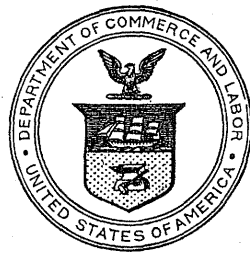

## LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL.

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND LABOR,  
BUREAU OF THE CENSUS,  
Washington, D. C., October 1, 1907.

SIR:

On June 20, 1907, the President, through the Secretary of Commerce and Labor, and under the authority conferred by section 8 of the organic act of the Department, directed the Director of the Census to take a census of the population of the territory of Oklahoma and Indian Territory, comprising the proposed new state of Oklahoma. The directions were to undertake the work at once and complete it with all possible expedition. Plans were immediately made, and the general order covering these plans was made public on June 24. This order is printed herewith. As appears therefrom, the immediate conduct of the fieldwork was placed in charge of Mr. William C. Hunt, chief statistician for population. The territory was divided into five districts, and a chief of division of the Census Office was assigned to the charge of each, as follows: First district, Edward W. Koch; second district, Richard C. Lappin; third district, Hart Momsen; fourth district, C. S. Sloane; fifth district, F. L. Sanford. The census of Oklahoma was therefore supervised at every point by men thoroughly trained in census methods, and familiar with all the details of the work. The result has been the quickest piece of census work ever accomplished, and, in view of the many difficult conditions encountered, probably the most satisfactory. A corps of Census clerks, 25 in number, including stenographers, proceeded to Guthrie, Okla., on June 30, where ample quarters in the city hall were procured for them by Governor Frantz. The district supervisors were likewise provided for at their several headquarters by the judicial and other Federal authorities having jurisdiction. Every facility and assistance was accorded the representatives of the Census by the local authorities, of all political faiths, and the work of enumeration, when once under way, proceeded rapidly to a conclusion, the last returns being received by the supervisor in charge on September 10. Considerable delay in the fieldwork necessarily occurred, owing to the difficulties encountered in properly adjusting and describing the enumeration districts, by reason of insufficient data, local uncertainty as to boundary lines, and the unsettled condition of parts of the country, particularly in Indian Territory. The two territories were divided into 1,461 enumeration districts, and as fast as the enumerators were selected, commissioned, and instructed they entered upon their work. These enumerators were selected, so far as possible, without regard to partisan politics, preference being given, wherever possible, to the substitute city letter carriers and substitute rural free delivery agents of the Post Office Department, presumed to be thoroughly familiar with their localities. Teachers and students in the educational institutions were also sought, and in several districts the services of the Census cotton ginning agents were utilized. The schedule employed was the simplest possible, and related only to the relationship of each person to the head of the family, color or race, sex and age.

## GENERAL ORDER.

The President of the United States having directed that a census be taken of Indian Territory and the territory of Oklahoma, comprising the area of the proposed state of Oklahoma, the following order is promulgated:

1. The census shall be taken as of the date of July 1, 1907, and the enumeration of the inhabitants shall be completed, as far as practicable, within two weeks from that date.

2. The immediate supervision of the fieldwork will be under the charge of William C. Hunt, Chief Statistician for Population, who is hereby designated as Supervisor in charge, and made responsible for the rapid and efficient conduct of the enumeration.

3. For purposes of enumeration the territory in question is hereby divided into five districts, the boundaries of which shall be, as far as practicable, those of the five Congressional districts apportioned to the proposed state of Oklahoma. Each of these five districts will be under the immediate supervision of a chief of division of the Census Office, who will make daily reports to the Supervisor in charge.

4. The area comprised in the present territory of Oklahoma and Indian Territory shall be divided into enumeration districts, as plotted by the Geographer of the Census, the lines of these districts to strictly conform, as far as practicable, to the township and municipal charter lines, where the same exist, and to the county lines as designated in the proposed constitution of the state of Oklahoma.

5. The work of enumeration shall be done by special agents acting as enumerators, to be appointed by the Director of the Census on the recommendation of the Supervisor in charge. They will proceed in accordance with sections 11 and 16 of the act of March 3, 1899, providing for taking the Twelfth and subsequent censuses. The enumerators so appointed shall be, as far as possible, residents of the enumeration districts they are to canvass. They shall be selected without regard to their political opinions, and because of their fitness for the work and their personal knowledge of the districts they are to canvass.

6. The compensation of enumerators shall be not less than \$3 nor more than \$5 per day of ten hours' actual fieldwork each. The Supervisor in charge is authorized to fix the compensation of each enumerator within these limits, having reference to the nature of the region to be canvassed and the density or sparseness of settlement, or other conditions pertinent thereto. No allowance for mileage or traveling expenses of enumerators shall be made in any case.

7. Each enumerator shall be required to make a daily report to the chief of division in charge of his district. If the daily reports of any enumerator shall indicate that he is not faithfully discharging his duties, the Supervisor in charge is authorized to suspend him from duty and to submit to the Director of the Census the reasons why he should be dismissed from the service.

8. Each enumerator before entering upon his duties shall take and subscribe to the following oath:

I, ....., do solemnly swear that I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I take this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion; that I will well and faithfully discharge the duties of the office on which I am about to enter, and that I will not disclose any information contained in the schedules, lists, or statements obtained by me, to any person, or persons, except those designated by the Director of the Census: So help me God.

