## SCHOOL ENROLLMENT IN THE UNITED STATES: 1969

(Advance data, October 1969 survey)

About 59.9 million persons 3 to 34 years old in the United States were enrolled in school or college in the fall of 1969, according to the results of the Current Population Survey conducted in October 1969 by the Bureau of the Census. This figure represents an increase of 14 percent over the 52.5 million enrolled in October 1964.

The increases in enrollment of persons in the compulsory school attendance ages were primarily due to increases in the number of persons 6 to 17 years old, whereas, increases in enrollment among persons outside the compulsory attendance ages were due primarily to increases in enrollment rates.

been especially noteworthy. In 1964, about 800,000 children 3 and 4 years old, or 10 percent of those in this age group, were enrolled in nursery school or kindergarten. By 1969 this figure had increased to 1.2 million, or 16 percent of the age group.

Since 1964 the number of college students has increased from 4.6 million to 7.4 million, or by 60 per-

Among those 18 to 24 years old, 3.6 million, or 20 percent of the age group, were enrolled in college in 1964, compared with 5.8 million, or 27 percent of the age group, in 1969.

Since the figures presented in this report are based on sample data, they may differ from the figures that would have been obtained from a complete census. The sampling variation may be relatively large where the numbers shown are small. A more complete statement on the variability due to sampling, as well as more detailed information about the fall enrollment figures, will be issued in a later report in this series.
