.9 billion or 2.1 percent to \$241.2 billion. This is the tenth increase in the last eleven months. Both durables and nondurables increased in February.

Unfilled orders decreased \$4.9 billion or 1.0 percent to \$505.3 billion and are at the lowest level since \$505.1 billion in September 1989. This is the sixth consecutive monthly decline and the twelfth in the last fourteen months. Both durables and nondurables were down in February.

Inventories were down \$1.2 billion or 0.3 percent to \$372.8 billion and are at the lowest level since \$372.4 billion in February 1989. This is the fifth consecutive monthly decline and eleventh in the last twelve months. A decrease in durables more than offset an increase in nondurables. The inventories-to-shipments ratio in February decreased to 1.55 from 1.58 in January.

New Orders

New orders for durable goods in February decreased \$0.4 billion or 0.3 percent to \$120.2 billion. The February decrease followed a 2.4 percent increase in January and a 5.0 percent decrease in December. Excluding defense, new orders were up \$1.1 billion or 1.0 percent.

The largest decline occurred in instruments and related products, down \$0.6 billion or 6.3 percent to \$9.2 billion, primarily due to search and navigation equipment. Other declines included industrial machinery and equipment, down \$0.4 billion or 1.9 percent to \$20.6 billion, fabricated metal products, down \$0.3 billion or 2.2 percent to \$15.1 billion, and electronic and other electrical equipment, down \$0.3 billion or 1.9 percent to \$17.0 billion. The largest increase occurred in primary metals, up \$0.8 billion or 8.0 percent to \$10.9 billion. Transportation equipment was up \$0.3 billion or 0.9 percent to \$29.8 billion, as increases in motor vehicle and parts and railroad and other transportation equipment more than offset decreases in aircraft and parts and shipbuilding and tanks.

New orders for nondurable goods increased \$1.6 billion or 1.4 percent to \$116.2 billion, following consecutive declines in January and December.

Shipments

Shipments of durable goods in February increased \$3.3 billion or 2.7 percent to \$124.9 billion, following a 1.5 percent increase in January. Like all manufactured goods, durable goods has shown ten increases in the last eleven months. Excluding transportation equipment, shipments were up \$0.7 billion or 0.7 percent. Transportation equipment, led by motor vehicles and parts and aircraft and parts, was up \$2.6 billion or 8.5 percent to \$33.4 billion.

Shipments of nondurable goods increased \$1.6 billion or 1.4 percent to \$116.3 billion, following declines in January and December. Except for tobacco products, all major groups increased in February. The largest increases occurred in petroleum and coal products, up \$0.7 billion, and food and kindred products, up \$0.6 billion.

Unfilled Orders

Unfilled orders for durable goods in February decreased \$4.7 billion or 1.0 percent to \$483.6 billion and are at the lowest level since \$483.2 billion in September 1989. This is the sixth consecutive monthly decline. Excluding defense, unfilled orders declined \$2.1 billion. Transportation equipment was down \$3.6 billion or 1.3 percent to \$268.1 billion, primarily due to aircraft and parts, and is at the lowest level since \$266.9 billion in March 1990. Instruments and related products declined \$0.6 billion or 1.1 percent to \$55.2 billion, primarily due to search and navigation equipment. Unfilled orders for nondurable goods, down \$0.2 billion or 0.7 percent to \$21.7 billion, have declined for the second consecutive month.

Inventories

Inventories for durable goods in February were down \$1.2 billion or 0.5 percent to \$237.7 billion and are at the lowest level since \$237.6 billion in November 1988. This is the thirteenth decline in the last fifteen months. The largest decreases were in industrial machinery and equipment, down \$0.4 billion, transportation equipment, down \$0.3 billion, and fabricated metal products and instruments and related products, each down \$0.2 billion. Nondurable goods increased \$0.1 billion to \$135.2 billion.

By stage of fabrication, finished-goods inventories were down 0.1 percent in durables and remained unchanged in nondurables. Work in process declined 0.7 percent in durables and increased 0.6 percent in nondurables. Materials and supplies decreased 0.5 percent in durables and 0.1 percent in nondurables.





Three Month Moving Averages