9. Attention is called to the fact that section 21 of the act of March 3, 1899, prescribes certain penalties for the failure of enumerators to perform their duties, or irregularities in the same. Neglecting or refusing to perform duties prescribed; communication of information gained through performance of duties to persons not authorized to receive the same; swearing or affirming falsely; willingly and knowingly making false certificate or fictitious return, are all covered by appropriate penalties and fines.

Attention is especially called to the following extract from section 22 of the same act:

SECTION 22. That each and every person more than twenty years of age belonging to any family residing in any enumeration district or subdivision, and in case of the absence of the heads and other members of any such family, then any representative of such family, shall be, and each of them hereby is, required, if thereto requested by the Director, supervisor, or enumerator, to render a true account, to the best of his knowledge, of every person belonging to such family in the various particulars required, and whoever shall willfully fail or refuse to render such true account shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars.

10. The Supervisor in charge is hereby authorized to make such expenditures for supplies, office accommodations, etc., as are absolutely necessary for the prompt and efficient conduct of the enumeration.

11. For the purpose of enabling the Supervisor in charge to carry out the provisions of this order, the following chiefs of division in the Bureau of the Census are hereby designated to proceed to Oklahoma and Indian Territory for assignment in charge of the enumeration in the several Congressional districts: E. W. Koch, Hart Momsen, R. C. Lappin, F. L. Sanford, and C. S. Sloane.

# POPULATION OF OKLAHOMA AND INDIAN TERRITORY.

According to the returns of the special census taken as of July 1, 1907, the population of Oklahoma is 733,062 and that of Indian Territory 681,115, as compared with a population in 1900 of 398,331 and 392,060, respectively. This is an increase in seven years for Oklahoma of 334,731, or 84 per cent, and for Indian Territory of 289,055, or 73.7 per cent.

The combined population in 1907 of the two territories, representing the new state of Oklahoma, is 1,414,177, as compared with a population in 1900 of 790,391, an increase in seven years of 623,786, or 78.9 per cent.

The population of each territory and of both territories combined in 1907, 1900, and 1890 is shown in the following summary:

The population of Indian Territory was specially enumerated in 1890 and showed 51,279 Indians and 128,903 other persons (principally whites) living there at that census; but during the following decade the population more than doubled, the census of 1900 showing a population of 392,060, an increase over 1890 of 211,878, or 117.6 per cent.

Oklahoma was organized as a territory in May, 1890, from a part of Indian Territory, and at the census taken one month later had a population of 78,475, but at the census of 1900 it had a population of 398,331, or an increase in ten years of 407.6 per cent; that is, its population in 1900 was more than five times as large as the entire population returned in 1890.

Oklahoma had the largest and Indian Territory the second largest percentage of increase from 1890 to 1900 of any state or territory, and from the returns of the special census recently taken it is clear that the population of the territory comprising the new state

of Oklahoma will have considerably more than doubled at the period of the next decennial census, namely, in 1910.

At the census of 1900 the population of Oklahoma was credited to 23 counties and 4 Indian reservations, while that for Indian Territory was credited to 5 nations and 7 Indian reservations; but under the terms of the new state constitution provision has been made for 75 counties, 35 in the area comprising Oklahoma territory and 40 in that comprising Indian Territory.

The following table presents a statement of the population of Oklahoma by counties in 1907, in comparison with the population of certain counties in 1900, and of Indian Territory according to nations at both censuses:

There have been numerous changes in the county organization of Oklahoma since 1900, and for many of the counties as now constituted there are no comparable figures for 1900.

The population of Indian Territory in 1907 by counties is given in Table 5, and no similar figures for 1900 are available, as there was no county organization of any kind at that census.

That portion of the new counties of Grady, Stephens, and Jefferson which is west of the ninety-eighth meridian is actually a part of the territory of Oklahoma, and in the presentation of the population of the two territories by counties, as now constituted, a separate statement of the population comprised in the townships west of said meridian has been made.

The general results of the special census are presented in detail by counties, minor civil divisions, and congressional and legislative districts, in a series of tables numbered from 5 to 13, and designated as follows:

It will be observed from this table that, while the population of the two territories combined has increased rapidly since 1890, the change in the per cent distribution of sexes has been slight—a decrease of only 1 per cent in the males with a corresponding increase in the females. In Oklahoma the variation was 2.2 per cent, and in Indian Territory only four-tenths of 1 per cent.

In respect to color great change is noticed in the per cent distribution. In the two territories combined the Indians represented about one-fourth of the population in 1890, while in 1907 they represent only a little more than one-twentieth, this large difference being due to the increase in whites, which rose from 66.7 to 86.8 per cent, there being but little change in the percentage of negroes. A similar decrease in the percentage of Indians and increase in the percentage of whites is noticed in each territory, though the amount of variation is not quite so marked. The number of Mongolians is not appreciable in computing percentages.

No figures for ages are available for 1890, and it will be noticed that the variations in the per cent distribution for 1900 and 1907 are slight.

The apportionment of counties according to senate districts, with their population in 1907, and the number of senators and representatives allotted to each district or county, under the terms of Article V, sections 11 to 16, of the proposed constitution, is summarized as follows:
