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Geographical Mobility: March 1985 to March 1986

INTRODUCTION

This report provides detailed statistics on the geographical mobility of Americans. The data were collected in the March 1986 Current Population Survey. In previous years, the migration reports in this series have included an analytical text. However, this year a new approach is being adopted in an attempt to speed the publication of the data. In this new format, the reports will consist primarily of data tables, without any corresponding analytical text. We plan to issue more detailed analysis of these and related migration data from other sources in a new series of subject-specific analytical reports providing in-depth treatment of trends of topical interest.

This publication does, however, include a few highlights of some of the most important changes that have occurred since last year, with particular reference to the rates of movement and changes in regional patterns of population movement. The text tables provided in the report summarize data from the detailed tables on these and additional subjects.

HIGHLIGHTS

The annual rate of moving declined to 18.6 (± 0.33) percent during the 1985-86 period, down from 20.2 (± 0.35) percent for the previous annual period.

- This decline is due to a drop in the rate of local moving (within the same county) from 13.1 (± 0.29) percent for 1984-85, to 11.3 (± 0.27) percent for 1985-86. Local moving rates were very low during the early part of this decade (between 10.0 and 10.5 percent) before rising to the 1984-85 rate.
- The rate of moving from one State to another remained at about 3.0 (± 0.15) percent per year, while the rate of moving between counties within the same State was 3.7 percent. Since 1980, this latter rate has remained fairly steady, fluctuating around 3.5 percent per year.
- Neither the Midwest nor the South had a significant change in population through internal migration for the 1985-86 period. This was a deviation from the usual pattern of net migration losses for the Midwest and net migration gains for the South. The Northeast continued to have a significant net loss of population due to migration while the West again had a significant net gain. (See previous reports in the P-20 series.)
- Metropolitan areas in the aggregate gained population (+633,000) at the expense of nonmetropolitan areas. However, the central cities of metropolitan areas lost population to both nonmetropolitan areas and the suburbs (-1,366,000 persons), while the suburbs gained population from both of the other types of areas (+1,999,000).
