Full Report on Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories and Orders September 2010

Summary

New orders for manufactured goods in September, up three consecutive months, increased \$8.8 billion or 2.1 percent to \$420.0 billion, the U.S. Census Bureau reported today. This followed a slight August increase. Excluding transportation, new orders increased 0.4 percent.

Shipments, up two of the last three months, increased \$1.7 billion or 0.4 percent to \$418.2 billion. This followed a 0.2 percent August decrease.

Unfilled orders, up six consecutive months, increased \$8.0 billion or 1.0 percent to \$813.5 billion. This followed a 0.2 percent August increase. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio was 5.64, up from 5.61 in August.

Inventories, up eight of the last nine months, increased \$3.5 billion or 0.7 percent to \$531.2 billion. This followed a 0.4 percent August increase. The inventories-to-shipments ratio was unchanged at 1.27.

New Orders

New orders for manufactured durable goods in September, up two of the last three months, increased \$6.8 billion or 3.5 percent to \$200.0 billion, revised from the previously published 3.3 percent increase. This followed a 0.8 percent August decrease.

Transportation equipment, also up two of the last three months, had the largest increase, \$7.5 billion or 15.8 percent to \$54.8 billion.

New orders for manufactured nondurable goods increased \$1.9 billion or 0.9 percent to \$220.0 billion.

Shipments

Shipments of manufactured durable goods in September, down two consecutive months, decreased \$0.3 billion or 0.1 percent to \$198.2 billion, revised from the previously published 0.4 percent decrease. This followed a 1.3 percent August decrease.

Computer and electronic products, down four of the last five months, had the largest decrease, \$0.4 billion or 1.3 percent to \$33.8 billion.

Shipments of manufactured nondurable goods, up two consecutive months, increased \$1.9 billion or 0.9 percent to \$220.0 billion. This followed a 0.8 percent August increase. Chemical products, up three consecutive months, led the increase, up \$0.8 billion or 1.4 percent to \$60.8 billion.

Unfilled Orders

Unfilled orders for manufactured durable goods in September, up six consecutive months, increased \$8.0 billion or 1.0 percent to \$813.5 billion, unchanged from the previously published increase. This followed a 0.2 percent August increase.

Transportation equipment, up following four consecutive monthly decreases, had the largest increase, \$5.8 billion or 1.2 percent to \$480.0 billion.

Inventories

Inventories of manufactured durable goods in September, up nine consecutive months, increased \$1.5 billion or 0.5 percent to \$314.7 billion, unchanged from the previously published increase. This followed a 0.7 percent August increase.

Transportation equipment, also up nine consecutive months, had the largest increase, \$1.2 billion or 1.4 percent to \$82.7 billion.

Inventories of manufactured nondurable goods, up two of the last three months, increased \$1.9 billion or 0.9 percent to \$216.4 billion. This followed a 0.1 percent August decrease. Petroleum and coal products, up two of the last three months, led the increase, up \$1.7 billion or 4.3 percent to \$41.8 billion.

By stage of fabrication, September materials and supplies increased slightly in durable goods and 1.6 percent in nondurable goods. Work in process increased 1.1 percent in durable goods and decreased slightly in nondurable goods. Finished goods increased 0.4 percent in durable goods and 0.8 percent in nondurable goods.

Survey Description

This report is compiled from results of the U.S. Census Bureau's Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) survey. This survey provides statistics on manufacturers' value of shipments, new orders (net of cancellations), end-of-month order backlog (unfilled orders), end-of-month total inventory (at current cost or market value), and inventories by stage of fabrication (materials and supplies, work-in-process, and finished goods). The M3 includes approximately 4,300 reporting units. Units may be divisions of diversified large companies, large homogenous companies, or single-unit manufacturers in 89 industry categories. Due to the small monthly sample, these 89 categories have been combined into 64 publication levels. The survey methodology assumes that the month-to-month changes of the total operations of those companies in the monthly survey effectively represent the month-to-month movements of all establishments that make up the category. The current coverage levels in the survey show that reported data in the monthly survey represent approximately 60 percent of the shipments estimates at the total manufacturing level. Data published represent manufacturing in a calendar month. The data collection is based on a voluntary survey authorized by Title 13 of the United States Code.

The data presented in this release are based on data obtained from a panel of 4,300 reporting units and provide an indication of the activity within the manufacturing sector. The results differ from what would be obtained from a complete enumeration of all manufacturing companies. In addition, a different panel of 4,300 companies would yield different results. The M3 panel is comprised of companies with \$500 million or more in shipments and a limited number of smaller companies. From a statistical perspective, the panel is not a probability sample; therefore, the sampling errors that are normally provided with sample surveys cannot be measured. Nonsampling errors are attributable to many sources. The use of company or divisional reports to estimate the monthly change for establishments is one source of nonsampling error. The use of primarily large companies to represent the month-to-month movement of all companies is another potential source. Any corrections will be published in the full report. Corrections received after the full report will be released in the next month's advance report. Any revisions made later than two months will be reflected in the annual benchmark publication.
