





Introduction

PURPOSE AND SCOPE

This is the forty-fourth publication in a series of quarterly reports that measures changes in U.S. imports, exports, and employment. These data are presented in terms of a commodity classification based on the *1987 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual*. All publications issued before 1990 were on a 1972/77 SIC basis.

The classification of commodities based on the SIC represents an organization of commodities into a structure related to origin of production. This arrangement facilitates the comparison of imports and exports with domestic employment, which is also reported based on the SIC. (See appendix C for more information.)

The 1987 edition of the SIC manual represents a major revision from the 1972 edition and its 1977 supplement. Appendix A of the 1987 manual notes the revisions in the four-digit industry levels between 1972/77 and 1987. The import and export data on a 1987 SIC basis were derived from a concordance between the 1987 Tariff Schedule of the United States Annotated (TSUSA) schedule and the 1989 ten-digit Harmonized System (HS) TSUSA schedule. A similar concordance was used for exports. The 1987 calendar year TSUSA and Schedule B were previously related to the 1987 SIC. These files along with the concordances described above were used to convert the HS schedules to a 1987 SIC basis. There are cases where data released since *Trade and Employment 1st Quarter 1990* (TM-1-90) differ from the same commodities shown in this publication. This is due to the following reasons:

- The conversion scheme used caused some inconsistencies in relating the HS system to the SIC-based codes. The HS system has more detail than both the TSUSA and Schedule B systems, thus creating differences in the data distribution;
- revision of the SIC system moved parts of some 1977 commodities into existing SIC codes;
- revisions made for the 1987 SIC.

The Trade Act of 1974, Section 282, provides that the Secretary of Commerce and the Secretary of Labor shall establish and maintain a trade monitoring system, which will reflect (a) changes in the volume of imports into the United States; (b) the relationship of such imports to changes in domestic production; (c) changes in employment within domestic industries producing articles like or

directly competitive with such imports; and (d) the extent to which such changes in domestic production and employment are adversely affected because of changing international trade patterns.

Trade and Employment is a joint effort of the Bureau of Labor Statistics and the Bureau of the Census. The Bureau of the Census produces the publication by combining the employment data provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) with the import and export data produced at the Bureau of the Census. The employment data reflect revised benchmark figures.

A detailed comparison of U.S. exports and imports to domestic production is available in *U.S. Commodity Exports and Imports as Related to Output*, published by the Bureau of the Census at the four-digit and five-digit levels. The latest available issue is for 1993 and 1992. A further detailed comparison of exports and imports to domestic production at the seven-digit level is shown in the Current Industrial Reports, published by the Bureau of the Census. These reports are published monthly, quarterly, and annually.

TABLES

Table 1 shows the value of imports for consumption for the previous two calendar years; value of imports for consumption for the current quarter and year-ago quarter; changes in value between the current and year-ago quarter; and changes in percent between the current and year-ago quarter for two-digit and four-digit SIC-based commodity groups.

Table 2 ranks by percent the value of imports for consumption for four-digit commodity groups with an increase of 25 percent or more and \$5 million or more in value from the year-ago quarter, based on commodity groups shown in table 1.

Table 3 ranks by percent the value of imports for consumption for four-digit commodity groups with less than a 25 percent increase and \$20 million or more in value from the year-ago quarter, based on commodity groups shown in table 1.

Table 4 shows, in SIC order, the value of imports for consumption for four-digit commodity groups with an increase of 25 percent or more and at least \$5 million or more in value from the year-ago quarter, or an increase of less than 25 percent and \$20 million or more in value from the year-ago quarter. This is a combination of tables 2 and 3.

Table 5 shows, in SIC order, the value of domestic exports for the previous two calendar years; value of domestic exports for the current quarter and year-ago quarter; changes in value between the current and year-ago quarter; and changes in percent between the current and year-ago quarter for two-digit and four-digit SIC-based commodity groups.

Table 6 ranks by percent the value of domestic exports for four-digit commodity groups with an increase of 25 percent or more and \$5 million or more in value from the year-ago quarter, based on commodity groups shown in table 5.

