

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

Marital Status and Living Arrangements: March 1991

INTRODUCTION

This report presents detailed information on the marital status and living arrangements of the noninstitutional population of the United States, based on the results of the March 1991 Current Population Survey. The text of this report compares current survey data with data collected from earlier surveys. In some instances, data from decennial censuses are used when survey data are not available.

The estimates for 1991 in this report are inflated to national population controls by age, race, sex, and Hispanic origin. The population controls are based on results of the 1980 census carried forward to 1991. The estimates in this report, therefore, may differ from estimates that would have been obtained using 1990 census results brought forward to the survey date. Population controls incorporating 1990 census results will be used for survey estimation beginning in 1993. Highlights of the topics discussed in this report include:

- The proportion of married persons among all adults has declined from 72 (± 0.4) to 61 (± 0.4) percent between 1970 and 1991, while the proportion unmarried rose from 28 (± 0.4) to 39 (± 0.4) percent.
- The estimated median age at first marriage was 26.3 (±0.1) years for men and 24.1 (±0.1) years for women in 1991.
- The number of interracial married couples was 994,000 (±110,000) in 1991, 1.9 (±0.2) percent of all married couples.
- Between 1970 and 1991, the proportion of children living with two parents declined from 85 (± 0.4) to 72 (± 0.6) percent, while the proportion living with one parent more than doubled, from 12 (± 0.4) to 26 (± 0.6) percent.
- In 1991, 5 (±0.3) percent of all children under 18 lived in the home of their grandparents.
- Three out of ten (±1.7) unmarried adults ages 25 to 29 lived in the home of their parents in 1991.
- Five (±0.7) percent of noninstitutionalized persons ages 75 years and over lived in the home of their son or daughter.

CURRENT MARITAL STATUS

The marital status distribution of persons 18 years and over has changed significantly over the past two decades. The proportion of married persons has declined as the proportion unmarried increased (table A and figure 1). Marital status, as shown in this report, reflects the person's status as of the survey date. For instance, the number divorced is a count of persons currently divorced and not yet remarried. It is not the count of all persons who ever divorced in their lifetime nor the number of persons who were granted a divorce in 1991.

The number of currently married persons (including married persons who lived apart from their spouse due to separation or some other reason) rose from 95 million to 113 million between 1970 and 1991, but the proportion declined from 72 to 61 percent of all adults. During the same two decades, the number of unmarried adults rose from 38 million in 1970 to 71 million in 1991, and the proportion they represented of all adults rose from 28 to 39 percent. Two of the major factors contributing to this change are delayed marriage and increased divorce.

The category "unmarried" includes currently never married, widowed, and divorced adults. Never-married persons make up the largest share of unmarried adults (58 percent) and a sizable portion of the total adult population (23 percent). Between 1970 and 1991, the number of never-married persons nearly doubled, from 21 to 41 million. However, the largest proportional increase of any marital status category has occurred among divorced persons. The number of currently divorced persons more than tripled from 4.3 million in 1970 to 15.8 million in 1991, representing 9 percent of all adults ages 18 and over in 1991.


Similar patterns of the decline in the proportion married and of the increase in the proportion unmarried have occurred for Whites, Blacks, and for persons of Hispanic origin. In 1991, 64 percent of White persons ages 18 and over were currently married, down from 73 percent in 1970. The unmarried White population showed proportional increases in all categories except widowed. The proportion never-married rose from 16 to 21 percent and the proportion divorced more than doubled, from 3 to 8 percent. The widowed proportion declined just slightly, from 9 to 7 percent. Less than half (44)

percent) of all Black adults ages 18 and older were currently married in 1991, a considerable decrease from 64 percent in 1970. More than one out of every three Black adults had never married in 1991, up from 21 percent two decades earlier. The proportion divorced rose from 4 to 11 percent, while the proportion widowed declined slightly from 11 to 9 percent during the 1970-91 period.

The proportion of Hispanics who were currently married declined from 72 to 61 percent between 1970 and 1991. The never-married proportion rose by one-half, more than for Whites but considerably less than for Blacks.

NEVER-MARRIED ADULTS

The number of persons who have never married has been one of the fastest growing segments of the adult population (table B and figure 2). In 1991, 41.5 million persons age 18 and older had never married, nearly twice the number in 1970 (21.4 million). These nevermarried persons accounted for 23 percent of all adults. The majority of this growth has been among men and women in their twenties and early thirties.


The proportion of women ages 20 to 24 who had never married rose from 36 percent in 1970 to 64 percent in 1991. Among women in their late twenties



and early thirties, the never-married proportions tripled during the past two decades (from 11 to 3 percent for ages 25 to 29 and from 6 to 19 percent for ages 30 to 34).

Men tend to marry at older ages than women and. therefore, generally have larger never-married proportions in the young adult ages. Eighty percent of men ages 20 to 24 years had never married in 1991, up from 55 percent in 1970. During this same time period, the proportion of men who had never married more than doubled for the 25-to-29 year age group (from 19 to 47 percent) and tripled for the 30-to-34 year age group (from 9 to 27 percent). Significant increases in the proportions never married had occurred for Whites. Blacks, and Hispanics alike, with the highest proportions among Blacks. The never-married proportions by sex across the age groups are very similar for Black men and women. Among Whites and Hispanics, young men tend to have higher proportions never married than their female counterparts. For instance, in 1991 in the 30-to-34 year age group, 43 percent of Black women and 44 percent of Black men had not married compared with 15 percent of White women and 25 percent of White men, and 19 percent of Hispanic women and 27 percent of Hispanic men.

MEDIAN AGE AT FIRST MARRIAGE

As the proportion of never-married adults has grown, the estimated median age at first marriage has gradually moved upward. The median age at first marriage was at record lows during the mid-1950's and has been rising ever since (table C). In the twenty years spanning 1955 and 1975, the median age at first marriage for women increased only about one year, from 20.2 years to 21.1 years. However, in the 16 years that followed, the median age for women climbed three full years, to 24.1 years in 1991.

