

Introduction

BACKGROUND AND CONTENTS

This report presents detailed occupation data at the National and regional levels from the 1970 and 1980 Censuses of Population. It compares the occupational distributions of the "experienced civilian labor force," by sex, at both points in time, and thereby provides a measure of some of the changes that occurred in these distributions over the decade.

The 1980 data are derived from the computer file called the "1980 Census/EEO Special File," originally produced to help meet the needs of both government and private sector employers in planning Equal Employment Opportunity /Affirmative Action programs. The 1970 data are derived from the 1970 decennial census "Sixth-Count" data file.

Data from the 1970 census required adjustment before tabulation in this report. The 1970 data were originally tabulated in terms of the occupation classification used for that census. The 1980 data, however, were tabulated according to a completely different classification system modeled after the Standard Occupational Classification (SOC). (See "Occupation" in "Definitions and Explanations" section for more details on the classification systems.) To make reasonably accurate comparisons between the years, the 1970 data had to be reclassified into the 1980 system.

The Census Bureau selected from the 1970 census records a sample of approximately 120,000 persons in the civilian labor force. Using the 1970 census microfilm, census personnel entered the original descriptions into the sample file. These descriptions were later coded to the 1980 census categories. This double-coded sample thereby provided adjustment factors, by sex, that could be applied to the U.S. summary data found on the 1970 Sixth-Count file.

The 1980 categories shown in this report also differ somewhat in detail from the categories shown on the EEO Special File. Some categories in both data sets (1970 and 1980) were collapsed to provide a common set of categories for this report.

This report provides U.S. summary data and data for the four regions. For 1980, the printed State reports, Characteristics of the Population: Detailed Population Characteristics, PC80-1-D, also provide tables that compare 1970 and 1980 occupational data at the State level. These reports provide data for the employed as well as for the experienced civilian labor force.

ACCURACY OF THE DATA

All the data shown in this report are based on the 1970 and 1980 census

samples. The data are estimates of the actual figures that would have resulted from a complete count. Estimates can be expected to vary from the complete-count results, because they are subject to two basic types of error—sampling and non-sampling. The sampling error in the data arises from the selection of persons and housing units to be included in the sample. The nonsampling error, which affects both sample and complete-count data, is the result of all other errors that may occur during the collection and processing phases of the census.

In this report sampling error is especially important for small numbers, including the 1970 categories showing zero. These zeros do not always mean that there were no cases in a given 1980 occupation in 1970, but rather that there were no such cases in the sample of 120,000 persons used to adjust the 1970 data.

A more detailed discussion of both sampling and nonsampling error, a description of the estimation procedure, and the method of calculating sampling errors are provided in most printed reports from the 1970 and 1980 censuses and in the technical documentation for the EEO Special File. Definitions and Explanations

REFERENCE WEEK

The data on labor force status relate to the calendar week before the one in which the respondents completed their questionnaires or were interviewed by enumerators. The reference week is not the same for all respondents because not all persons were enumerated during the same week. Since the Census Days were April 1, 1970, and April 1, 1980, the reference week for many respondents was the last week of March 1970 and 1980, respectively.

CIVILIAN LABOR FORCE

The civilian labor force consists of persons classified as employed and unemployed according to the following criteria:

Employed—Employed persons include all civilians 16 years and over who were either (a) "at work" -those who did any work at all during the reference week as paid employees or in their own business, profession, or farm, or who worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers on a family farm or in a family business; or (b) "with a job but not at work"-those who did not work during the reference week but had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent due to illness, bad weather, industrial dispute, vacation, or other personal reasons. Excluded from the employed are persons whose only activity consisted of work around the house or volunteer work for religious, charitable, and similar organiza-

Unemployed—Persons are classified as unemployed if they are civilians 16 years old and over and (a) were neither "at work" nor "with a job but not at work" during the reference week, (b) were looking for work during the last 4 weeks, and (c) were available to accept a job.

