Note C.—Questions Nos. 13, 14, 22 and 23 are not to be asked in respect to persons under 10 years of age.

Table with columns: In Cities, Name of Street, House Number, Dwelling houses numbered in order of visitation, Families numbered in order of visitation, Personal Description (Color, Sex, Age, Relationship), Civil Condition (Single, Married, Widowed, Divorced), Occupation (Profession, Trade), Health (Blind, Deaf, etc.), Education (Cannot read, Cannot write), Nativity (Place of Birth of person, father, mother).

NOTE E.—Question 13 is to be asked only in cases where an affirmative answer has been given either to question 10 or to question 11.  
NOTE F.—In making entries in column 13, the name of the month may be used, as Jan., Apr., Dec.