Men exhibited a similar pattern. The estimated median age for men increased about one year between 1955 and 1975 (from 22.6 to 23.5) and rose another 2.8 years between 1975 and 1991 (from 23.5 to 26.3).

UNMARRIED MEN AND WOMEN

Among the population age 15 and older, there are fewer unmarried men than there are unmarried women (84 men per 100 women in 1991). However, the gap between unmarried men and women has narrowed slightly since 1970 (79 per 100). The "unmarried" category includes never married, widowed, and divorced persons.

The ratio of unmarried men to unmarried women varies by age group (table D and figure 3). There are more unmarried men than unmarried women at the younger ages and fewer at the middle to older ages. In fact, at peak marrying ages, unmarried men outnumber unmarried women. In 1991, there were 128 unmarried men per 100 unmarried women at ages 25 to 29 and 120 per 100 at ages 30 to 34. After age 40, unmarried women begin to outnumber unmarried men. In the age group 40-to-44, there were 83 unmarried men per 100 unmarried women, dropping to 29 per 100 by age 65 and over.

In general, the ratio of unmarried men to unmarried women as measured by the Current Population Survey (which includes only the civilian noninstitutionalized population) is highest for Hispanics and lowest for Blacks. The ratios in 1991 were 104 per 100 for persons of Hispanic origin, 86 per 100 for Whites, and 77 per 100 for Blacks. Among Whites, there were more unmarried men than unmarried women in the age groups below 40 years, but in no age group among Blacks did unmarried men outnumber unmarried women. Factors contributing to the sex ratio differences include later age at first marriage among young men and higher remarriage rates among older men following divorce and widow-hood.

MARRIED COUPLES, SAME RACE AND INTERRACIAL

This section focuses on racial intermarriage involving race groups classified as either White, Black, or other races. There were 53.2 million married couples in the United States in 1991. In the vast majority (at least 96



percent) of married couples, both partners were of the same race (White married to White and Black married to Black). The small percentage of couples remaining are divided into those that can be identified as interracial couples and those "other couples" that may or may not be interracial (table E).

Same-race couples comprised of White husband and White wife made up 89 percent of all married couples, and Black husbands married to Black wives were 7 percent of all couples. The "other couple" category includes married couples who identified themselves as American Indian, Eskimo, Aleut, Chinese, Japanese, etc., and any other races except White or Black.

A very small proportion of all married couples are interracial, and there has been very little increase in this percent over the past two decades. In 1991, there were 994,000 interracial married couples, representing only 1.9 percent of all married couples. The interracial categories in this report show 231,000 Black married to White couples in 1991, 720,000 White married to "other" (other than White or Black), and 43,000 Black married to "other" couples. Between 1970 and 1991, the number of interracial married couples increased from 310,000 to 994,000. This increase is partially

attributable to the difference between the surveys (Current Population Survey (CPS) versus Decennial census). When very small segments of the population are compared from one survey to another, the numerical differences may appear large but may be due (at least in part) to sampling variability. Among the states that reported race on the marriage records for those marriages that took place in 1988, 2 percent were interracial.²

CHILDREN BY PRESENCE OF PARENTS

The living arrangements of children under 18 are usually a reflection of the marital circumstances of the adult population. With the rise in divorce and increased delay in first marriage, the percent of children living with two parents is declining. Between 1970 and 1991, the proportion of children in two-parent living arrangements declined from 85 percent to 72 percent, while the proportion living with one parent more than doubled, from 12 percent to 26 percent (table F and figure 4).

Of the children living with only one parent in 1991, the majority (88 percent) lived with the mother, although the proportion living with the father has grown in recent years. Between 1970 and 1980, there was little or no change in the proportion living with father only (from 9.1 to 8.5 percent), but since 1980, the proportion has increased to 12.1 in 1991.

Children of divorce make up the largest share of one-parent children (37 percent), followed by children born to a parent who had never married (33 percent). The proportion of one-parent children who lived with a married parent, whose spouse was absent (due to marital discord, or for any other reason), was 24 percent, and the proportion living with a widowed parent was 5 percent (table 5).

White children are less likely to be living with one parent than Black children or children of Hispanic origin. The proportions living with one parent in 1991 were 20 percent for White children, 58 percent for Black children, and 30 percent for children of Hispanic origin.

GRANDCHILDREN

In 1991, 5 percent of children under 18 years lived in the home of their grandparents, up only slightly from 3 percent in 1970 (table G). This does not include children whose parent(s) maintain the home, even though grandparents are living with them. Among the 3.3 million grandchildren who lived in their grandparents' home, 50 percent had only their mother present, 5 percent had only their father present, 17 percent had both parents present, and 28 percent had neither parent present.



Black children were more likely to live in their grandparents' home than White children or children of Hispanic origin, and a larger share had only their mother present. Twelve percent of all Black children lived in the home of their grandparents, compared with 4 percent for Whites and 6 percent for Hispanics. Of the 1.3 million Black grandchildren, 62 percent had only their mother present, compared with 43 percent of the 1.9 million White grandchildren, and 44 percent of the 400,000 Hispanic grandchildren.³

Table H shows that there were 2.1 million families maintained by grandparents with grandchildren present. More than one-half of the grandparents' homes were maintained by both the grandmother and the grandfather, 43 percent by only the grandfather.

The families maintained by White grandparents were more likely to have both grandparents present (63 percent) than were families maintained by Black grandparents (35 percent) (figure 5). For Black families, the grandmother only was more likely to maintain the family (62 percent compared with 33 percent for White families). Among families of Hispanic origin, 53 percent were maintained by both grandparents and 43 percent by the grandmother only.

LIVING ARRANGEMENTS OF ADULTS

The living arrangements of adults vary greatly by age and marital status. Young adults and the elderly are

more likely to be unmarried, while middle-aged adults are more likely to be married. Married adults, regardless of age, almost always maintain their own home. Unmarried adults are more likely to maintain their own home as age increases (table I).

