Summary

New orders for manufactured goods in December increased \$4.9 billion or 1.7 percent to \$298.6 billion, the Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census reported today. This follows a 2.7 percent increase in November, is the ninth increase this year and the fourteen in the last seventeen months. New orders for 1994 are 10.2 percent above 1993.

Shipments increased \$4.1 billion or 1.4 percent to \$295.3 billion, following a 2.5 percent increase in November. This is the third increase in the last five months, the seventh this year and the twelfth in the last seventeen months. Shipments for 1994 are 8.5 percent above 1993.

Unfilled orders increased \$3.3 billion or 0.7 percent to \$456.6 billion, following a 0.6 percent increase in November. This is the fourth consecutive monthly increase and the ninth this year. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio decreased in December to 2.87 from 2.88 in November. December 1994 unfilled orders are 3.3 percent above December 1993.

Inventories increased \$1.3 billion or 0.3 percent to \$391.3 billion, following a 0.5 percent increase in November. This is the third consecutive monthly increase and the tenth this year. The inventories-toshipments ratio decreased in December to 1.32 from 1.34 in November. The December 1994 inventory level is 3.7 percent above December 1993.

New Orders

New orders for manufactured durable goods in December increased \$2.4 billion or 1.5 percent to \$161.7 billion, revised from the previously published 1.4 percent increase. This follows a 3.4 percent increase in November and is the ninth in 1994 and the fourteenth in the last seventeen months.

Transportation equipment had the largest increase, \$2.4 billion or 6.0 percent to \$41.8 billion; large increases led by shipbuilding and tanks were only partially offset by a decline in aircraft and aircraft parts. This follows a 12.1 percent increase in November and is the fourth in the last five months. Primary metals increased \$0.8 billion or 5.7 percent to \$15.5 billion, the fifth consecutive monthly increase. Electronic and other electrical equipment increased \$0.8 billion or 3.2 percent to \$25.6 billion, the fifth consecutive increase and the ninth in 1994. Instruments and related products increased \$0.3 billion or 3.2 percent to \$11.1 billion, following a 4.0 percent decrease in November. Stone, clay, and glass products increased \$0.2 billion or 3.1 percent to \$7.4 billion, the third consecutive increase. Industrial machinery and equipment had the largest decline, \$1.5 billion or 5.0 percent to \$28.5 billion, following a 1.2 percent decline in November. This is the third decline in the last four months and the sixth in 1994. Fabricated metal products decreased \$0.5 billion or 3.4 percent to \$15.2 billion, the first decline since September.

New orders for nondurable goods were \$136.8 billion, up \$2.5 billion or 1.8 percent from November; nearly all industries increased. The largest increases were in food and kindred products, chemicals and allied products, and apparel and related products.

Shipments

Shipments of durable goods in December increased \$1.5 billion or 1.0 percent to \$158.8 billion, revised from the previously published 0.7

percent increase. This follows an increase of 3.1 percent in November and is the seventh increase in 1994. Primary metals increased \$0.7 billion or 4.8 percent to \$14.8 billion, the eleventh consecutive monthly increase. Industrial machinery and equipment was up \$0.4 billion or 1.6 percent to \$28.8 billion. This follows a 0.8 percent November decline and is the seventh increase in the last eight months. Stone, clay, and glass products increased \$0.3 billion or 3.7 percent to \$7.2 billion, following a 3.9 percent November increase. Electronic and other solution of 0.9 percent to \$24.7 billion. Transportation equipment increased \$0.2 billion or 0.9 percent to \$24.7 billion. Transportation equipment increased 0.2 percent to \$40.0 billion, with an increase in motor vehicle and parts partially offset by declines led by aircraft and aircraft parts. This follows a 6.9 percent increase in November and is the sixth in 1994.

Shipments of nondurable goods increased \$2.6 billion or 1.9 percent to \$136.5 billion, with increases in nearly all industries. This follows a 1.9 percent increase in November and is the twelfth increase in the last fourteen months. Food and kindred products, up for the third consecutive month, had the largest increase, \$1.0 billion or 2.7 percent to \$37.6 billion. Chemicals and allied products and apparel and related products also had large increases.

Unfilled Orders

Unfilled orders for durable goods in December increased \$2.9 billion or 0.7 percent to \$431.2 billion, the fourth consecutive monthly increase. The December percent change is unrevised from the previously published 0.7 percent increase. Transportation equipment increased \$1.9 billion or 0.9 percent to \$203.2 billion. This follows a 0.2 percent decrease in November and is the first increase since January 1994. Electronic and other electrical equipment increased \$0.9 billion or 1.9 percent to \$47.0 billion, the fourth consecutive monthly increase. Primary metals was up \$0.6 billion or 2.3 percent to \$29.1 billion, the thirteenth consecutive monthly increase. Industrial machinery and equipment, down for the first month since June 1993, decreased \$0.3 billion or 0.4 percent to \$67.7 billion.

Inventories for durable goods in December increased \$0.9 billion or 0.4 percent to \$247.3 billion. Except for the 0.1 percent decrease in September, inventories have increased every month since March 1994. Electronic and other electrical equipment, up for the twelfth consecutive month and twenty-four of the last twenty-six, had the largest increase, \$0.5 billion or 1.1 percent to \$40.2 billion. Fabricated metal products increased \$0.4 billion or 1.5 percent to \$24.2 billion, following a 0.7 percent increase in November. Primary metals increased \$0.2 billion or 0.8 percent to \$20.6 billion, the fourth consecutive increase. Transportation equipment, down for the fifth consecutive month, had the largest decline, \$0.2 billion or 0.4 percent to \$58.6 billion.

Nondurable goods inventories increased \$0.4 billion or 0.3 percent to \$144.0 billion, the third consecutive monthly increase. Chemicals and allied products had the largest increase, \$0.3 billion or 0.9 percent to \$34.3 billion, following a 0.3 percent November increase.

By stage of fabrication, finished goods increased 1.0 percent in durables and 0.7 percent in nondurables. Work in process decreased 0.2percent in durables and 1.0 percent in nondurables. Materials and supplies increased 0.5 percent in durables and 0.3 percent in nondurables.




Total Manufacturing

Ratio of Unfilled Orders and Inventories to Shipments




Nondefense Capital Goods
