- We conduct more than 130 censuses and surveys each year, including
  - The Decennial Census the once-a-decade population and housing count of all 50 states and U.S. territories
  - The American Community Survey the ongoing, annual survey of the social, economic, housing, and demographic characteristics of the nation's population
  - The Economic Census the official five-year measure of American businesses
  - The Census of Governments identifies the scope and nature of the nation's state and local government sector



#### The Foundation

## The American Community Survey is on the leading edge of survey design, continuous improvement, and data quality

- The nation's most current, reliable, and accessible data source for local statistics on critical planning topics such as age, children, veterans, commuting, education, income, and employment
- Surveys 3.5 million addresses and informs over \$675 billion of federal government spending each year
- Covers 40+ topics, supports over 300 evidence-based Federal government uses, and produces 11 billion estimates each year
- Three key annual data releases:
  - 1-year Estimates (for large populations, geographies of 65,000+ population)
  - 1-year Supplemental Estimates (for small populations, geographies of 20,000+ population)
  - 5-year Estimates (for very small populations, geographies down to Census Tracts and Block Groups)

#### **Insight Tools**

The Insights Hub is available to all Y staff with a Link account. Security and permissions for each tool vary 1) depending on the information being provided and 2) the responsibility of the YMCA staff person. YMCA of the USA, Alliance Partner and Regional Service Hub staff can access individual Y level information at a national level ("global access"). In general, YMCA staff may only be able to see information pertaining to their Y, national or regional aggregates.

Why We Ask Questions About...

#### Commuting / Journey to Work

We ask questions about where people work, how they get there, when they leave home, and how long it takes, to create statistics about commuting, or a person's journey to work.

Commuting patterns and characteristics are crucial to planning for improvements to road and highway infrastructure, developing transportation plans and services, and understanding where people are traveling in the course of a normal day.




#### Your privacy concerns

We use your confidential survey answers to create statistics like those in the results below and in the full tables that contain all the data—no one is able to figure out your survey answers from the statistics we produce. The Census Bureau is legally bound to strict confidentiality requirements. Individual records are not shared with anyone, including federal agencies and law enforcement entities. By law, the Census Bureau cannot share respondents' answers with anyone—not the IRS, not the FBI, not the CIA, and not with any other government agency.