In 1991, of the 113 million currently-married adults, 96 percent maintained their own horre. Even among the young marrieds, the proportion maintaining their own homes was high. Of the 4.7 million married persons ages 20 to 24, 88 percent maintained their own home, living independently of others.

The living arrangements of unmarried adults vary greatly by age. The majority of young adults below age 30 live in the home of someone else—usually with their parents. Thirty-one percent of unmarried persons ages 25 to 29 lived in the home of their parents. At ages 35 to 39, 1 in 6 unmarried persons lived in their parents' home, while 4 in 6 maintained their own home.

After age 30, most unmarried adults maintain their own home. Many live alone, while others share their home, generally with one or more relatives. By age 65 and over, 84 percent of the noninstitutionalized unmarried adults maintained a home of their own in 1991, with a large majority (more than 8 in 10) living alone.

LIVING ARRANGEMENTS OF THE ELDERLY

In 1991, there were 30 million persons age 65 and older (excluding institutional population, such as those living in nursing homes or other places providing care or custody). Living arrangements of the elderly population differ by age, sex, and race. The "older" elderly (age 75 and over) are more likely than the "younger" elderly (age 65 to 74) to live with other relatives, females are more likely than males to live alone, and Whites and Hispanics are more likely than Blacks to live with their spouses (table J).










Between the ages of 65 and 74, the majority (64 percent) of persons were married and living with their spouse, 25 percent lived alone, and 10 percent lived with other relatives. By age 75 and over, there is a higher proportion of widowed persons, resulting in very different living arrangements than for the younger cohort. Persons age 75 years and over were equally as likely to live alone as to live with their spouse (41 percent and 39 percent, respectively), and about 1 in 6 lived with other relatives.

The majority of the elderly were women, 17.5 million versus 12.5 million men in 1991. Women on average live longer than men and longevity is a major factor affecting the difference in living arrangements by sex. One-third of women ages 65 to 74 and more than half of women age 75 and over lived alone in 1991. The proportions for men, by comparison, were 13 percent and 21 percent, respectively. Elderly men were more likely than elderly women to live with their spouse (figure 6).

Elderly Blacks were less likely in 1991 to live with their spouse than were elderly Whites and Hispanics. This may be a result of the shorter life expectancy of Blacks as well as the higher proportion of Blacks who never marry. The proportion of elderly who lived alone was higher for Whites and Blacks than for persons of Hispanic origin, and the proportion who lived with other relatives was higher for Blacks and Hispanics than for Whites.

In 1991, the elderly were slightly less likely to live in the home of a son or daughter than in the two earlier decades shown in table K. The proportions of persons age 65 years and over who lived with a son or daughter was 3 percent in 1991, compared with 4 percent in 1980 and 5 percent in 1970. When the age group is restricted to persons 75 years and over, the proportion living in their child's home is slightly larger but still less than in the prior two decades (5 percent in 1991, 8 percent in 1980, and 8 percent in 1970).

The proportion of elderly living in their child's home would be greater if we were to include those where the child's spouse was listed as the person maintaining the home. In other words, where the parents are listed as the parents-in-law of the householder. The Census Bureau classifies living arrangements by the relationship to the householder. (The householder is the person, or one of the persons, in whose name the home is owned or rented.) Thus, when a person's son or daughter is listed as the householder, the relationship is

"parent." When the spouse of the son or daughter is listed as the householder, the relationship is "parent-in-law." In the decennial census there are separate counts for parents-in-law. In the Current Population Survey, parents-in-law are included in the count of "other relatives." Thus, no current estimate is available for "parent-in-law."

When the count of parents-in-law is included with the count of parents, the proportion of elderly who live in their child's home rises. Based on data from the 1980 Decennial Census, when parents-in-law were included, the proportion living with their son or daughter was 6 percent for age 65 and over (versus 4 percent for parent only) and 11 percent for age 75 and over (versus 8 percent for parent only).

Appendix A. Definitions and Explanations

Coverage. The population in this report includes the civilian noninstitutional population of the United States plus approximately 977,000 members of the Armed Forces in the United States living off post or with their families on post in 1991 but excludes all other members of the Armed Forces. However, the data in table A on median age at first marriage for men refer to the total male population which includes, in addition to the above, the male members of the Armed Forces overseas and in military barracks and similar quarters in the United States.

Symbols. A dash (-) represents zero or rounds to zero. The symbol "B" means that the base for the derived figure is less than 75,000. An "X" means not applicable, and "NA" means not available.

Rounding of estimates. Individual figures are rounded to the nearest thousand without being adjusted to group totals, which are independently rounded; percentages are based on the unrounded numbers.

Metropolitan-nonmetropolitan residence. The population residing in metropolitan statistical areas (MSA's) constitutes the metropolitan population. MSA's are defined by the Office of Management and Budget for use in the presentation of statistics by agencies of the Federal Government. An MSA is a geographic area consisting of a large population nucleus, together with adjacent communities which have a high degree of economic and social integration with that nucleus. The definitions specify a boundary around each large city so as to include most or all its suburbs. Entire counties form the MSA building blocks, except in New England where cities and towns are used. The former term SMSA was changed to MSA in 1983.

An area qualifies for recognition as an MSA if (1) it includes a city of at least 50,000 population, or (2) it includes a Census Bureau-defined urbanized area of at least 50,000 with a total metropolitan population of at least 100,000 (75,000 in New England). In addition to the county containing the main city or urbanized area, an MSA may include other counties having strong commuting ties to the central county. If specified conditions are met, certain large MSA's are designated as consolidated MSA's (CMSA's) and divided into component primary MSA's (PMSA's).

In July 1985, the CPS began carrying the metropolitan statistical area definitions announced by the Office of Management and Budget on June 30, 1984. Figures published from the CPS in the early 1980's and throughout most of the 1970's referred to metropolitan areas as defined on the basis of the 1970 census. Since there are important differences in the population classified as metropolitan using the 1970 and 1984 definitions, comparisons should be avoided.