Also included as unemployed are persons who did not work at all during the reference week and were waiting to be called back to a job from which they had been laid off.

Experienced Unemployed—Unemployed persons who have worked at any time in the past are classified as the "experienced unemployed."

Experienced Civilian Labor Force—The "experienced civilian labor force" includes the employed and experienced unemployed.

OCCUPATION

In both 1970 and 1980, the data on occupation were obtained for the employed, the experienced unemployed, and persons 16 years old and over with work experience but not currently in the labor force. For the last two categories, the occupation is the most recent job that a person held during the previous 5 years in 1980 and the previous 10 years in 1970. For an employed person that information is about the job held during the reference week. Those who were employed at two or more jobs reported the job at which they worked the greatest number of hours during the reference week.

Classification System—The occupational statistics in this report utilize the detailed classification system developed for the 1980 Census of Population. This classification consists of 503 specific occupation categories arranged into 6 summary and 13 major occupation groups. It is based on the 1980 Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) Manual, published by the U.S. Department of Commerce, Office of Federal Statistical Policy and Standards.

This report presents most of the 503 detailed occupation categories, plus a

category for unemployed with no recent civilian work experience, and industry and class of worker subcategories for a few selected occupations. The publications 1980 Census of Population, *Classified Index of Industries and Occupations*, PHC80-R4, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 1982, and the SOC Manual provide information on the composition of the detailed categories.

Comparability of 1980 and 1970 Occupation Data-As stated earlier, the 1970 data presented in this report have been adjusted to be comparable with the 1980 data. The 1970 data as originally presented in census reports were not totally comparable to the 1980 data because of major differences between the classification systems used for coding occupations in 1970 and 1980. Prior to the 1980 census there was no government-wide standard on which to base the successive decennial census occupational classification systems. In 1977, however, the Office of Federal Statistical Policy and Standards developed the SOC system and revised it in 1980 for use by all Federal agencies. The 1980 census system is the first based on this SOC system.

One advantage of this new classification is greater consistency of occupational data among government sources. On the other hand, since many 1980 occupation groups as well as detailed categories are only partially comparable to the ones in 1970, the differences will complicate studies attempting to measure changes during the decade.

Some of the differences in the classification structures are as follows:

 "Accountants" and "personnel and labor relations workers" were in the 1970 major group for "professional workers," but are now called "management related occupations" under the 1980 major group "executive, administrative and managerial."

- Working proprietors in sales and other sales managers who perform some of the same duties as the workers they supervise are now classified as "sales supervisors" rather than "managers."
- "Cashiers" and some "counter clerks, except food" were transferred from "clerical" to "sales occupations."
- 4. The farming occupations were expanded to include related off-farm activities, so some former "laborers" (e.g., gardeners) were transferred to this group.
- Some 1970 "operatives" were moved to "precision production occupations," such as "butchers and meat cutters," "dressmakers," "drywall installers," and "precision assemblers."
- 6. Conversely, some 1970 "craft workers" moved to "machine operators" or to "transportation and material moving occupations." Examples are "job setters" (those who set up a machine for others), "printing press operators," "locomotive operating occupations," and "excavating and loading machine operators."

A more detailed description of the changes in the classification systems and the data will be presented in a technical paper equivalent to the technical paper which compared the 1960 system to the 1970 system.¹

INDUSTRY AND CLASS OF WORKER

This report shows data on major industry and class of worker subcategories for selected occupation groups. The information on industry and class of worker refers to the same job as the respondent's occupation. The industry statistics are based on the 1980 census detailed classification system developed from the U.S. Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) system. Definitions of the class of worker categories shown in this report are as follows:

Salaried Employees—Persons who work for a private employer or for any Federal, State, or local governmental unit for wages, salary, commission, tips, pay-in-kind, or at piece rates; this category also includes persons who work as employees of their own incorporated business or trade.

Self-employed—Those who work for profit or fees in their unincorporated business, profession or trade, or who operate a farm, or who work without pay in a family business or farm.


