SCHOOL ENROLLMENT IN THE UNITED STATES: 1970

(Advance data, October 1970 survey)

There were 60.4 million students enrolled in school or college in the fall of 1970. These students comprised 56 percent of persons 3 to 34 years old. The number of students represents an increase of 10 percent over the 54.7 million enrolled in October 1965. These results are based on the Current Population Survey conducted in October 1970 by the Bureau of the Census.

School enrollment rates continued to rank high for the compulsory attendance ages (7 to 17) and especially high for ages 7 to 13. About 99 percent of persons 7 to 13 were enrolled in school. Similar enrollment rates were reported for white and Negro persons in this age group.

The school enrollment rates of children 3 and 4 years old almost doubled over the past 5 years. In

1965, 886,000 children 3 and 4 years old, or 11 percent of those in this age group, were enrolled in nursery school or kindergarten. In 1970, this figure had increased to 1.5 million or 21 percent of the age group.

In 1965, the number of college students was 5.7 million but in 1970 there were 7.4 million college students, an increase of 31 percent. Among those 18 to 24 years old, 4.5 million, or 24 percent of the age group, were enrolled in college in 1965, compared with 5.8 million, or 26 percent of the age group, in 1970.

The number of Negroes enrolled in college has increased greatly. In 1965, there were 274,000 Negroes enrolled in college, but in 1970 this number had increased to 522,000, or by 91 percent. Among Negroes 18 to 24 years old, 210,000, or 10 percent of the age group, were enrolled in college in 1965, compared with 416,000, or 15 percent of the age group, in 1970.

Enrollment statistics shown in this report refer to the civilian noninstitutional population reported as enrolled in regular public and private schools and colleges by the middle of October, when the Current Population Survey was conducted. The statistics include both full-time and part-time students and persons who were working in addition to attending school.

Children enrolled in "Head Start" programs or similaprograms sponsored by local agencies to provide preschool education to young children are counted as enrolled in nursery school or kindergarten as appropriate. These figures may differ from figures on school enrollment reported by other sources, largely because (1) the Bureau of the Census collects data by household interviews, whereas information from other sources is generally based on reports from school systems and institutions of higher learning; and (2) there are often differences in definitions and time references. Also, enrollment as of October, will usually be lower than enrollment for the whole school year because the latter provides a cumulative count of persons who enter school at different times throughout the vear.

Since the figures presented in this report are based on sample data, they may differ from the figures that would have been obtained from a complete census. The sampling variation may be relatively large where the numbers shown are small. A more complete statement on the variability due to sampling, as well as more detailed information about the fall enrollment figures, will be issued in a later report in this series.
