# Dependent Interviewing in the American Housing Survey Updated September 6, 2018

"Dependent interviewing" is the practice of using the results from previous surveys or other questions to improve the accuracy and reduce respondent burden of current surveys. Only respondent-provided, unedited data are eligible to be used in dependency comparisons. Since the American Housing Survey is longitudinal, it provides numerous opportunities to utilize dependent interviewing.

In 2015, the AHS began a new longitudinal panel. The panel has two primary components: 1) an integrated national sample which includes the Top 15 metropolitan areas, and 2) an independent metropolitan area sample, consisting of rotating metros. Since 2015 was the first year with the new panel, dependent interviewing was not used in the collection instrument. Dependent interviewing was reinstated for the 2017 AHS.

Dependent interviewing takes a number of basic forms. Each of these basic forms have variations depending on the nature of the original question. Based on the individual item, the eligibility for dependency may be further restricted. For most items, the prior year must have been a regular, occupied interview. For items related to the acquisition of the home and the demographic characteristics of the household, the prior year household must be the same as the current year. The following are the most common forms of dependency in the current AHS instrument.

- 1. <u>Do Not Re-ask (DNR)</u>. In its simplest form, data items that are unlikely to change can be skipped entirely once a valid answer is obtained. Examples of this include the purchase price of the housing unit or a person's country of birth.
- 2. <u>Verify (V)</u>. For data items which can change, but either do so infrequently or in a predictable way (such as a person's age), the respondent can be asked to verify that the situation is the same as it was in the previous survey or supply new information about any changes.

The AHS instrument also includes other types of dependency such as "Bounding" and "Setting". These types of dependencies apply only to a select number of items in the instrument.

- 3. <u>Bounding (B)</u>. For infrequent events, such as remodeling or major repairs, the respondent is asked whether an event is the same or different from one reported in the previous survey. This helps eliminate "telescoping," the tendency of respondents to remember events as more recent than they actually were.
- 4. <u>Setting (S-pn)</u>. In some cases, whether a question uses a type of dependent interviewing depends on specified conditions. For example, SUBRNT (whether the government subsidizes rent for the unit), is generally set if the prior year value for PROJ is "yes" for occupied units but is not re-asked for vacant units.

The table below lists the variables in the AHS dataset that are subject to dependent interviewing and the type of dependency used in each survey year after 2015, if any. See the legend and notes at the foot of each page for an explanation of the codes used. For dependent interviewing prior to 2015, please refer to <a href="Dependent Interviewing in the American Housing Survey">Dependent Interviewing in the American Housing Survey</a>. Note that dependency formats may change from survey year to survey year.
