Mark also serves as the chief of the Decennial Contracts and Execution Office (DCEO), where he leads pre-award contract activities and contract execution for major Census Bureau programs, including the 2030 Census, the Geographic Support Program, and the American Community Survey. Prior to this role, he served as a program manager in DCEO, overseeing the Field IT Deployment and the Decennial Device-as-a-Service Government Program Management Offices, ensuring that critical technology and infrastructure needs were met for decennial operations. Previously, Mark served as assistant division chief in both the Systems Support Division and the LAN Technology Support Office. Across these roles, he made notable contributions to enterprise IT service delivery and modernization efforts.
