


# 1940-2010: HOW HAS AMERICA CHANGED?


# Then Now


# **5 MOST POPULATED STATES**

# RACIAL AND ETHNIC DIVERSITY


As we've grown, we've also become more diverse.






#### **EDUCATION**

Improved access to education means far more people today are college graduates.




#### **EARNINGS**

# **TOP INDUSTRIES**


Our workforce and industries have changed dramatically over time.