The new CPS metropolitan estimates have consistently been higher than independent estimates of the metropolitan population prepared by the Census Bureau; the new CPS nonmetropolitan estimates have been lower than the independent estimates. The apparent overestimation of metropolitan and underestimation of nonmetropolitan population in the CPS relative to the Census Bureau's independent estimates should be taken into account when using the data.

Age. The age classification is based on the age of the person at the person's last birthday. The adult universe (i.e., population of marriageable age) now comprises persons 15 years old and over. Prior to 1980 the adult universe was 14 years old and over.

Race. The population is divided into three groups on the basis of race: White, Black, and other races. The last category includes Indians, Japanese, Chinese, and any other race except White and Black.

Persons of Hispanic origin. Persons of Hispanic origin in this report were determined on the basis of a question that asked for self-identification of the person's origin or descent. Respondents were asked to select their origin (or the origin of some other household member) from a "flash card" listing ethnic origins. Persons of Hispanic origin, in particular, were those who indicated that their origin was Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or some other Hispanic origin. Persons of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

Marital status. The marital status classification identifies four major categories: never married, married, widowed, and divorced. These terms refer to the marital status at the time of the enumeration.

The category "married" is further divided into "married, spouse present," "separated," and "other married, spouse absent." A person was classified as "married, spouse present" if the husband or wife was reported as a member of the household, even though he or she may

have been temporarily absent on business or on vacation, visiting, in a hospital, etc., at the time of the enumeration. Persons reported as separated included those with legal separations, those living apart with intentions of obtaining a divorce, and other persons permanently or temporarily separated because of marital discord. The group "other married, spouse absent" includes married persons living apart because either the husband or wife was employed and living at a considerable distance from home, was serving away from home in the Armed Forces, had moved to another area, or had a different place of residence for any other reason except separation as defined above.

Age at first marriage. The median age at first marriage, as shown in this report, is an approximation derived indirectly from tabulations of marital status and age. In computing this median, several steps are involved. First, the expected proportion of young people who will ever marry during their lifetime is computed. Second, one-half of this expected proportion is calculated. And third, the current age of young people who are at this halfway mark is computed. From the assumptions made and the procedures used, it follows that the date of the survey is also the date when this halfway mark is reached. Half of the young people of the given age who will ever get married had done so prior to the survey date and half are expected to marry in years to come.

The quartile ages at first marriage divide people who will every marry into four equal groups. The first quartile age is the age at which 25 percent of persons have married, the second quartile age (or median age) is the age at which 50 percent of persons have married, and the third quartile age is the age at which 75 percent of persons have married. The quartile ages are computed from the same distributions and involve the same assumptions as to the median ages.

Household. A household consists of all the persons who occupy a housing unit. A house, an apartment or other group of rooms, or a single room, is regarded as a housing unit when it is occupied or intended for occupancy as separate living quarters; that is, when the occupants do not live and eat with any other persons in the structure and there is direct access from the outside or through a common hall.

A household includes the related family members and all the unrelated persons, if any, such as lodgers, foster children, wards, or employees who share the housing unit. A person living alone in a housing unit, or a group of unrelated persons sharing a housing unit as partners, is also counted as a household. The count of households excludes group quarters.

Group quarters. As of 1983, group quarters were defined in the Current Population Survey as noninstitutional living arrangements for groups not living in conventional

housing units or groups living in housing units containing ten or more unrelated persons or nine or more persons unrelated to the person in charge. (Prior to 1983, group quarters included housing units containing five or more persons unrelated to the person in charge.) Examples of persons in group quarters include a person residing in a rooming house, in staff quarters at a hospital, or in a halfway house. Beginning in 1972, inmates of institutions have not been included in the Current Population Survey.

Householder. The householder refers to the person (or one of the persons) in whose name the housing unit is owned or rented (maintained) or, if there is no such person, any adult member, excluding roomers, boarders, or paid employees. If the house is owned or rented jointly by a married couple, the householder may be either the husband or the wife. The person designated as the householder is the "reference person" to whom the relationship of all other household members, if any, is recorded.

Prior to 1980, the husband was always considered the householder in married-couple households. The number of householders is equal to the number of households. Also, the number of family householders is equal to the number of families.

Head versus householder. Beginning with the 1980 CPS, the Bureau of the Census discontinued the use of the terms "head of household" and "head of family." Instead, the terms "householder" and "family householder" are used. Recent social changes have resulted in greater sharing of household responsibilities among the adult members and, therefore, have made the term "head" increasingly inappropriate in the analysis of household and family data. Specifically, the Census Bureau has discontinued its longtime practice of always classifying the husband as the reference person (head) when he and his wife are living together.

In this report, the term "householder" is used in the presentation of data that had previously been presented with the designation "head." The householder is the first adult household member listed on the questionnaire. The instructions call for listing first the person (or one of the persons) in whose name the home is owned or rented. If a home is owned jointly by a married couple, either the husband or the wife may be listed first, thereby becoming the reference person, or householder, to whom the relationship of other household members is to be recorded.

Reference person. The reference person is the person with regard to whom the relationship of other persons in the household is recorded. The household reference person is the person listed as the householder (see definition of "Householder"). The subfamily reference person is either the single parent or the husband/wife in a married-couple situation.

Family. A family is a group of two persons or more (one of whom is the householder) related by birth, marriage, or adoption and residing together; all such persons (including related subfamily members) are considered as members of one family. Beginning with the 1980 CPS, unrelated subfamilies (referred to in the past as secondary families) are no longer included in the count of families, nor are the members of unrelated subfamilies included in the count of family members.

Family household. A family household is a household maintained by a family (as defined above), and any unrelated persons (unrelated subfamily members and/or secondary individuals) who may be residing there are included. The number of family households is equal to the number of families. The count of family household members differs from the count of family members, however, in that the family household members include all persons living in the household, whereas family members include only the householder and his/her relatives. See the definition of family.

Related subfamily. A related subfamily is a married couple with or without children, or one parent with one or more own never-married children under 18 years old, living in a household and related to, but not including, the person or couple who maintains the household. One example of a related subfamily is a young married couple sharing the home of the husband's or wife's parents. The number of related subfamilies is not included in the count of families.