Table 7 ranks by percent the value of domestic exports for four-digit commodity groups with less than a 25 percent increase and \$20 million or more in value from the year-ago quarter, based on commodity groups shown in table 5.

Table 8 shows, in SIC order, the value of domestic exports with an increase of 25 percent or more and at least \$5 million or more in value from the year-ago quarter, or an increase of less than 25 percent and \$20 million or more in value from the year-ago quarter. This is a combination of tables 6 and 7.

Table 9 shows a comparison of imports for consumption to domestic exports by four-digit SIC-based commodity groups for the previous year and current quarter. Additionally, the difference between imports and exports (imports minus exports) and the resulting difference as a percent of imports for each four-digit SIC based commodity group is presented. Only those SIC import and export commodity groups which are totally comparable are shown in this table.

Table 10 shows the number of employees for nonagricultural establishments by industry division and mining and manufacturing industries for the current year, prior year, present quarter, year-ago quarter, changes in employment between the current and year-ago quarter, changes in percent between the current and year-ago quarter. The employment totals for the first quarter publication reflect revised figures from the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS).

Table 11 shows, in SIC order, employment change in domestic mining and manufacturing industries based on import commodity groups with an increase of 25 percent or more and at least \$5 million or more in value from the year-ago quarter or an increase of less than 25 percent and \$20 million or more in value from the year-ago quarter.

FIGURES

Figure 1 shows the top 20 four-digit agricultural, mining, and/or manufacturing Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) import commodity groups with the highest average percent change over a three-quarter period. The three-quarter period covered includes third quarters 1993, 1994, and 1995. Only those import commodity groups valued at \$50 million or more in the most recent quarter with an average percent change greater than 20 percent were considered.

During this period, there were 98 import commodity groups that met these criteria. Ten (or 10 percent) of these import groups showed an average percent increase of at least 50 percent. Forty-eight (or 48 percent) of these import groups showed an average increase between 25 and 50 percent. Forty groups (or 40 percent) showed an average increase of less than 25 percent.

Figure 2 shows the average percent changes over the same three-quarter period for selected export commodity groups based on the import commodity groups in figure 1. There were 114 export commodity groups that met the criteria. Twenty-four (or 21 percent) of these export groups showed an average *increase* greater than 25 percent.

Figure 3 shows a comparison of comparable import and export SIC commodity groups based on the top 20 SIC import commodity groups with the highest quarter values. In only two of these cases did the export value exceed the import value; industries 3714; 3592, motor vehicle parts and accessories and 2869 pt., industrial organic chemicals, n.e.c.


Figure 4 shows the average percent changes in employment over the same three-quarter period, for selected industries based on the import commodity groups in figure 1 and where the BLS employment data are available.

Commodity Groups and SIC Codes




Average Percent Change in Exports for Selected Industries Based on Top 20 SIC Import Commodity Groups: Third Quarter 1993, 1994, and 1995

Note: The average percent change in exports showed no negative values for this quarter.



Appendix A.

Comparison of Domestic Output, Import, and Export Classifications

Adjustments are made in trade and domestic data used in this report because U.S. imports, exports, and employment are reported on different classification bases. Output classifications are based upon an industry system which reflects input and organizational characteristics of producers as well as the commodity outputs. The import statistical structure is determined by the legal distinction and classification of U.S. tariff law. The export statistical structure is determined by the *Schedule B, The Statistical Classification of Domestic and Foreign Commodities Exported from the United States*.

Prior to January 1989, U.S. imports were reported on the basis of over 10,000 tariff commodity classification codes designed for the collection of duties and U.S. exports were reported on the basis of approximately 5,000 commodity classification codes for statistical purposes. With the adoption of the harmonized commodity classification system (explained in more detail in appendix B) for both imports and exports effective January 1989, there are approximately 8,000 export codes and 14, 000 import codes.

For the purposes of relating imports and exports to domestic output and employment, imports and exports are regrouped based on five-digit SIC-based product classes.

