Summary

New orders for manufactured goods in March decreased \$3.8 billion or 1.5 percent to \$254.5 billion, the Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census reported today. This follows a 1.3 percent increase in February and 1.3 percent decrease in January. Excluding defense capital goods, new orders were down \$4.3 billion or 1.7 percent. Orders for first quarter 1993 totaled \$768.0 billion, up 2.9 percent from fourth quarter 1992.

Shipments increased \$2.8 billion or 1.1 percent to a new high of \$260.1 billion, following a 1.7 percent increase in February and 1.6 percent decrease in January. This is the fourth increase in the last five months. Shipments for first quarter 1993 totaled \$770.4 billion, up 2.8 percent from fourth quarter 1992.

Unfilled orders decreased \$5.5 billion or 1.2 percent to \$470.3 billion, the first decline since November. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio decreased from 3.51 in February to 3.42 in March, the lowest ratio since August 1978.

Inventories increased \$0.9 billion or 0.2 percent to \$380.0 billion. This follows a 0.2 percent increase in February and five consecutive declines from September to January. The inventories-to-shipments ratio decreased from 1.47 in February to 1.46 in March, the lowest on record.

New Orders

New orders for durable goods in March decreased \$4.6 billion or 3.4 percent to \$130.6 billion, following a 2.3 percent increase in February.

Nearly all major groups declined in March. Transportation equipment had the largest decrease, down \$3.7 billion or 10.2 percent to \$32.7 billion, primarily due to aircraft and parts. This follows a 9.6 percent increase in February and an 8.3 percent decrease in January. Fabricated metal products, electronic and other electrical equipment, and instruments and related products have each declined for three consecutive months.

New orders for nondurable goods increased \$0.8 billion or 0.7 percent to a new high of \$124.0 billion. This is the fourth increase in the last five months. Increases, led by food and kindred products and chemicals and allied products, more than offset declines, led by textile products and printing and publishing.

Shipments

Shipments of durable goods in March increased \$1.7 billion or 1.3 percent to a new high of \$135.8 billion, following a 2.8 percent increase in February. This is the

fourth increase in the last five months. Industrial machinery and equipment had the largest increase, up \$1.1 billion or 4.9 percent to \$24.2 billion, with nearly half the increase in computers and office equipment. Transportation equipment, up five of the last six months, increased \$0.4 billion or 1.0 percent to \$36.6 billion, with increases in aircraft and parts and motor vehicles and parts. Lumber and wood products and stone, clay, and glass products had the largest decreases.

Shipments of nondurable goods increased \$1.1 billion or 0.9 percent to a new high of \$124.3 billion, following a 0.5 percent increase in February. This is the fourth increase in the last five months. The largest increases were in food and kindred products, up \$0.4 billion or 1.2 percent to \$33.9 billion, and chemicals and allied products, up \$0.4 billion or 1.5 percent to \$26.1 billion. Textile products, rubber and plastics products, and printing and publishing had declines.

Unfilled Orders

Unfilled orders for durable goods in March decreased \$5.2 billion or 1.2 percent to \$447.3 billion, the first decrease since November 1992. Transportation equipment had the largest decrease, down \$3.9 billion or 1.6 percent to \$238.3 billion. This is the fourth decline in the last five months. Electronic and other electrical equipment was down \$1.0 billion or 2.3 percent to \$42.5 billion, following a 1.4 percent decline in February. Primary metals, up four months in a row, had the largest increase, up \$0.8 billion or 3.5 percent to \$23.5 billion. Unfilled orders for nondurable goods, declined \$0.3 billion or 1.3 percent to \$23.1 billion, the first decline since September 1992.

Inventories

Inventories for durable goods in March increased \$0.3 billion or 0.1 percent to \$235.4 billion. This follows a 0.3 percent increase in February and five consecutive declines from September to January. Lumber and wood products had the largest increase. Transportation equipment was down \$0.3 billion or 0.4 percent to \$66.4 billion, as a decline in aircraft and parts more than offset an increase in motor vehicles and parts. Nondurable goods increased \$0.6 billion or 0.4 percent to a new high of \$144.6 billion. This is the second increase in the last three months.

By stage of fabrication, finished goods increased 0.8 percent in durables and 0.3 percent in nondurables. Work in process was down 0.3 percent in durables and up 0.4 percent in nondurables. Materials and supplies increased 0.3 percent in durables and 0.6 percent in nondurables.




Total Manufacturing


Ratio of Unfilled Orders and Inventories to Shipments


Nondefense Capital Goods
