Summary

New orders for manufactured goods in February decreased \$0.5 billion or 0.2 percent to \$301.2 billion, the Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census reported today. This follows a 0.7 percent January increase, is the first decline since last October and the fourth in the last nineteen months.

Shipments increased \$1.5 billion or 0.5 percent to \$299.3 billion, following a 0.6 percent January increase. This is the fourth consecutive monthly increase and the fourteenth in the last nineteen months.

Unfilled orders, up for the sixth consecutive month, increased \$1.9 billion or 0.4 percent to \$462.7 billion. This follows a 0.9 percent January increase. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio was 2.85, unchanged from January.

Inventories increased \$3.1 billion or 0.8 percent to \$399.2 billion, following a 1.1 percent January increase. This is the fifth consecutive monthly increase and the twelfth in the past fourteen months. The inventories-to-shipments ratio was 1.33, unchanged from January.

New Orders

New orders for manufactured durable goods in February decreased \$1.3 billion or 0.8 percent to \$163.2 billion, unrevised from the previously published 0.8 percent decrease. This follows a 1.4 percent January increase and is the first decrease since last October.

Electronic and other electrical equipment had the largest decline, \$1.2 billion or 4.8 percent to \$24.7 billion, following a 0.7 percent January increase. The February decline, largely due to communication equipment, was the first since last July. Primary metals decreased \$0.3 billion or 2.1 percent to \$15.2 billion. This follows a 1.5 percent January decline, which was the first since last July. Fabricated metal products declined \$0.2 billion or 1.5 percent to \$16.2 billion, following a 7.8 percent January increase. Industrial machinery and equipment increased \$0.5 billion or 1.7 percent to \$31.3 billion; the largest increase was for computer and office equipment. This follows a 9.1 percent January increase. Transportation equipment increased \$0.4 billion or 1.1 percent to \$40.1 billion; a large increase in aircraft and aircraft parts more than offset a decline in shipbuilding and tanks. The transportation equipment increase follows a 5.0 percent January decrease and two consecutive monthly increases.

New orders for nondurable goods were \$138.0 billion, up \$0.8 billion or 0.6 percent from January. Increases in petroleum and coal products and paper and allied products more than offset declines in leather and leather products and food and kindred products.

Shipments

Shipments of durable goods in February increased \$0.4 billion or 0.3 percent to \$161.5 billion, unrevised from the previously published 0.3 percent increase. This follows a 1.1 percent January increase, is the fourth consecutive monthly increase and the fourteenth in the last nineteen months. Industrial machinery and equipment had the largest increase, \$1.1 billion or 3.6 percent to \$30.2 billion; increases were widespread. This is the third consecutive increase and the ninth in the last ten months. Instruments and related products, up for the fourth consecutive month, increased \$0.2 billion or 1.5 percent to \$11.6 billion. Transportation

equipment increased 0.1 percent to \$40.3 billion. Fabricated metal products declined \$0.2 billion or 1.5 percent to \$16.0 billion, following a 6.7 percent January increase. Primary metals decreased \$0.2 billion or 1.1 percent to \$15.1 billion, the first decline since January 1994. Electronic and other electrical equipment decreased \$0.1 billion or 0.6 percent to \$24.5 billion. This is the second consecutive monthly decline following fourteen consecutive increases.

Shipments of nondurable goods increased \$1.1 billion or 0.8 percent to \$137.8 billion, the third increase in the last four months. Petroleum and coal products, up for the fourth consecutive month, increased \$0.8 billion or 6.1 percent to \$13.5 billion. Paper and allied products increased \$0.4 billion or 2.8 percent to \$13.4 billion, the eleventh consecutive increase. Food and kindred products, down for the second consecutive month, declined \$0.2 billion or 0.5 percent to \$36.3 billion.

Unfilled Orders

Unfilled orders for durable goods in February increased \$1.7 billion or 0.4 percent to \$436.4 billion, unrevised from the previously published 0.4 percent increase. This is the sixth consecutive monthly increase. Industrial machinery and equipment had the largest increase, \$1.1 billion or 1.7 percent to \$70.2 billion. This follows a 2.5 percent January increase and is the nineteenth in the last twenty months. Electronic and other electrical equipment, up for the sixth consecutive month, increased \$0.3 billion or 0.5 percent to \$48.9 billion, due to electronic components. Fabricated metal products increased \$0.2 billion or 1.2 percent to \$21.2 billion, the fourth consecutive monthly increase. Primary metals was up \$0.1 billion or 0.5 percent to \$29.6 billion, the fifteenth consecutive monthly increase. Transportation equipment, down nearly every month since August 1991, decreased \$0.1 billion or 0.1 percent to \$202.4 billion.

Inventories

Inventories for durable goods in February increased \$1.6 billion or 0.6 percent to \$251.9 billion. Except for the 0.1 percent decrease last September, inventories have increased every month since March 1994. Electronic and other electrical equipment, up for the fourteenth consecutive month, increased \$0.8 billion or 2.0 percent to \$42.2 billion. Industrial machinery and equipment increased \$0.5 billion or 1.0 percent to \$51.4 billion. This follows a 2.4 percent January increase and is the twenty-first increase in the last twenty-three months. Primary metals increased \$0.2 billion or 0.9 percent to \$21.3 billion, the sixth consecutive monthly increase. Fabricated metal products increased \$0.2 billion or 0.6 percent to \$24.5 billion, the fifth consecutive monthly increase. Transportation equipment, down for the seventh consecutive month, decreased \$0.3 billion or 0.6 percent to \$58.2 billion.

Inventories for nondurable goods increased \$1.5 billion or 1.0 percent to \$147.4 billion, the fifth consecutive monthly increase. All major industry groups increased. Rubber and plastic products, up for the fifth consecutive month, increased \$0.4 billion or 3.0 percent to \$13.7 billion. Chemicals and allied products, up for the fourth consecutive month, increased \$0.3 billion or 0.7 percent to \$34.7 billion.

By stage of fabrication, finished goods increased 0.6 percent in durables and 1.0 percent in nondurables. Work in process increased 0.4 percent in durables and 0.7 percent in nondurables. Materials and supplies increased 1.1 percent in durables and 1.2 percent in nondurables.

Note: Estimates of manufacturers' shipments, inventories and orders are subject to survey error and revision. One major component of survey error is nonsampling error, which includes errors of coverage, response, and nonreporting. Since the survey panel is not a probability sample, estimates of sampling error cannot be calculated. Further details on survey design, methodology, and data limitations are contained in our most recent annual benchmark publication, Current Industrial Reports: M3-1(92), "Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders: 1982-1992."




Total Manufacturing


Ratio of Unfilled Orders and Inventories to Shipments