Unrelated subfamily. An unrelated subfamily (formerly called a secondary family) is a married couple with or without children, or a single parent with one or more own never-married children under 18 years old living in a household. Unrelated subfamily members are not related to the householder. An unrelated subfamily may include persons such as guests, partners, roommates, or resident employees and their spouses and/or children. The number of unrelated subfamily members is included in the total number of household members, but is not included in the count of family members.

Beginning in 1989, any person(s) who is not related to the householder and who is not the husband, wife, parent, or child in an unrelated subfamily is counted as an unrelated individual.

Family group. A family group is any two or more persons (not necessarily including a householder) residing together, and related by birth, marriage, or adoption. A household may be composed of one such group, more than one, or none at all. The count of family groups includes family households, related subfamilies, and unrelated subfamilies.

Married couple. A married couple, as defined for census purposes, is a husband and wife enumerated as members of the same household. The married couple

may or may not have children living with them. The expression "husband-wife" or "married-couple" before the term "household," "family," or "subfamily" indicates that the household, family, or subfamily is maintained by a husband and wife. The number of married couples equals the count of married-couple families plus related and unrelated married-couple subfamilies.

Unmarried couple. An unmarried couple is composed of two unrelated adults of the opposite sex (one of whom is the householder) who share a housing unit with or without the presence of children under 15 years old.

Unrelated individuals. Unrelated individuals are persons of any age who are not members of families or subfamilies.

Nonfamily householder. A nonfamily householder is a person maintaining a household while living alone or exclusively with persons to whom they are not related.

Secondary individuals. Secondary individuals are persons of any age who reside in a household, but are not related to the householder (except unrelated subfamily members). Persons who reside in group quarters are also secondary individuals. Examples of a secondary individual include (1) a guest, partner, roommate, or resident employee; (2) a foster child; or (3) a person residing in a rooming house, a halfway house, staff quarters at a hospital, or other type of group quarters.

Own children and related children. "Own" children in a family are sons and daughters, including stepchildren and adopted children, of the householder. Similarly, "own" children in a subfamily are sons and daughters of the married couple or parent in the subfamily. (All children shown as members of related subfamilies are own children of the person(s) maintaining the subfamily.) "Related" children in a family include own children and all other children in the household who are related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption. For each type of family unit identified in the CPS, the count of own children under 18 years old is limited to nevermarried children; however, "own children under 25" and "own children of any age," as the terms are used here, include all children regardless of marital status. The totals include never-married children living away from home in college dormitories.

The count of related children in families was formerly restricted to never-married children. However, beginning with data for 1968 the Bureau of the Census includes ever-married children under the category of related children. This change added approximately 20,000 children to the category of related children in March 1968.

Tenure. A housing unit (including a cooperative or condominium unit) is "owned" if the owner or co-owner lives in the unit, even if it is mortgaged or not fully paid

for. All other occupied units are classified as "rented," including units rented for cash rent and those occupied without payment of cash rent.

Years of school completed. Education of parent, as shown in this report, refers to the years of school completed by the parent (the reference person when both parents are present). Data on years of school completed were derived from the combination of answers to two questions, (a) "What is the highest grade of school that the person has attended?" and (b) "Did the person finish this grade?"

Labor force and employment status. The definitions of labor force and employment status in this report are related to the civilian population 15 years and over. Persons shown here are classified as in the labor force if they were employed as civilians during the survey week.

Employed. Employed persons comprise (1) all civilians who, during the specified week, did any work at all as paid employees or in their own business or profession, or on their own farm, or who worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers on a farm or in a business operated by a member of the family, and (2) all those who were not working but who had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent because of illness, bad weather, vacation, or labor management dispute, or because they were taking time off for personal reasons, whether or not they were paid by their employers for time off, and whether or not they were seeking other jobs. Excluded from the employed group are persons whose only activity consisted of work around the house (own home housework, painting or repairing own home, etc.) or volunteer work for religious, charitable, and similar organizations.

Unemployed. Unemployed persons are those civilians who, during the survey week, had no employment but were available for work and (1) had engaged in any specific job-seeking activity within the past 4 weeks, such as registering at a public or private employment office, meeting with prospective employers, checking with friends or relatives, placing or answering advertisements, writing letters of application, or being on a union or professional register; (2) were waiting to be called back to a job from which they had been laid off; or (3) were waiting to report to a new wage or salary job within 30 days.

Not in the labor force. All civilians who are not classified as employed or unemployed are defined as "not in the labor force." This group who are neither employed

nor seeking work includes persons engaged only in own home housework, attending school, or unable to work because of long-term physical or mental illness; persons who are retired or too old to work, seasonal workers for whom the survey week fell in an off season, and the voluntary idle. Persons doing only unpaid family work (less than 15 hours) are also classified as not in the labor force.

Income. Data on income cover money income only, prior to deduction for taxes, received from such sources as wages or salaries, net income from self-employment, Social Security, dividends, interest, public assistance and welfare, unemployment compensation, government pensions, and veterans payments. Certain money receipts such as capital gains are not included.

In table 6, number of children by family income refers to the income of the family (including related subfamily members, if any) or of the unrelated subfamily of which the child is a member. For a more detailed explanation of income, see Bureau of the Census, Current Population Reports, Series P-60.

Poverty. The poverty definition used here is that adopted for official Government use by the Office of Management and Budget and consists of a set of money income thresholds that vary by family size and composition. Families or individuals with income below a particular threshold are classified as below the poverty level. The poverty thresholds are updated every year to reflect changes in the Consumer Price Index. These thresholds are based on money income only and do not include the value of noncash benefits such as employer-provided health insurance, food stamps, or Medicaid. For a more detailed explanation, see Bureau of the Census, Current Population Reports, Series P-60.

