Video Interviewing at Westat

> What is a video interview?

Data collection from survey respondents by live interviewers with a laptop computer through video conferencing software.


- Computer-Assisted Video Interviewing (CAVI)
- > Early adoption on 2020 American National Election Study

What is MEPS?

- Medical Expenditure Panel Survey
- > MEPS measures how Americans use and pay for medical care, health care, and out-of-pocket spending.
- MEPS collects data on use of health care services, including providers, medical events, insurance coverage and expenditures.
- MEPS also collects data on health status, medical conditions and supplemental topics related to health care
- > In-person data collection

What is MEPS?

Annual panel of 10K households, followed for 2 years



Approximately 30,000 completed interviews per year

Video Interviewing on MEPS


- > Effects of the pandemic
 - Shifted to CATI interviewing
 - Concerns about mode effects and data quality
- > Introduced CAVI while in production
 - Developed and tested technical approach
 - Trained 300+ field data collectors
- > Technology issues
 - iPhones already in use as part of our field management systems
 - Required secure, reliable, usable video conferencing software

MEPS CAVI Production

Production during the past two years:

	Number CAVI	CAVI % of Completes
Spring 2022	708	3%
Fall 2022	2558	21%
Spring 2023	4401	25%
Fall 2023	1583	15%

Including current round in progress, over 10,000 CAVI cases

Looking More Closely at CAVI

Ongoing analysis of CAVI operations

> Who is responding?

> Is there an impact on data quality?

Respondents

- > Who is responding?
 - Recall that MEPS respondents are offered CAVI
 - Respondents generally choose the mode of completion
- > In comparison to other modes, CAVI respondents tend to be more:
 - Young and middle-aged (18-54)
 - College educated
 - Either married or never married
 - Non-Hispanic white
 - English-speaking

Data Quality

Data quality indicators compared to other modes

- CAVI interviewers maintain the meaning of questions at a higher rate
- CAVI has the lowest rate of questions with timing durations faster than 4 w/s, suggesting that interviewers may be better able to adhere to study protocols in CAVI as compared to CATI or CAPI
- CAVI respondents reported higher use of records than CAPI and CATI
- No statistically significant differences between CAVI and CAPI in terms of the number of events reported
- CAVI interviews slightly longer than CAPI

Video Interviewing Approaches Maturity

- > Pivoting from reaction to rational: technology life cycle
 - Innovation
 - Syndication
 - Maturity
 - Decline
- > Learning as we go
- > When is CAVI effective?
- > Focus on later rounds
- > CAVI as specialization
