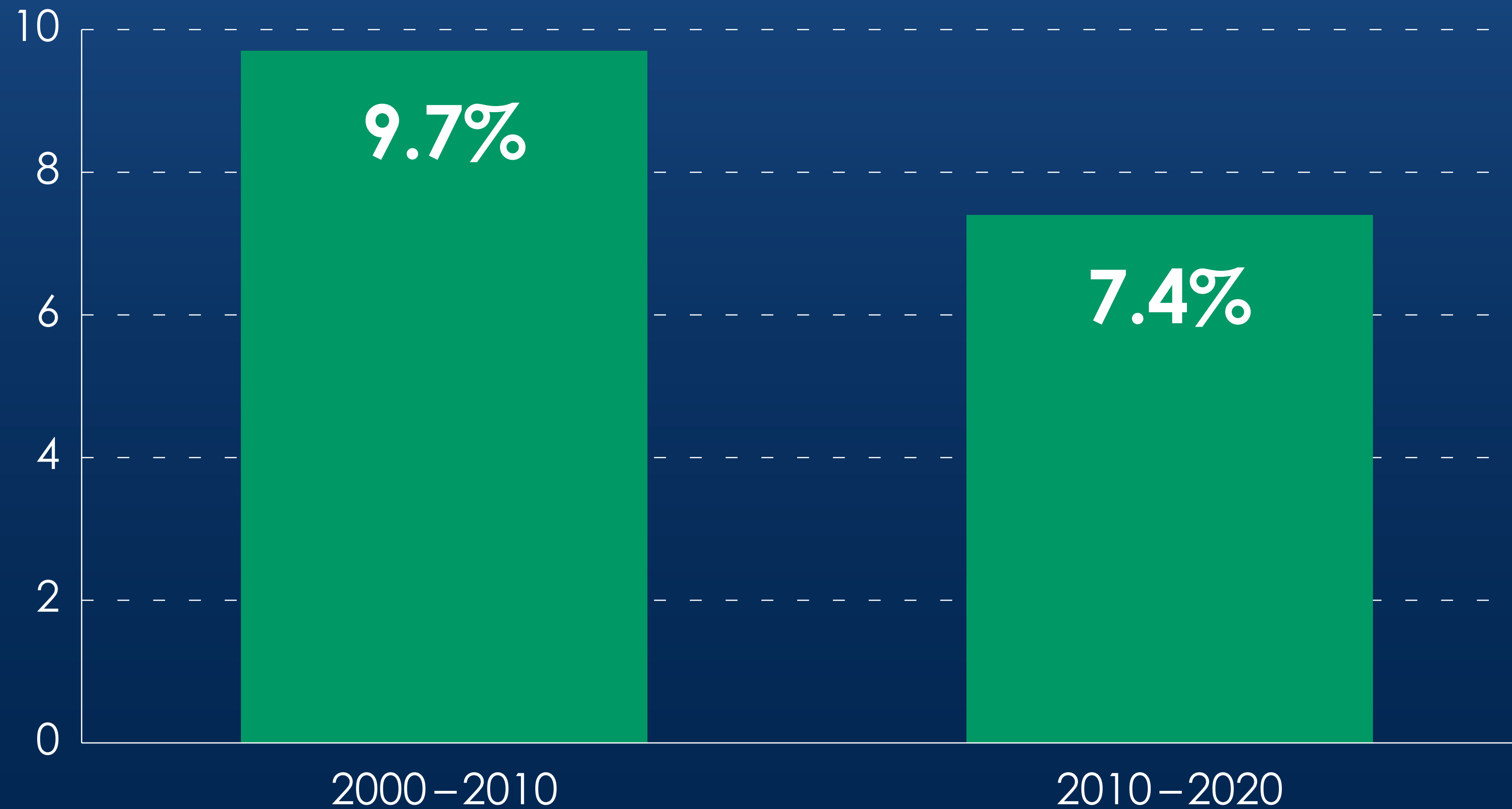

# Percent Change in U.S. Population: 2000–2020

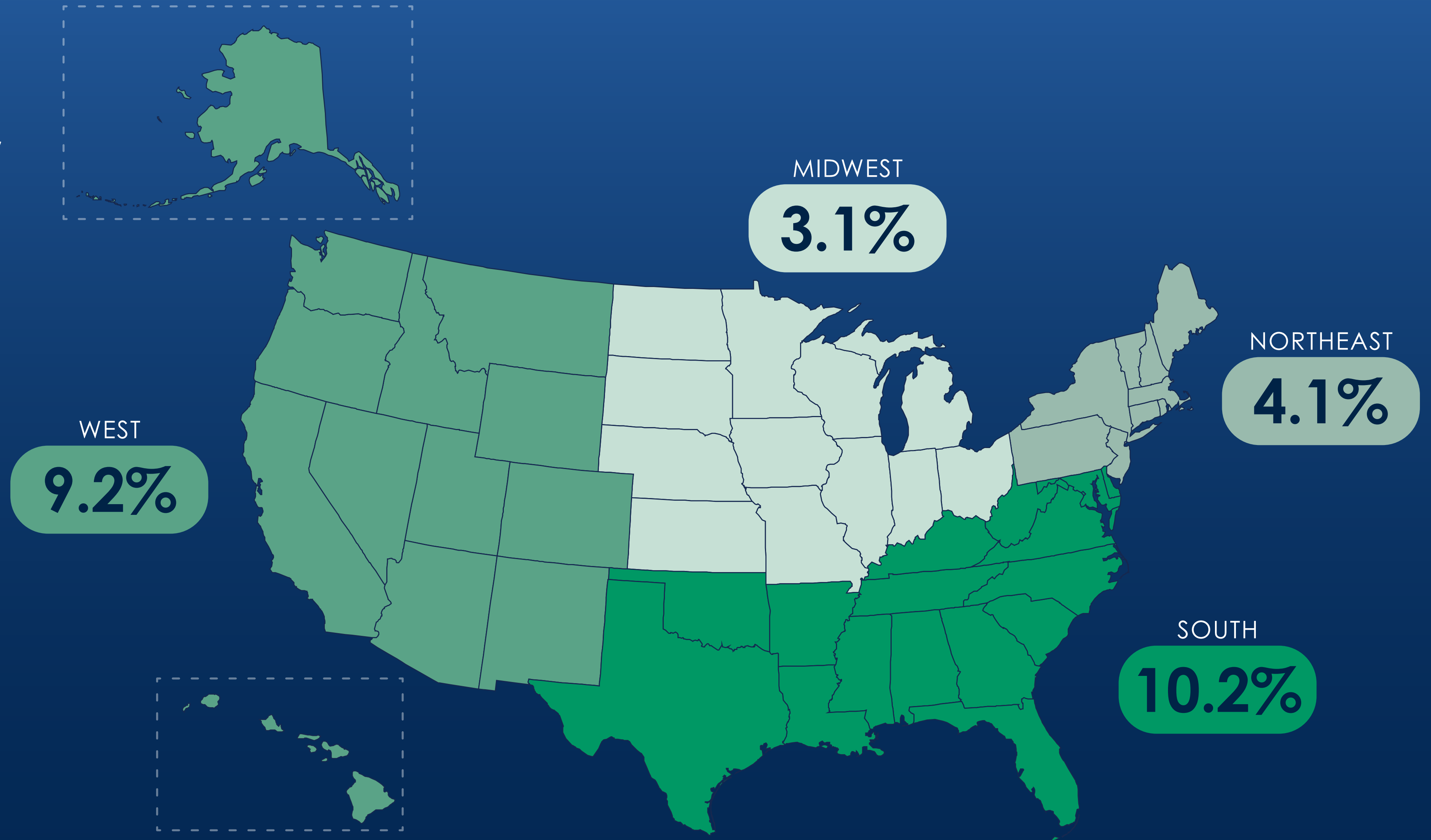

