Jennifer H. Madans has been the Associate Director for Science at the National Center for Health Statistics since May 1996 and is responsible for the overall plan and development of the center's data collection and analysis programs.

Madans has concentrated her research efforts on data collection methodology, measurement of health and functioning, and health services research. She has directed two national longitudinal studies (National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey I Epidemiologic Follow-Up



Study and the National Nursing Home Follow-Up Study) as well as the redesign of the National Health Interview Survey questionnaire. She was also one of the designers of the Department of Health and Human Service's Survey Integration Plan. She is a founding member of two United Nations-sponsored initiatives to develop internationally comparable measures of disability and health, the Washington Group on Disability Statistics and the Budapest Initiative on the Measurement of Health Status, and has chaired the steering committees of both groups since their inception.

Madans has a bachelor's degree from Bard College and master's and doctorate degrees from the University of Michigan, and she completed a postdoctoral fellowship in the Department of Epidemiology and Public Health at Yale University. She has served as an adjunct associate professor in the Division of Biostatistics and Epidemiology's Department of Community and Family Medicine at Georgetown University School of Medicine and in the Department of Demography at Georgetown. She is a fellow of the American Statistical Association and an elected member of the International Statistical Institute, and she has served as a vice president of the International Association of Official Statistics.
