TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Colorado was organized as a territory in February, 1861, and in August, 1876, was admitted to the Union as the thirty-eighth state. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 939,629, which represents an increase of 140,605, or 17.6 per cent, over the 1910 figure. During the same period

the population of the United States increased by 14.9 per cent.

The following summary shows the population of Colorado from 1860 to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase in each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole:
