
Percent of U.S. Population Who Hunted by Household Income



Percent of Hunters Who Prepared by Target Shooting





Percent of Around-the-Home Observers by Type of Wildlife Observed








Percent of Wildlife Watchers by Age



Comparative Fishing by Type of Fishing