Data for this report are derived by assigning each individual import and export commodity code the SIC-related class judged to contain the same commodities falling in such commodity codes. Many of the import and export codes can then be assigned to a single five-digit output class or combined group of classes. When the foreign trade commodity classifications are not precisely comparable to the output classes, they are assigned to output classes judged to contain the commodities accounting for the largest proportion of the value of such import and export commodity classifications. Consequently, the import and export items to each output class may not be exactly the same commodities as the output class. However, the total value assigned to each such output class is assumed to approximate the total actual value.

By arranging and aggregating import and export data on an SIC basis, the import and export of commodities can be related to output of comparable commodities produced in the domestic economy. This comparability is improved to some extent by attempts to introduce categories of importance in one system into the detail of the others.

Appendix B.

Commodity Classification and Data Sources

Commodity classifications used for domestic output and employment are based on the industries in which the commodities are primarily covered under the *Standard Industrial Classification Manual*, (SIC) 1987 edition. The 1987 edition of the SIC, has a total of 20 major groups at the two-digit level and 459 four-digit SIC-based manufacturing output codes. Prior to January 1989 import data were reported in terms of commodity classifications in the *Tariff Schedules of the United States Annotated* (TSUSA), which is an official publication of the U.S. International Trade Commission (USITC). Effective January 1989, import data are initially reported in terms of commodity classifications in the *Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States Annotated* (HTSUSA) which is based on the *Harmonized Commodity System*.

The *Harmonized Commodity System* is a six-digit international classification system which the United States and almost all of their major trading partners negotiated and agreed upon. The HTSUSA is a ten-digit commodity classification system where the first six-digits represent the international codes, digits seven and eight represent the U.S. legal subdivisions, and digits nine and ten are statistical subdivisions. The SIC-based import product groupings relate imported commodities classified under TSUSA prior to January 1989 and HTSUSA effective this date to products which are like or similar to those in groupings organized within the domestic SIC-based classification used for the measurement of domestic output and other economic activities.

The import data used in the calculation of imports measures the value of imports at the first port of entry into the United States. The c.i.f. (cost, insurance, and freight) value is based on the purchase price and includes all freight, insurance, and other charges (excluding U.S. import duties) incurred in bringing the merchandise from the country of exportation and generally placing it alongside the carrier at the first port of entry in the United States. If the merchandise was acquired in a transaction between related parties, the purchase price used in deriving the c.i.f. value is based on an arm's-length equivalent transaction price, i.e., a price which would exist between unrelated buyers and sellers. Import charges represent the aggregated cost of all freight, insurance, and other charges, but not including U.S. import duties, incurred in bringing the merchandise from alongside the carrier at the first port of

entry in the United States. In the case of overland shipments originating in Canada or Mexico, such costs, if any, are not required to be reported.

Prior to January 1989, the export data were collected in accordance with the commodity classifications in *Schedule B, Statistical Classification of Domestic and Foreign Commodities Exported from the United States*. Effective January 1989, export data is initially reported in terms of the Harmonized Schedule B commodity classification system. Both of these export classification systems were based on the respective organizational framework of the import classification system in use prior to and beginning January 1989. Exports of domestic merchandise include commodities that are grown, produced, or manufactured in the United States, and commodities of foreign origin that have been changed in the United States from the form in which they were imported, or have been enhanced in value by further manufacture in the United States. Also, when materials or parts of foreign origin are imported into the United States and incorporated with materials or parts produced in the United States, the complete product is considered to be a domestic product.

The value reported in the export statistics generally is equivalent to the f.a.s. (free alongside ship) value at the U.S. port of export, based on the transaction price, including inland freight, insurance, and other charges incurred in placing the merchandise alongside the carrier at the U.S. port of exportation. The value, as defined, excludes the cost of loading the merchandise aboard the exporting carrier and also excludes freight, insurance, and any other charges or transportation costs beyond the port of exportation.

The employment data are derived from the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) monthly establishment survey of employment, hours, and earnings. This data is also published in the monthly BLS publication *Employment and Earnings*.

The establishment data, collected on Form BLS 790, covers employment, payroll, and hours. Data include all full-and part-time employees who worked during, or received pay for, the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude proprietors, the self-employed, and unpaid volunteer or family workers and is not seasonally adjusted.