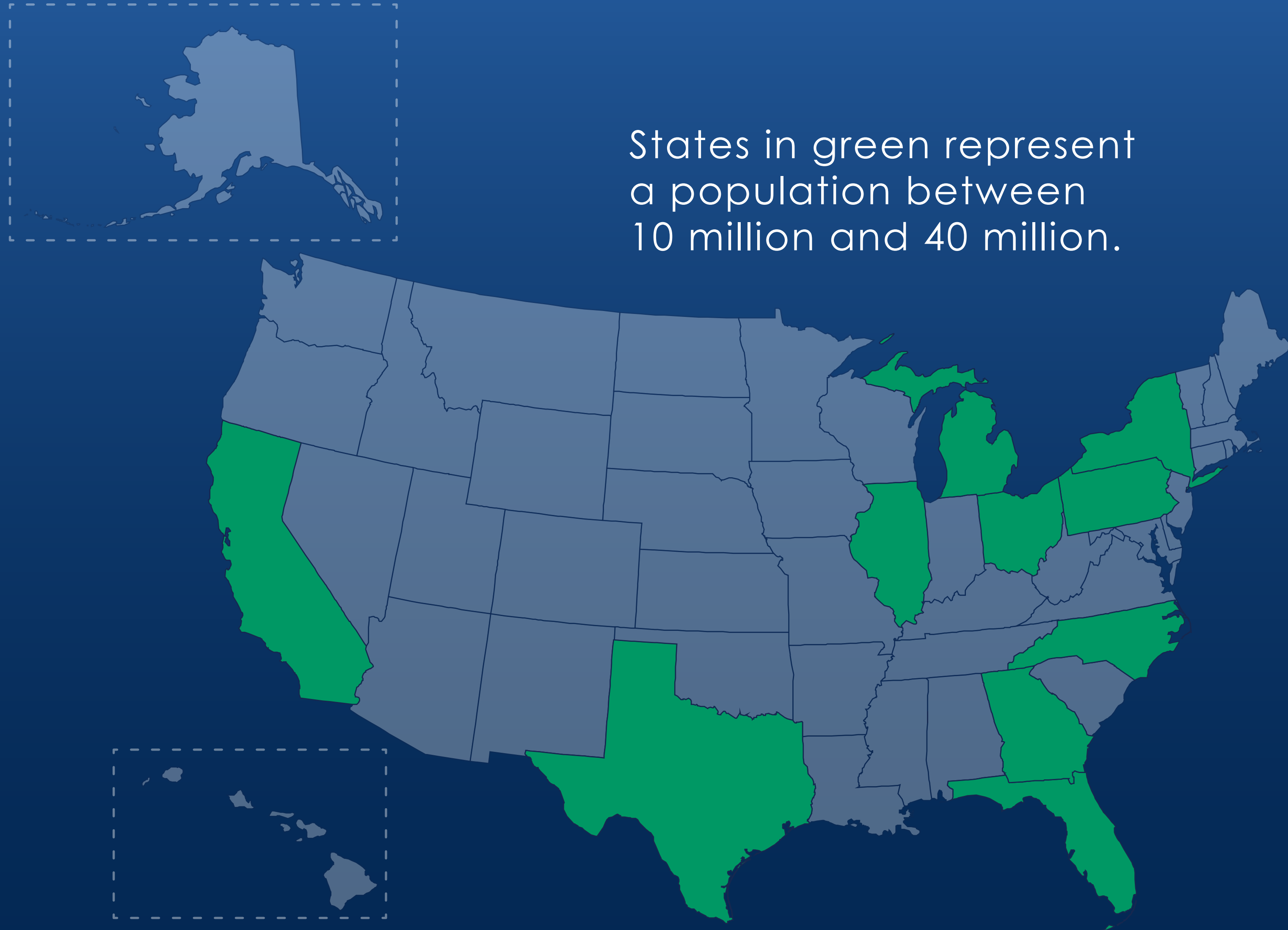

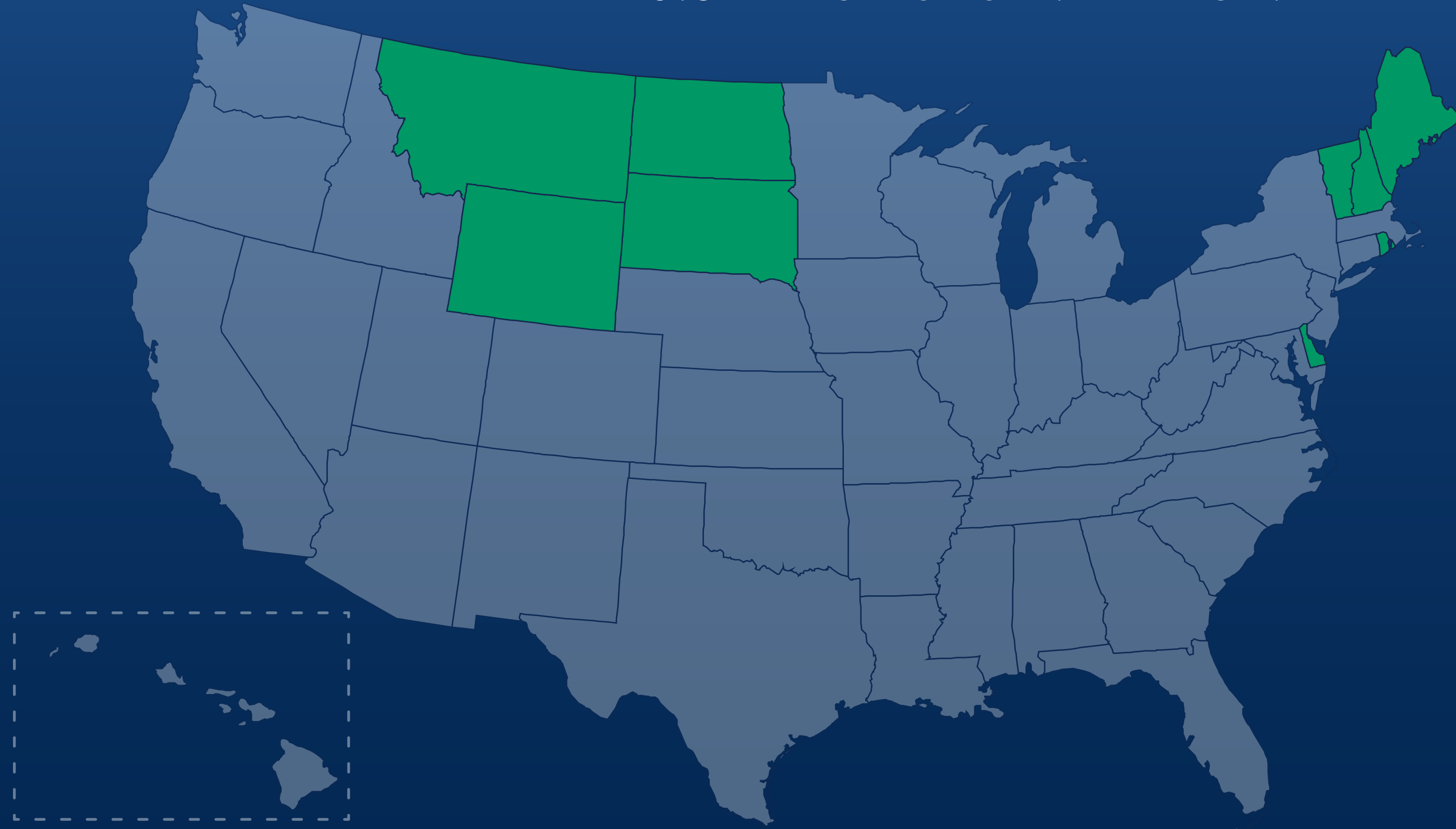

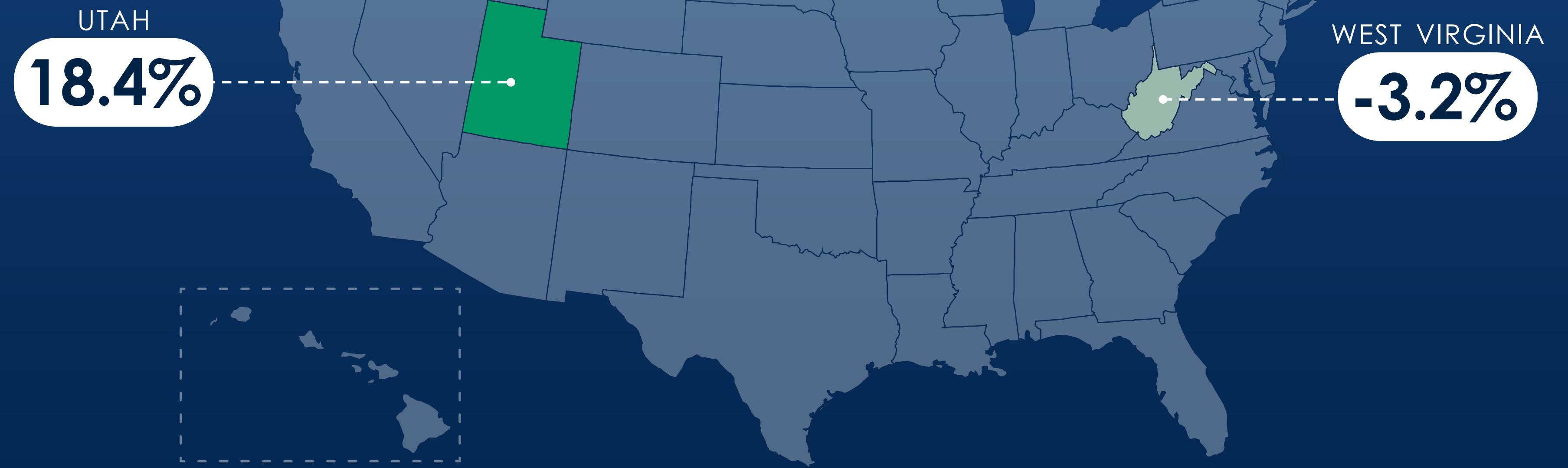

