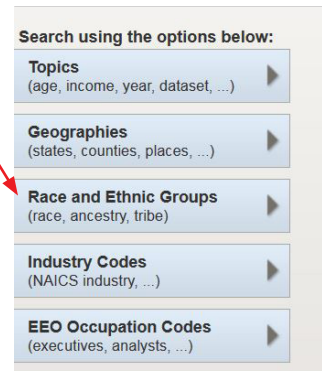
Accessing Tribal Data

1) Go to factfinder.census.gov and select the “Advanced Search” tab.



2) Choose “Detailed American Indian Tribe/Tribal Group.”

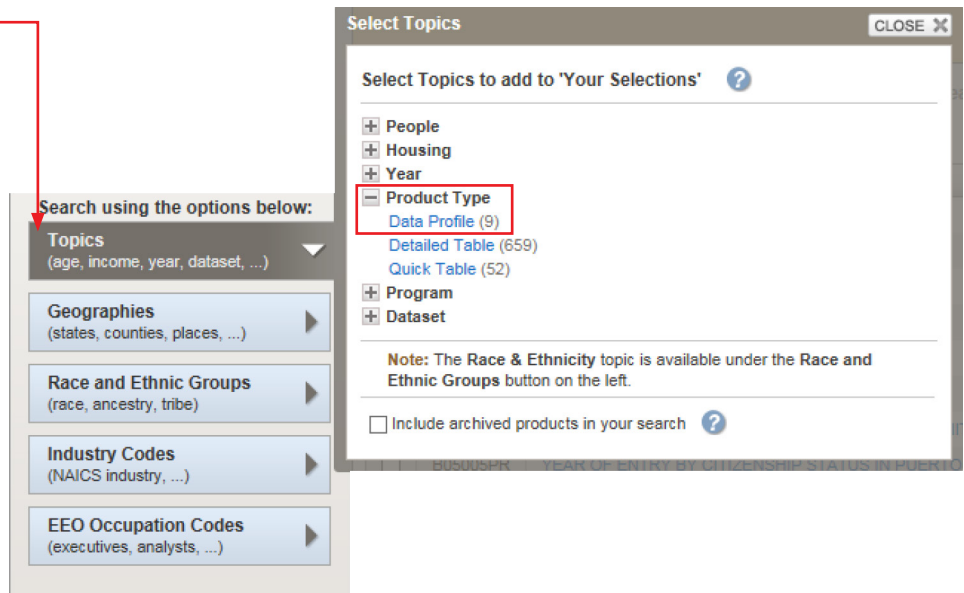
- Select “Race and Ethnic Groups.”
- Select the “Detailed Groups” tab.
- Select “Race and Hispanic Origin” under “Population Group Type.”
- Select “Detailed American Indian Tribe/Tribal Group.”
- Select tribe/tribal group of interest, such as “Abenaki.”
- Select specific tribe/tribal group under “Population Group Name,” such as “All available Abenaki tribes.”
- Select “CLOSE” on the top right of the window.

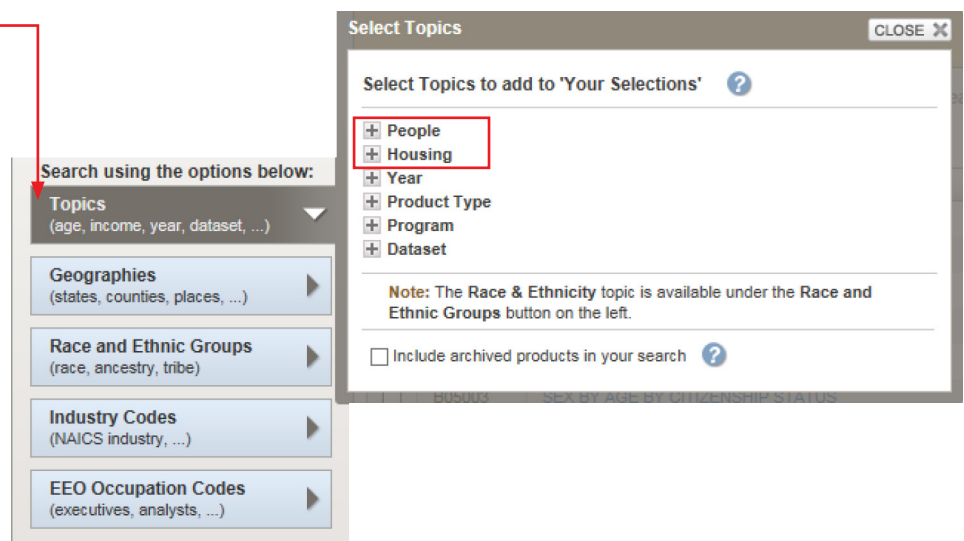
3) Option A—View a broad-based data profile.

- Select either “People” or “Housing.”
- Select desired topic.
- Select “CLOSE” on the top right of the window.
- Select desired table to view from “Search Results.”