Undocumented Immigrants. The 1980 census counted about 2 million undocumented immigrants according to Census Bureau estimates. Beginning in January 1986, the independent population controls included an allowance for growth in the undocumented population for every year since 1980. This methodological change was partially offset by another change that increased the allowance for emigration of legal residents. Data shown for Current Population Surveys with controls based on pre-1986 methods have not been revised to take into account these methodological changes. Consequently, direct comparisons of CPS figures for months before January 1986 with later months will not be consistent. Series P-25, No. 985 reviews the postcensal population estimates methodology currently in use.

Appendix B. Source and Accuracy of the Data

SOURCE OF DATA

Most estimates in this report come from data obtained in March of years 1960 through 1991 in the Current Population Survey (CPS). The Bureau of the Census conducts the survey every month, although this report uses only March data for its estimates. Also, some estimates come from 1960, 1970, and 1980 decennial census data. The March survey uses two sets of questions, the basic CPS and the supplements.

Basic CPS. The basic CPS collects primarily labor force data about the civilian noninstitutional population. Interviewers ask questions concerning labor force participation about each member 15 years old and over in every sample household.

The present CPS sample was selected from the 1980 Decennial Census files with coverage in all 50 States and the District of Columbia. The sample is continually updated to account for new residential construction. It is located in 729 areas and includes 1,973 counties, independent cities, and minor civil divisions. About 60,000 occupied housing units are eligible for interview every month. Interviewers are unable to obtain interviews at about 2,600 of these units. The occupants of these units are not found at home after repeated calls or are unavailable for some other reason.

Since the introduction of the CPS, the Bureau of the Census has redesigned the CPS sample several times. These redesigns have improved the quality and reliability of the data and have satisfied changing data needs. The most recent changes were completely implemented in July 1985.

The following table summarizes changes in the CPS designs for the years for which data appear in this report.

March Supplement. In addition to the basic CPS questions, interviewers asked supplementary questions in March about marital status and living arrangements.

To obtain more reliable data for the Hispanic origin population, the March CPS sample was increased by about 2,500 eligible housing units. These housing units were interviewed the previous November and contained at least one sample person of Hispanic origin. In addition, the sample included persons in the Armed Forces living off post or with their families on post.

Estimation Procedure. This survey's estimation procedure inflates weighted sample results to independent estimates of the civilian noninstitutional population of the United States by age, sex, race and Hispanic/non-Hispanic categories. The independent estimates were based on statistics from decennial censuses of population; statistics on births, deaths, immigration, and emigration; and statistics on the size of the Armed Forces. The independent population estimates used for 1981 to present were based on updates to controls established by the 1980 Decennial Census. Data before 1981 were based on independent population estimates from the most recent decennial census. For more details on the change in independent estimates, see the section entitled "Introduction of 1980 Census Population Controls" in an earlier report (Series P-60, No. 133). The estimation procedure for the March supplement included a further adjustment so husband and wife of a household received the same weight.

The estimates in this report for 1985 and later also employ a revised survey weighting procedure for persons of Hispanic origin. In previous years, weighted sample results were inflated to independent estimates of the noninstitutional population by age, sex, and race. There was no specific control of the survey estimates for the Hispanic population. Since then, the Bureau of the Census developed independent population controls

for the Hispanic population by sex and detailed age groups. Revised weighting procedures incorporate these new controls. The independent population estimates include some, but not all, undocumented immigrants.

ACCURACY OF ESTIMATES

Since the CPS estimates come from a sample, they may differ from figures from a complete census using the same questionnaires, instructions, and enumerators. A sample survey estimate has two possible types of error; sampling and nonsampling. The accuracy of an estimate depends on both types of error, but the full extent of the nonsampling error is unknown. Consequently, one should be particularly careful when interpreting results based on a relatively small number of cases or on small differences between estimates. The standard errors for CPS estimates primarily indicate the magnitude of sampling error. They also partially measure the effect of some nonsampling errors in responses and enumeration, but do not measure systematic biases in the data. (Bias is the average, over all possible samples, of the differences between the sample estimates and the desired value.)

Nonsampling Variability. Several sources of nonsampling error include the following:

- · inability to get information about all sample cases.
- · definitional difficulties.
- · differences in interpretation of questions.
- respondents' inability or unwillingness to provide correct information.
- · respondents' inability to recall information.
- errors made in data collection, such as recording and coding data.
- · errors made in processing the data.
- · errors made in estimating values for missing data.
- failure to represent all units with the sample (under coverage).

CPS undercoverage results from missed housing units and missed persons within sample households. Compared to the level of the 1980 Decennial Census, overall CPS undercoverage is about 7 percent. CPS undercoverage varies with age, sex, and race. Generally, undercoverage is larger for males than for females and larger for Blacks and other races combined than for Whites. As described previously, ratio estimation to independent age-sex-race-Hispanic population controls partially corrects for the bias due to undercoverage. However, biases exist in the estimates to the extent that

missed persons in missed households or missed persons in interviewed households have different characteristics from those of interviewed persons in the same age-sex-race-Hispanic group. Furthermore, the independent population controls have not been adjusted for undercoverage in the 1980 census.

For additional information on nonsampling error including the possible impact on CPS data when known, refer to Statistical Policy Working Paper 3, *An Error Profile: Employment as Measured by the Current Population Survey,* Office of Federal Statistical Policy and Standards, U.S. Department of Commerce, 1978 and Technical Paper 40, *The Current Population Survey: Design and Methodology,* Bureau of the Census, U.S. Department of Commerce.

Comparability of Data. Data obtained from the CPS and other sources are not entirely comparable. This results from differences in interviewer training and experience and in differing survey processes. This is an example of nonsampling variability not reflected in the standard errors. Use caution when comparing results from different sources.

Caution should also be used when comparing estimates in this report, which reflect 1980 census-based population controls, with estimates for 1980 and earlier years, which reflect 1970 census-based population controls. This change in population controls had relatively little impact on summary measures such as means, medians, and percent distributions. It did have a significant impact on levels. For example, use of 1980-based population controls results in about a 2-percent increase in the civilian noninstitutional population and in the number of families and households. Thus, estimates of levels for data collected in 1981 and later years will differ from those for earlier years by more than what could be attributed to actual changes in the population. These differences could be disproportionately greater for certain subpopulation groups than for the total population.

