


Manufacturing Data From the Annual Survey of Manufactures



The U.S. Census Bureau collects data on the Annual Survey of Manufactures (ASM) to provide key intercensal measures of the nation's manufacturing activity on an annual basis. The ASM provides estimates of domestic production and productivity helping decision-makers create sound economic policies.

Manufacturing Establishments' Receipts and Employment Decreased From 2015 to 2016




Manufacturing Employment and Receipts by Subsector 2015 to 2016

¹The difference between the 2016 employment estimates, within each pair of subsectors, is not statistically significant at the 90 percent level for chemical manufacturing and plastics and rubber products manufacturing, wood product manufacturing and nonmetallic mineral product manufacturing and paper manufacturing and electrical equipment, appliance, and component manufacturing.

²The difference between the 2016 and 2015 employment estimates is not statistically significant at the 90 percent level for this subsector.

³The difference between the 2016 and 2015 receipts estimates is not statistically significant at the 90 percent level for this subsector.

⁴Total working-age population represents total state population aged 16 and older in 2016 according to the 2016 American Community Survey 1-Year Estimates.

Note: The statistics in this report are estimated from sample surveys and are subject to sampling variability and nonsampling error, including bias and variance from response, nonreporting, and undercoverage.