# States With the Largest Percent Increase and Decrease in Population: 2010 to 2020



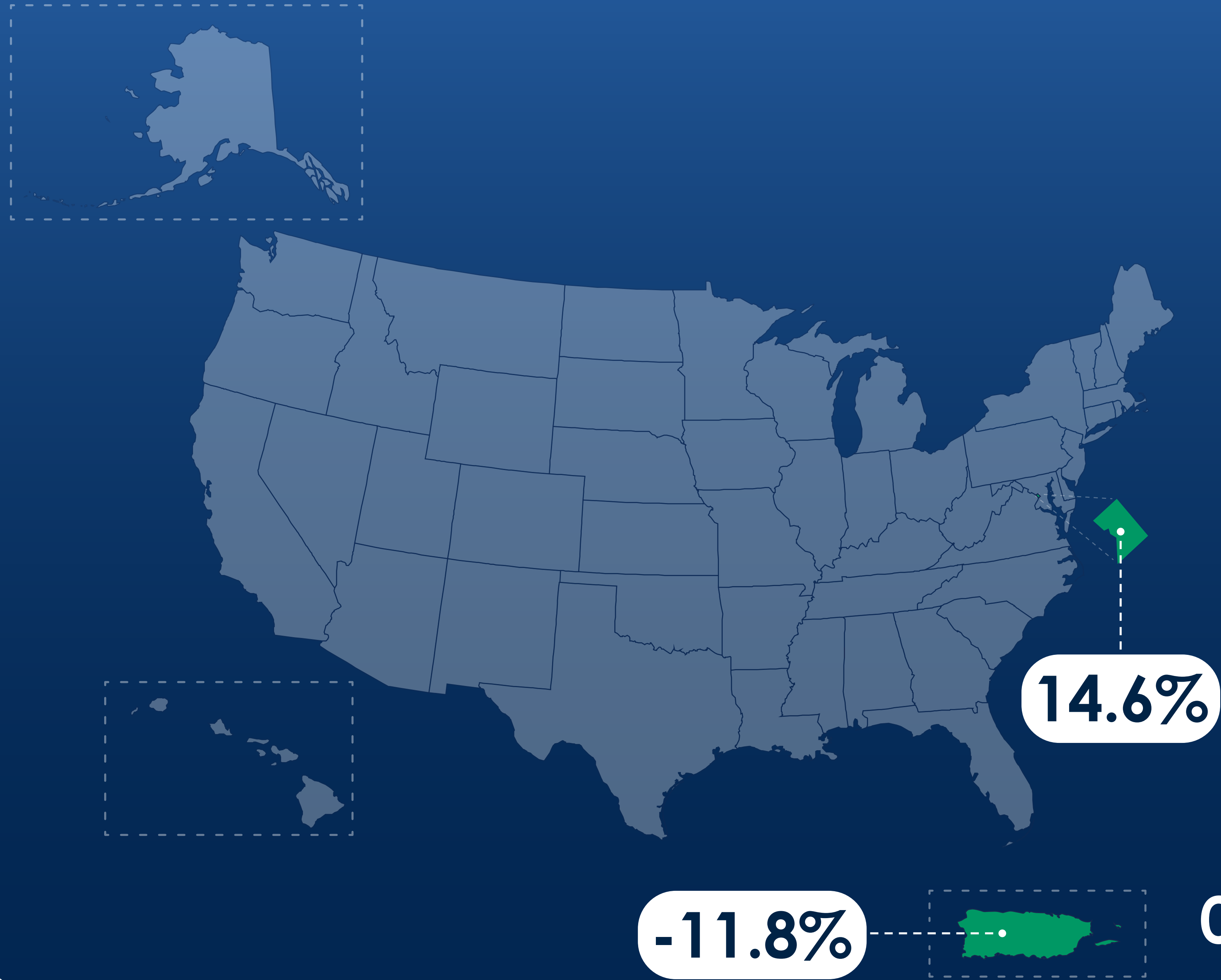

# Percent Change in Population for the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico: 2010 to 2020



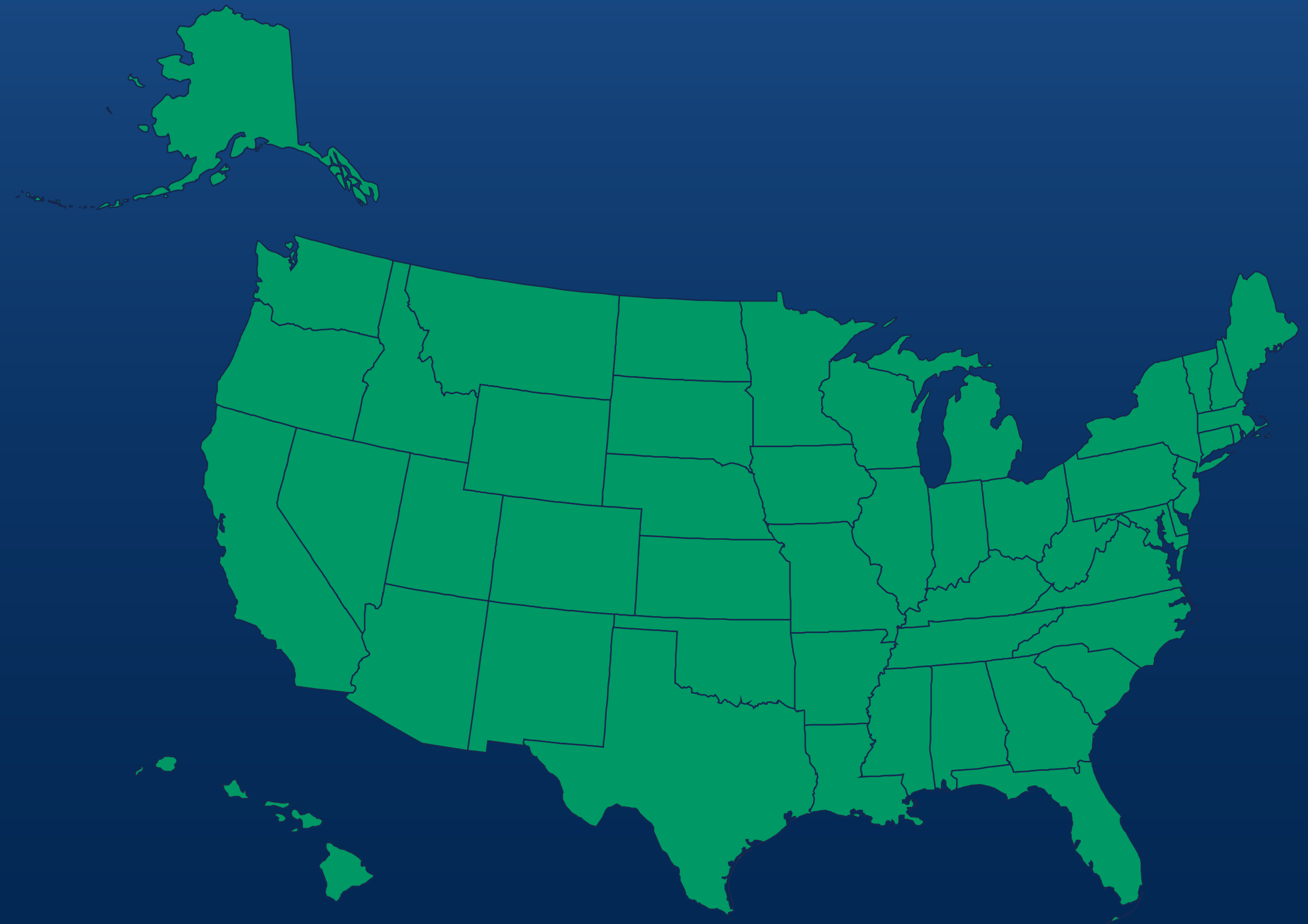

- Does not include the populations of the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico.



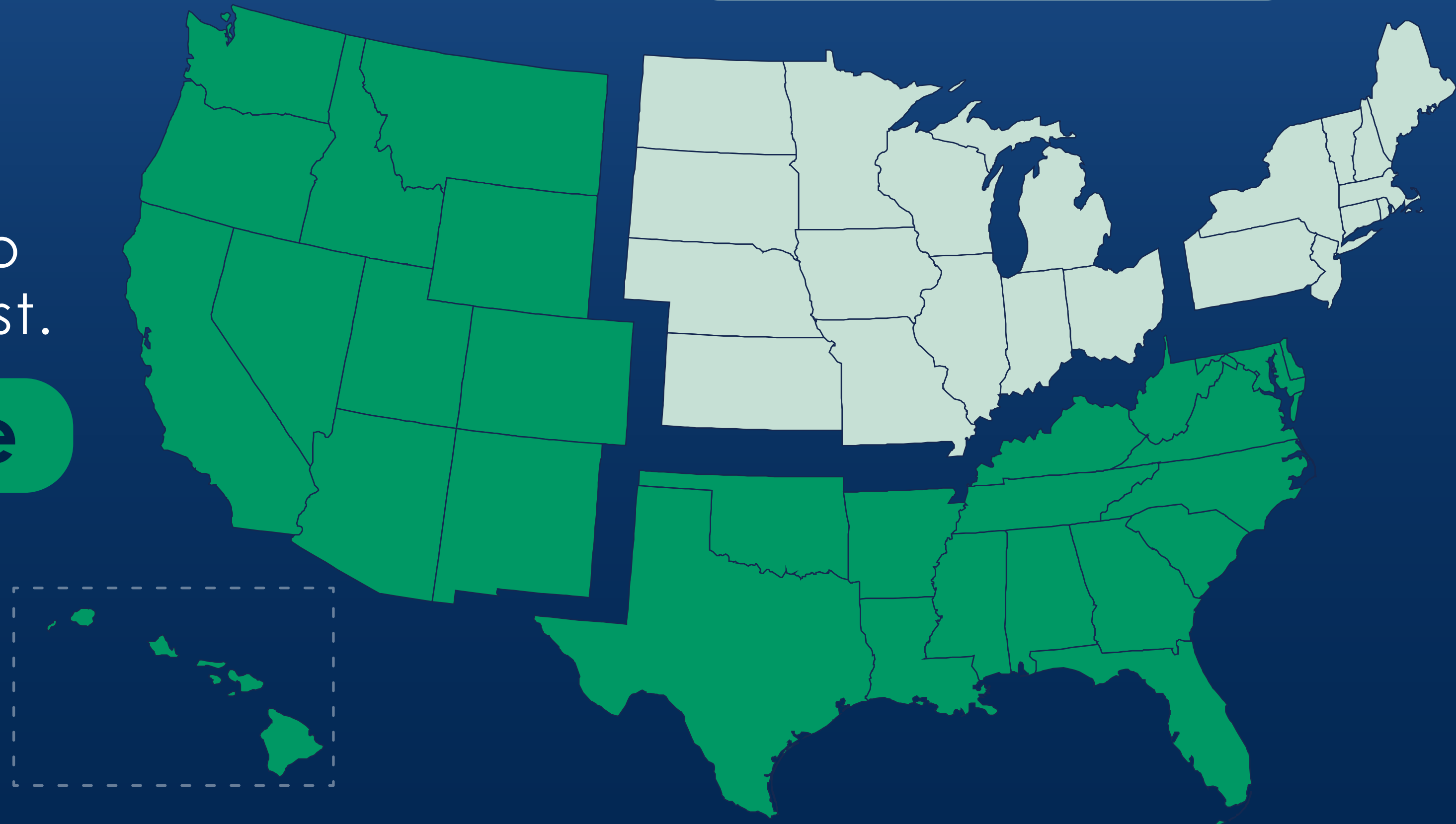