Since no independent population control totals for persons of Hispanic origin were used before 1985, compare Hispanic estimates over time cautiously.

Note When Using Small Estimates. Summary measures (such as medians and percentage distributions) are shown only when the base is 75,000 or greater. Because of the large standard errors involved, summary measures would probably not reveal useful information when computed on a smaller base. However, estimated numbers are shown even though the relative standard errors of these numbers are larger than those for corresponding percentages. These smaller estimates permit combinations of the categories to suit data users'

needs. Take care in the interpretation of small differences. For instance, even a small amount of nonsampling error can cause a borderline difference to appear significant or not, thus distorting a seemingly valid hypothesis test.

Sampling Variability. Sampling variability is variation that occurred by chance because a sample was surveyed rather than the entire population. Standard errors, as calculated by methods described next are primarily measures of sampling variability, although they may include some nonsampling error.

Standard Errors and Their Use. A number of approximations are required to derive, at a moderate cost, standard errors applicable to all the estimates in this report. Instead of providing an individual standard error for each estimate, generalized sets of standard errors are provided for various types of characteristics. Thus, the tables show levels of magnitude of standard errors rather than the precise standard errors.

The sample estimate and its standard error enable one to construct a confidence interval. A confidence interval is a range that would include the average result of all possible samples with a known probability. For example, if all possible samples were surveyed under essentially the same general conditions and using the same sample design, and if an estimate and its standard error were calculated from each sample, then approximately 90 percent of the intervals from 1.645 standard errors below the estimate to 1.645 standard errors above the estimate would include the average result of all possible samples.

A particular confidence interval may or may not contain the average estimate derived from all possible samples. However, one can say with specified confidence that the interval includes the average estimate calculated from all possible samples.

Some statements in the report may contain estimates followed by a number in parentheses. This number can be added to and subtracted from the estimate to calculate upper and lower bounds of the 90-percent confidence interval. For example, if a statement contains the phrase "grew by 1.7 percent (± 1.0) ," the

90-percent confidence interval for the estimate, 1.7 percent, is 0.7 percent to 2.7 percent.

Standard errors may be used to perform hypothesis testing. This is a procedure for distinguishing between population parameters using sample estimates. The most common type of hypothesis appearing in this report is that the population parameters are different. An example of this would be comparing the number of Black children living with grandparents to the number of White children living with grandparents.

Tests may be performed at various levels of significance. A significance level is the probability of concluding that the characteristics are different when, in fact, they are the same. All statements of comparison in the text have passed a hypothesis test at the 0.10 level of significance or better. This means that the absolute value of the estimated difference between characteristics is greater than or equal to 1.645 times the standard error of the difference.

Standard Errors of Estimated Numbers. There are two ways to compute the approximate standard error, s_x , of an estimated number shown in this report. The first uses the formula

where f is a factor from table B-6, and s is the standard error of the estimate obtained by interpolation from tables B-1 through B-3. The second method uses formula (2), from which the standard errors in tables B-1 through B-3 were calculated. This formula will provide more accurate results than formula (1).

Here x is the size of the estimate and a and b are the parameters in table B-6 associated with the particular type of characteristic. When calculating standard errors for numbers from cross-tabulations involving different characteristics, use the factor or set of parameters for the characteristic which will give the largest standard error.

Illustration. Suppose there were 46,503,000 children under 18 years old living with two parents in 1990. Use

90% confidence interval	45,880,600 to 47,125,400

The standard error is calculated as

$$s = \sqrt{-0.000020x46,503,000^2 + 4,185x46,503,000} = 389,000$$

The 90-percent confidence interval is calculated as $46,503,000 \pm 1.645 \times 389,000$.

A conclusion that the average estimate derived from all possible samples lies within a range computed in this way would be correct for roughly 90 percent of all possible samples.

The alternate calculation of the standard error, using formula (1) with f=1.0 and s=386,000 by interpolution is

$$s_x = 1.0x386,000 = 386,000$$

Standard Errors of Estimated Percentages. The reliability of an estimated percentage, computed using sample data for both numerator and denominator, depends on the size of the percentage and its base. Estimated percentages are relatively more reliable than the corresponding estimates of the numerators of the percentages, particularly if the percentages are 50 percent or

more. When the numerator and denominator of the percentage are in different categories, use the factor or parameter from table B-6 indicated by the numerator.

The approximate standard error, $s_{x,p}$, of an estimated percentage can be obtained by use of the formula

In this formula, f is the appropriate factor from table B-6, and s is the standard error of the estimate obtained by interpolation from table B-4 or B-5.

 Alternatively, formula (4) will provide more accurate results:

Here x is the total number of persons, families, households, or unrelated individuals in the base of the percentage, p is the percentage (0 \leq p \leq 100), and b is the parameter in table B-6 associated with the characteristic in the numerator of the percentage.

Illustration. Suppose that of the 2,856,000 unmarriedcouple households, 1,189,000 or 41.6 percent, are 25 to 34 years old. Use the appropriate parameter from table B-6 and formula (4) to get

The standard error is calculated as

The 90-percent confidence interval for the percentage of unmarried-couple households who are 25 to 34 years old is calculated as $41.6 \pm 1.645 \times 1.2$.

The alternate calculation of the standard error, using formula (3), with f=0.6 and s=1.9 by interpolation is

$$s_{x,p} = 0.6x1.9 = 1.1$$

Standard Error of a Difference. The standard error of the difference between two sample estimates is approximately equal to

$$s_{x-y} = \sqrt{s_x^2 + s_y^2}$$
 (5)

where s_x and s_y are the standard errors of the estimates, x and y. The estimates can be numbers, percentages, ratios, etc. This will represent the actual standard error quite accurately for the difference between estimates of the same characteristic in two different areas, or for the

difference between separate and uncorrelated characteristics in the same area. However, if there is a high positive (negative) correlation between the two characteristics, the formula will overestimate (underestimate) the true standard error.