Appendix C. Comparability With Other Data

EMPLOYMENT DATA IN 1992 ECONOMIC CENSUSES

In comparing the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) employment data with data from the Economic Censuses, the data user should bear in mind that differences in establishment and employment data may be because of definitional and coverage differences that would affect the direct comparison of such data items. Definitional differences of data items between data sources may be discerned through review of the introductory text of the appropriate economic census volume being compared.

The BLS draws a sample for its Current Employment Statistics Survey and benchmarks its industry employment estimates annually to the administrative records of employment covered by State Unemployment Insurance Laws (ES-202), except for a few noncovered industries. Therefore, differences in employment estimates from BLS and the Census Bureau's Economic Censuses can be attributable to factors that differ between the Unemployment Insurance System and the Economic Censuses. The major factors are:

1. The Census Bureau uses a finer establishment breakdown in its Economic Censuses than BLS in its Current Employment Statistics Survey.

2. The Economic Censuses include small firms with no paid employees (i.e., the owners are the employees). These firms are excluded from the BLS program.
3. Differences in industrial classifications that arise because of differences between the concept of an establishment (one location) and of the reporting unit (one or more locations) that is to be classified.
4. Differences in timing and frequency of reports submitted by employers to Federal and State agencies and differences in methods of processing and adjusting data.
5. The Census Bureau separately tabulates central administrative offices and auxiliaries at the division level. BLS codes such auxiliary units to the four-digit industry level and does not break out employment for the auxiliary units from other employment in the industry.
6. The BLS data counts jobs, not workers. In addition, some BLS data is seasonally adjusted. The data used for this report is *not* seasonally adjusted.

Appendix D. Limitations and Analysis

Aside from the differences in commodity classifications used for imports, domestic exports, and domestic output, there are a substantial number of imported commodities which are not produced in the United States or are produced in very small quantities. (The merchandise exported from the United States is ordinarily produced in this country and reflects items important to output.) There are other problems affecting the comparability of the three sets of data. Differences in the method of valuation present the principal such problem. There are elements of duplication in the output data but not imports and exports; low valued transactions are excluded from the data for individual import and export commodity classifications; and a small portion of manufacturing output which is not allocated to detailed commodity lines has been distributed over constituent product classes. All these factors affect comparability to some degree. For these reasons the relationships shown in the tabulation should be considered only as approximations.

Valuation. Domestic producer shipments, or production, are sample estimates, subject to error, and are usually valued at the point of production. The c.i.f. value shown for imports is usually at the first port of entry into the United States. It is based on the purchase price and includes all freight, insurance, and other charges (excluding U.S. import duties) incurred in bringing the merchandise from the country of exportation and generally placing it alongside the carrier at the first port of entry in the United States. The reported export value is equivalent to the f.a.s. (free alongside ship) value at the U.S. port of export. It is based on the selling price, or cost if not sold, and includes inland freight, insurance, and other charges incurred in placing the merchandise alongside the carrier at the U.S. port of

exportation. It excludes the cost of loading the merchandise aboard the exporting carrier. It also excludes the freight, insurance, and any other cost beyond the port of exportation.

Duplication in Value of Output. Because producers' shipments of commodities may be used as material for incorporation into other commodities, combinations of five-digit product class data for such commodities may contain a certain amount of duplication.

Low Value Import Transactions. Commodity information is not shown generally for individual imports valued under \$1,251. The exception is for textile commodities where commodity information is not shown for individual imports valued under \$251. This is believed to have only a negligible affect on the statistics for the bulk of the commodities.

Low Value Export Transactions. Commodity information is not shown for individual exports valued under \$2,501. This is believed to have only a negligible affect on the statistics for the bulk of the commodities.

Lack of Detailed Import and Export Data. In some cases, comparable import and export data at the corresponding level of detail are not available for certain domestic SIC-based product classes. For those cases, it is likely that these classes of products are embodied or included in imports and exports at the four-digit level. Analysis of U.S. imports, exports, and related domestic employment focuses both on long-term and short-term changes. Merchandise imports and exports are monitored quarterly for significant increases in current-dollar value over the year-ago quarter and the prior 12 months, and industry employment is monitored quarterly to note significant changes over the same time periods.