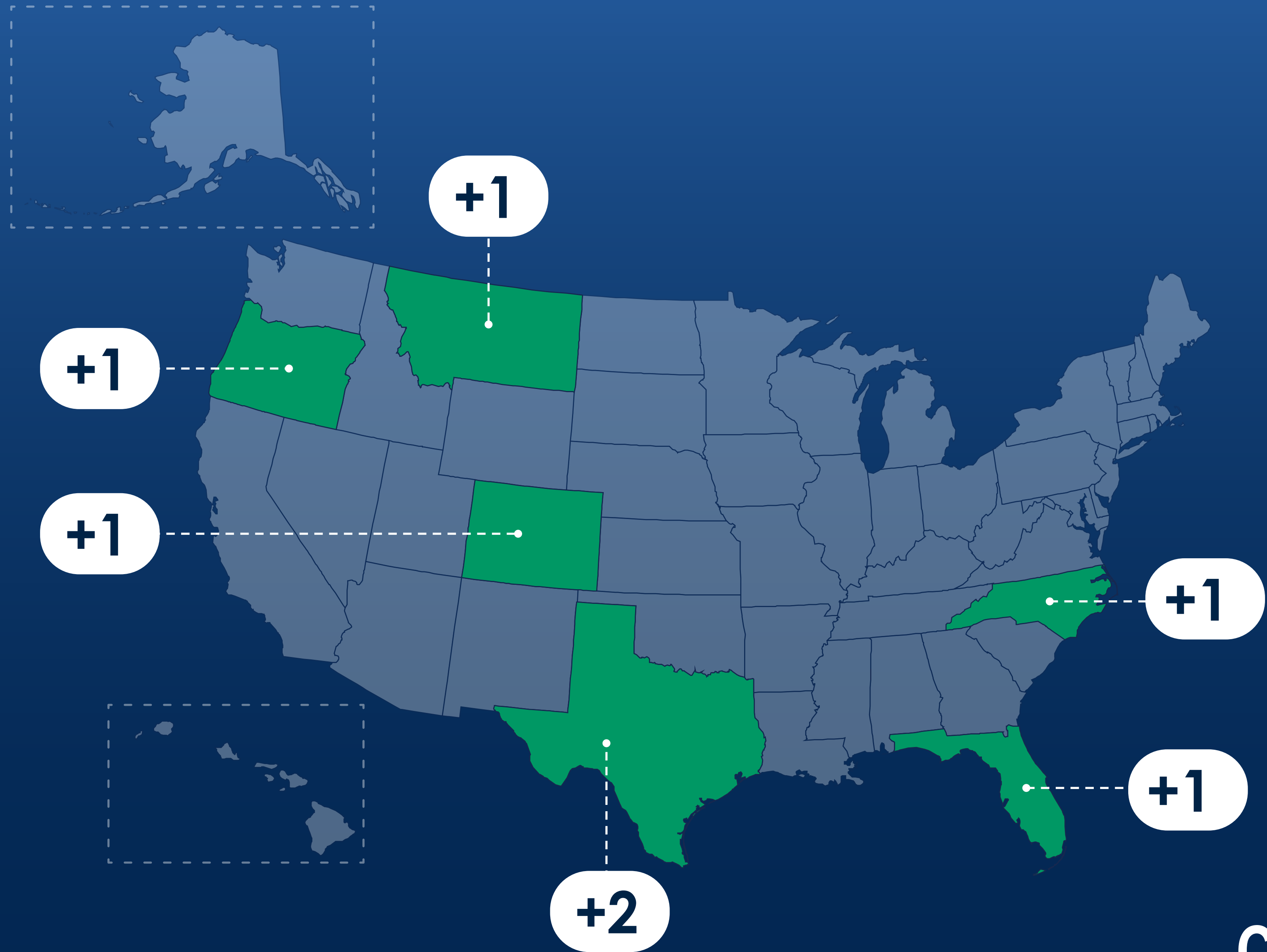

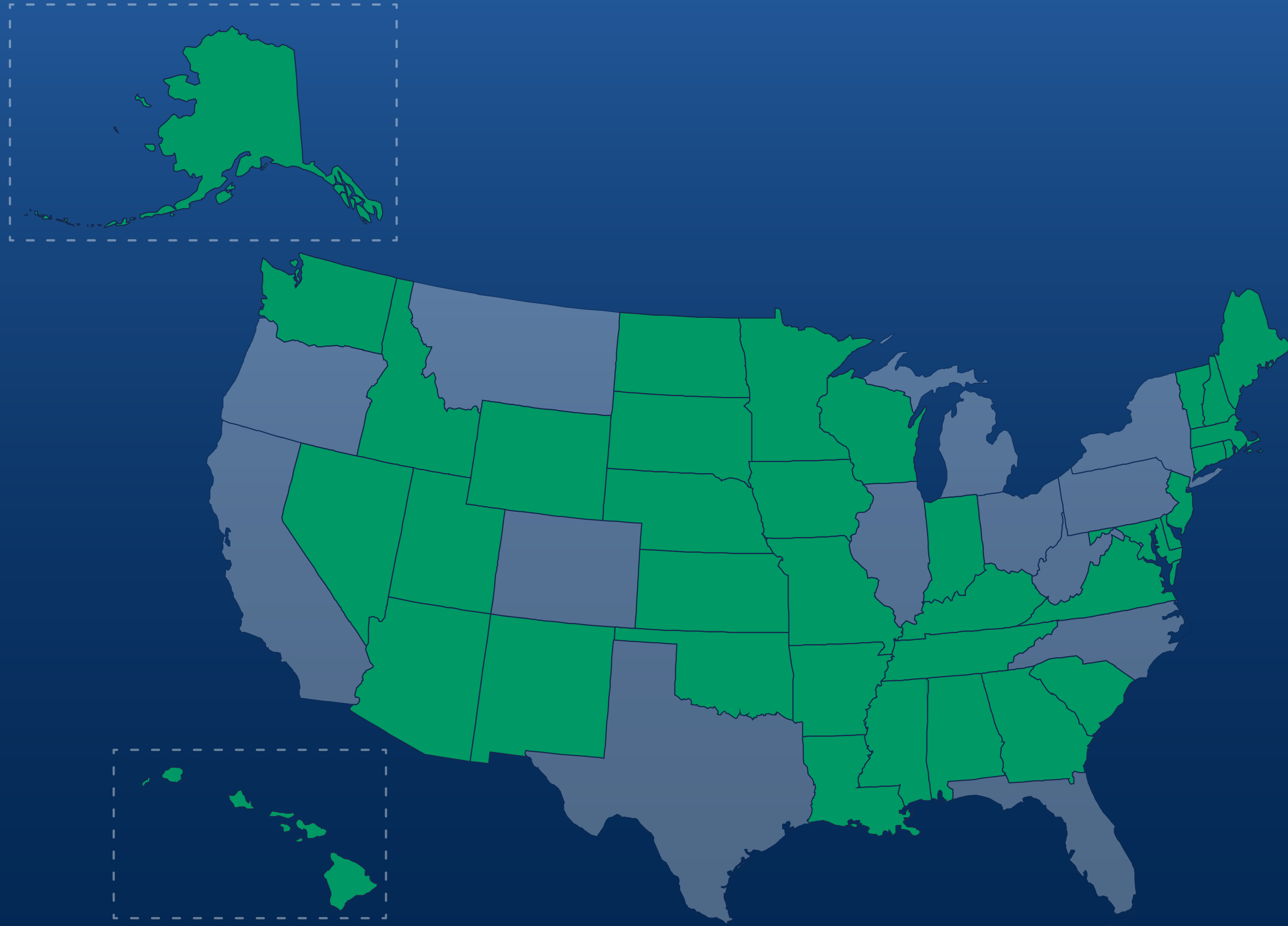

