


U.S. Future Job Outlook


- Health care and social assistance sector is projected to account for nearly one-third of the total increase in jobs, adding 5 million jobs between 2012 and 2022.
- 19 of the 30 occupations projected to grow fastest from 2012 to 2022 typically require some form of postsecondary education.
- Labor force participation rates are projected to decline.

Millions of persons




Labor Force Participation Rate is Projected to Decline



Two Industry Sectors are Projected to Account for More Than Half of All New Employment






Demographic Changes are Expected to Spur Fast Growth in Healthcare Occupations



5 of the 10 Fastest Growing Occupations are in Healthcare




Occupations Adding the Most Jobs Often Have Low Wages