Illustration. Suppose there were 3,155,000 children living with grandparents in 1990 and in 1980 there were 2,306,000. Use the appropriate parameters and formulas (2) and (5) to get

The standard error of the difference is calculated as

$$s_{x-y} = \sqrt{122,000^2 + 103,000^2} = 160,000$$

The 90-percent confidence interval around the difference is calculated as $849,000\pm1.645x160,000$. Since this interval doesn't contain zero, we can conclude, at the 90-percent significance level, that the number of children living with grandparents in 1990 is greater than in 1980.

Standard Error of a Mean for Grouped Data. The formula used to estimate the standard error of a mean for grouped data is

$$s_x^- = \sqrt{(b/y)S^2} \tag{6}$$

In this formula, y is the size of the base of the distribution and b is a parameter from table B-6. The variance, S², is given by the following formula:

where \bar{x} , the mean of the distribution, is estimated by

c is the number of groups; i indicates a specific group, thus taking on values 1 through c.

p_i is the estimated proportion of households, families or persons whose values, for the characteristic (x-values) being considered, fall in group i.

 \bar{x}_i is $(Z_{i-1} + Z_i)/2$ where Z_{i-1} and Z_i are the lower and upper interval boundaries, respectively, for group i.

 \overline{x}_i is assumed to be the most representative value for the characteristic for households, families, and unrelated individuals or persons in group i. Group c is open-ended, i.e., no upper interval boundary exists. For this group the approximate average value is

Standard Error of a Ratio. Certain estimates may be calculated as the ratio of two numbers. The standard error of a ratio, x/y, maybe computed using

$$S_{x/y} = \frac{x}{y} \sqrt{\left[\frac{s_x}{x}\right]^2 + \left[\frac{s_y}{y}\right]^2 - 2r \frac{s_x s_y}{xy}}$$
 (10)

The standard error of the numerator, s_x , and that of the denominator, s_y , may be calculated using formulas described earlier. In formula (10), r represents the correlation between the numerator and the denominator of the estimate.

For one type of ratio, the denominator is a count of families or households and the numerator is a count of persons in those families or households with a certain characteristic. If there is at least one person with the characteristic in every family or household, use 0.7 as an estimate of r. An example of this type is the mean number of children per family with children.

For all other types of ratios, r is assumed to be zero. If r is actually positive (negative), then this procedure will provide an overestimate (underestimate) of the standard error of the ratio. Examples of this type are the mean number of children per family and the poverty rate.

NOTE: For estimates expressed as the ratio of x per 100 y or x per 1,000 y, multiply formula (10) by 100 or 1,000, respectively, to obtain the standard error.

Illustration. Suppose the ratio of men aged 65 to 74, living alone, x, to women aged 65 to 74, living alone, y, is 31 per 100. Use the appropriate parameters from table B-6. The standard error of this ratio is calculated as follows:

The 90-percent confidence interval is calculated as 31 \pm 1.645x2.3.

Standard Error of a Median. The sampling variability of an estimated median depends on the form of the distribution and the size of the base. One can approximate the reliability of an estimated median by determining a confidence interval about it. (See the section on standard errors and their use for a general discussion of confidence intervals.)

Estimate the 68-percent confidence limits of a median based on sample data using the following procedure.

- Determine, using formula (4), the standard error of the estimate of 50 percent from the distribution.
- Add to and subtract from 50 percent the standard error determined in step 1.
- Using the distribution of the characteristic, determine upper and lower limits of the 68-percent confidence interval by calculating values corresponding to the two points established in step 2.

Use the following formula to calculate the upper and lower limits.

$$X_{pN} = \frac{pN - N_1}{N_2 - N_1} (A_2 - A_1) + A_1$$

where

 X_{pN}

- = estimated upper and lower bounds for the confidence interval (0 \leq p \leq 1). For purposes of calculating the confidence interval, p takes on the values determined in step 2. Note that X_{pN} estimates the median when p = 0.50.
- N = for distribution of numbers: the total number of units (persons, households, etc.) for the characteristic in the distribution.
 - = for distribution of percentages: the value 1.0.

p = the values obtained in step 2.

A₁, A₂ = the lower and upper bounds, respectively, of the interval containing X_{pN}.

N₁, N₂ = for distribution of numbers: the estimated number of units (persons, households, etc.) with values of the characteristic greater than or equal to A₁ and A₂, respectively.

- =for distribution of percentages: the estimated percentage of units (persons, households, etc.) having values of the characteristic greater than or equal to A₁ and A₂, respectively.
- Divide the difference between the two points determined in step 3 by two to obtain the standard error of the median.

Illustration. A recent report by the Bureau of the Census¹ shows the following distribution and median income for families in 1989.

- Using formula (4), with b = 2,058, the standard error of 50 percent on a base of 66,090,000 is about 0.3 percent.
- To obtain a 68-percent confidence interval on an estimated median, add to and subtract from 50 percent the standard error found in step (1). This yields percentage limits of 49.7 and 50.3.
- The lower and upper limits for the interval in which the median falls are \$30,000 and \$35,000, respectively. Then, by addition, the estimated numbers of families with an income greater than or equal to \$30,000 and \$35,000 are 37,597,000 and 32,303,000, respectively.

Using formula (11), the upper limit for the confidence interval of the median is found to be about

$$\frac{0.497 \times 66,090,000 - 37,597,000}{32,303,000 - 37,597,000} \times (35,000 - 30,000) + 30,000 = 34,500$$

Similarly, the lower limit is found to be about

$$\frac{0.503 \times 66,090,000 - 37,597,000}{32,303,000 - 37,597,000} \times (35,000 - 30,000) + 30,000 = 34,100$$

Thus, a 68-percent confidence interval for the median income for families is from \$34,100 to \$34,500.

4. The standard error of the median is, therefore,

$$\frac{34,500-34,100}{2} = 200$$
