Summary

New orders for manufactured goods in July decreased \$3.8 billion or 1.3 percent to \$292.9 billion, the Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census reported today. This follows a 0.1 percent June decrease and is the fifth decline in the last six months. Year to date, new orders are 8.1 percent above the same period a year ago.

Shipments decreased \$5.9 billion or 2.0 percent to \$292.8 billion. This follows a 0.5 percent June increase and is the first decline since April and the third this year. Year to date shipments are 8.3 percent above the same period a year ago.

Unfilled orders increased \$0.1 billion to \$460.1 billion, following three consecutive monthly declines. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio was 2.84, up from 2.78 in June.

Inventories increased \$2.4 billion or 0.6 percent to \$412.5 billion, following a 0.4 percent June increase. This is the tenth consecutive monthly increase and the seventeenth in the last nineteen months. The inventories-to-shipments ratio was 1.41, up from 1.37 in June.

New Orders

New orders for manufactured durable goods in July decreased \$3.4 billion or 2.1 percent to \$155.6 billion, revised from the previously published 1.7 percent decrease. The July decline follows a 0.3 percent June decrease and is the fifth this year. Nearly three-quarters of the decrease was due to motor vehicle and parts, which was heavily affected by the growing industry practice of shutting down for two weeks in July.

Transportation equipment had the largest decline, \$3.0 billion or 8.2 percent to \$33.1 billion, mostly due to motor vehicles and parts. This follows a 1.1 percent June decline and is the fifth this year. Industrial machinery and equipment decreased \$2.1 billion or 6.7 percent to \$29.8 billion. This follows a 2.4 percent June increase and is the first decline since April. Instruments and related products declined \$0.4 billion or 3.5 percent to \$10.9 billion, the first decline since March. Electronic and other electrical equipment had the largest increase, \$1.7 billion or 6.4 percent to \$28.0 billion, mostly due to electronic components and accessories. This follows a 1.8 percent June decrease. Stone, clay, and glass products, up for the third consecutive month, increased \$0.2 billion or 2.3 percent to \$7.3 billion.

New orders for nondurable goods decreased \$0.4 billion or 0.3 percent to \$137.3 billion, the first decline since March. Declines, led by petroleum and coal products and paper and allied products, more than offset increases led by textile mill products and tobacco products.

Shipments

Shipments of durable goods in July decreased \$5.2 billion or 3.3 percent to \$155.6 billion, revised from the previously published 2.7 percent decrease. This follows a 0.8 percent June increase and is the first decrease since April and the second since. October 1994. Transportation equipment, down five of the last six months, decreased \$3.2 billion or 8.6 percent to \$34.6 billion; led by motor vehicles and parts, all industries declined. Electronic and other electrical equipment decreased \$0.8 billion or 3.1 percent to \$25.6 billion. This follows a 3.2 percent increase in June and is the fourth decline this year. Industrial machinery and equipment, down for the first month since

April, decreased \$0.7 billion or 2.1 percent to \$30.2 billion. Instruments and related products, down four of the last five months, declined \$0.3 billion or 2.6 percent to \$11.1 billion. This follows a 1.5 percent June decline. Primary metals, down three of the last four months, decreased \$0.3 billion or 1.8 percent 514.7 billion. This follows a 1.2 percent June decline and is the fourth this year. Stone, clay, and glass products, up for the third consecutive month, had the largest increase, \$0.1 billion or 1.4 percent to \$7.2 billion.

Shipments of nondurable goods, down for the first month since March, decreased \$0.6 billion or 0.5 percent to \$137.2 billion. Petroleum and coal products had the largest decrease, \$0.3 billion or 2.6 percent to \$12.7 billion, following a 4.1 percent June decrease. Rubber and plastic products, paper and allied products, apparel and related products, and textile mill products also decreased. Tobacco products had the largest increase, \$0.2 billion or 7.5 percent to \$3.0 billion. Food and kindred products also increased.

Unfilled Orders

Unfilled orders for durable goods in July increased slightly to \$434.1 billion, revised from the previously published slight decrease. This follows three consecutive monthly declines and seven consecutive monthly increases. Electronic and other electrical equipment had the largest increase, \$2.4 billion or 4.6 percent to \$54.7 billion; except for the 0.3 percent June decline, unfilled orders have increased every month since August 1994. Stone, clay, and glass products increased \$0.1 billion or 1.8 percent to \$7.8 billion, following a 1.0 percent June increase. Transportation equipment had the largest decline, \$1.5 billion or 0.7 percent to \$195.9 billion. This is the fifth consecutive monthly decline and the forty-third in the last forty-seven months. Industrial machinery and equipment decreased \$0.4 billion or 0.6 percent to \$72.8 billion. This is the first decline since December 1994 and the second since June 1993. Primary metals, down for the fifth consecutive month, declined \$0.4 billion or 1.6 percent to \$27.3 billion.

Inventories

Inventories of durable goods in July increased \$2.0 billion or 0.8 percent to \$259.4 billion. This follows a 0.3 percent June increase and is the seventeenth increase in the last nineteen months. Electronic and other electrical equipment had the largest increase, \$0.9 billion or 2.1 percent to \$44.7 billion. This follows a 1.2 percent June increase and is the nineteenth consecutive increase. Transportation equipment, up four of the last five months, increased \$0.3 billion or 0.5 percent to \$59.1 billion, following a 0.8 percent June decline. Industrial machinery and equipment, up five of the last seven months, increased \$0.3 billion or 0.5 percent to \$52.6 billion.

Inventories of nondurable goods in July increased \$0.4 billion or 0.3 percent to \$153.0 billion, the tenth consecutive monthly increase. Paper and allied products had the largest increase, \$0.4 billion or 2.7 percent to \$16.0 billion. Petroleum and coal products had the largest decline \$0.3 billion or 2.6 percent to \$10.9 billion. This follows a 1.2 percent June decline and is the second decline in the last ten months.

By stage of fabrication, finished goods increased 0.8 percent in durables and 0.4 percent in nondurables. Work in process increased 0.6 percent in durables and 1.0 percent in nondurables. Materials and supplies increased 1.0 percent in durables and decreased 0.1 percent in nondurables.

Since the survey panel is not a probability sample, estimates of sampling error cannot be calculated. 


Total Manufacturing


Ratio of Unfilled Orders and Inventories to Shipments