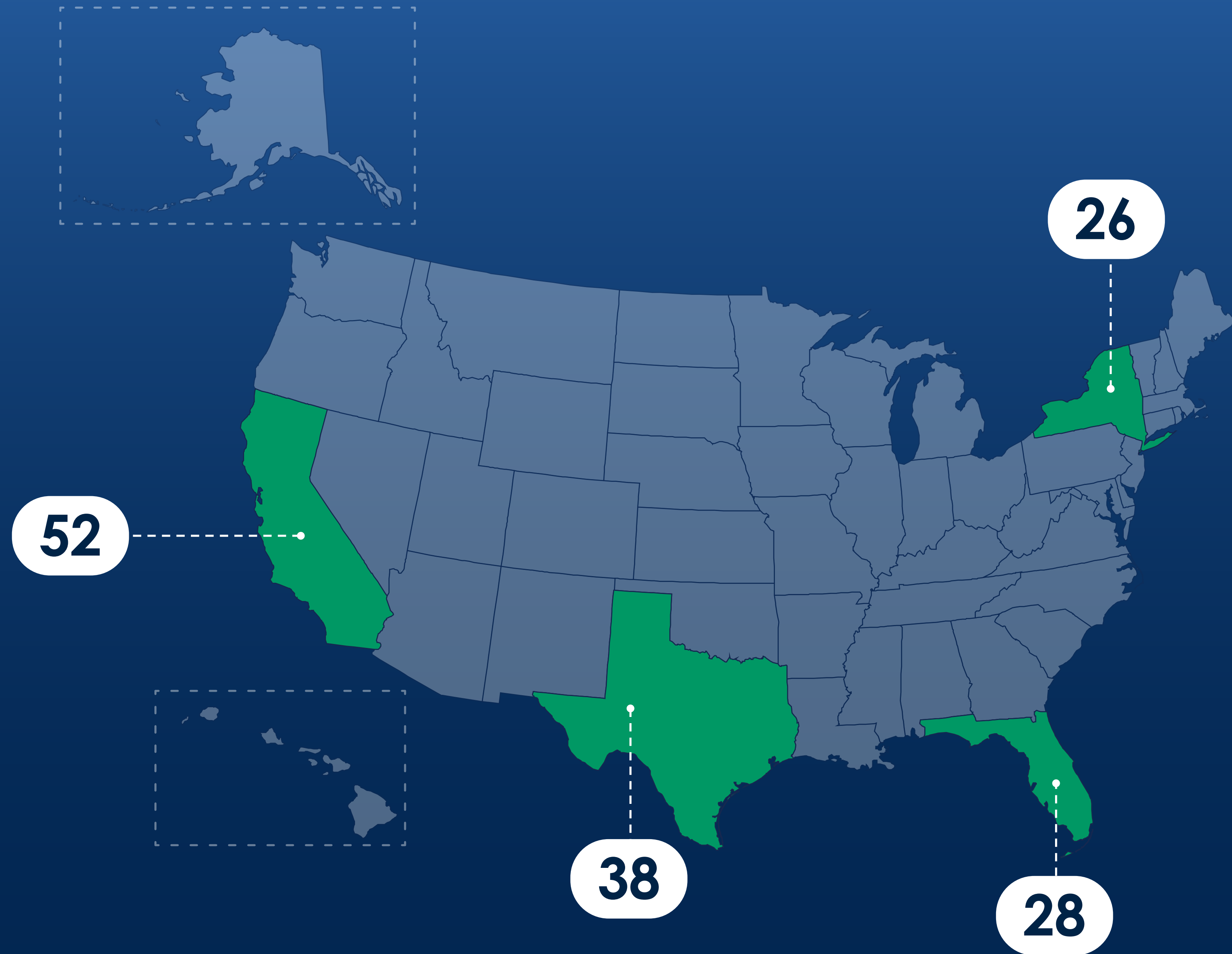
