### **Summary**

New orders for manufactured goods in November decreased \$2.2 billion or 0.9 percent to \$242.6 billion, the Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census reported today. This follows increases of 2.0 percent in October and 1.3 percent in September. Excluding defense, new orders were down \$1.6 billion or 0.7 percent. New orders without transportation equipment increased \$1.1 billion or 0.5 percent.

Shipments increased \$2.6 billion or 1.1 percent to \$247.0 billion, following a 0.6 percent October decrease and a 2.0 percent September increase. Excluding defense, shipments increased \$2.7 billion. Without transportation equipment, shipments were up \$1.3 billion.

Unfilled orders declined \$4.4 billion or 0.9 percent to \$471.8 billion, the lowest level since \$462.5 billion in November 1988. This is the thirteenth decline in the last fourteen months. Excluding defense, unfilled orders decreased \$3.8 billion or 1.1 percent. Without transportation equipment, unfilled orders increased \$0.2 billion or 0.1 percent.

Inventories decreased \$1.9 billion or 0.5 percent to \$381.8 billion, following a 0.2 percent decrease in October. Excluding defense, inventories decreased \$1.0 billion. The inventories-to-shipments ratio decreased from 1.57 in October to 1.55 in November.

### New Orders

New orders for durable goods in November decreased \$2.3 billion or 1.9 percent to \$123.0 billion. This follows increases of 4.6 percent in October and 0.4 percent in September.

Transportation equipment had the largest decrease, down \$3.4 billion or 10.3 percent to \$29.1 billion, as a decrease in aircraft and parts more than offset an increase in motor vehicles and parts. This follows a 21.2 percent increase in October. Electronic and other electrical equipment was down \$0.7 billion or 3.7 percent to \$18.2 billion. Industrial machinery and equipment had the largest increase, up \$1.0 billion or 4.8 percent to \$21.7 billion, following a 2.7 percent decline in October.

New orders for nondurable goods increased \$0.1 billion or 0.1 percent to \$119.6 billion, following a 0.6 percent decrease in October. The largest increase was in food and kindred products.

**Shipments** 

Shipments of durable goods in November increased \$2.4 billion or 1.9 percent to \$127.6 billion, following a 0.1 percent decrease in October. The largest increases were in

transportation equipment, up \$1.3 billion or 3.9 percent to \$33.7 billion, due to motor vehicles and parts and aircraft and parts, and industrial machinery and equipment, up \$1.3 billion or 6.1 percent to \$22.0 billion. The largest decrease was in electronic and other electrical equipment, down \$0.4 billion or 2.1 percent to \$18.1 billion.

Shipments of nondurable goods were up \$0.2 billion or 0.1 percent to \$119.4 billion, following a 1.0 percent decrease in October. The largest increase was in food and kindred products, up \$0.3 billion or 0.9 percent to \$33.5 billion.

#### **Unfilled Orders**

Unfilled orders for durable goods in November decreased \$4.6 billion or 1.0 percent to \$448.8 billion, the lowest level since \$440.7 billion in November 1988. This is the fourteenth decline in the last fifteen months. The largest decrease was in transportation equipment, down \$4.6 billion or 1.8 percent to \$244.6 billion, due to aircraft and parts and shipbuilding and tanks. Transportation equipment has declined in thirteen of the last fifteen months and is at the lowest level since \$243.1 billion in September 1989. Primary metals was down \$0.4 billion or 2.1 percent to \$19.5 billion, and industrial machinery and equipment declined \$0.3 billion or 0.6 percent to \$50.9 billion. Unfilled orders for nondurable goods increased \$0.2 billion or 0.8 percent to \$23.1 billion.

### **Inventories**

Inventories for durable goods in November decreased \$1.7 billion or 0.7 percent to \$237.7 billion, the lowest level since \$237.4 billion in November 1988. This is the thirteenth decline in the last fourteen months. The largest decrease was in transportation equipment down \$1.2 billion or 1.7 percent to \$68.3 billion, due to aircraft and parts and motor vehicles and parts. Transportation equipment has declined in ten of the last twelve months and is at the lowest level since \$68.0 billion in June 1989.

Nondurable goods, declined \$0.3 billion or 0.2 percent to \$144.0 billion. This follows nine consecutive monthly increases. Petroleum and coal products and food and kindred products had the largest decreases, both down \$0.3 billion

By stage of fabrication, finished goods decreased 0.4 percent in durables and increased 0.3 percent in nondurables. Work in process was down 1.1 percent in durables and 0.3 percent in nondurables. Materials and supplies decreased 0.3 percent in durables and decreased 0.8 percent in nondurables.




### **Total Manufacturing**


Ratio of Unfilled Orders and Inventories to Shipments


## **Nondefense Capital Goods**
