Summary

New orders for manufactured goods in May increased \$4.0 billion or 1.4 percent to \$297.0 billion, the Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census reported today. This follows a 2.2 percent April decrease, and is the first increase since January. Year to date, new orders are 8.8 percent above the same period a year ago.

Shipments increased \$1.6 billion or 0.5 percent to \$296.9 billion. This follows a 1.1 percent April decline, is the first increase since February and the fifth increase in the last seven months. Year to date shipments are 8.9 percent above the same period a year ago.

Unfilled orders increased \$0.1 billion to \$462.1 billion, following a 0.5 percent April decrease. This is the eighth increase in the last nine months. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio was 2.82, down from 2.86 in April.

Inventories increased \$2.6 billion or 0.6 percent to \$408.2 billion, following a 0.9 percent April increase. This is the eighth consecutive monthly increase and the fifteenth in the last seventeen months. The inventories-to-shipments ratio was 1.37, unchanged from April.

New Orders

New orders for manufactured durable goods in May increased \$4.2 billion or 2.7 percent to \$159.7 billion, revised from the previously published 2.5 percent increase. This follows a 4.6 percent April decline and is the first increase since January.

Industrial machinery and equipment, up four of the last five months, increased \$1.1 billion or 3.5 percent to \$31.3 billion. This follows a 4.8 percent April decline. Transportation equipment increased \$1.0 billion or 2.9 percent to \$36.5 billion, due to aircraft and aircraft parts. This follows a 10.2 percent April decrease and is the first increase since February. Electronic and other electrical equipment increased \$1.0 billion or 3.7 percent to \$26.7 billion, with over half of the increase in communication equipment. This follows a 3.2 percent April decrease and is the eighth increase in the last ten months. Stone, clay, and glass products increased \$0.5 billion or 8.1 percent to \$6.9 billion. This follows a 6.9 percent April decline and is the first increase since January. Primary metals increased 0.3 percent to \$14.7 billion. This follows a 3.7 percent April decline and is the first increase since December.

New orders for nondurable goods decreased \$0.2 billion or 0.1 percent to \$137.3 billion. This follows a 0.7 percent April increase and is the third decline in the last nineteen months. Declines in food and kindred products and textile mill products more than offset increases in paper and allied products and chemicals and allied products.

Shipments

Shipments of durable goods in May increased \$1.6 billion or 1.0 percent to \$159.5 billion, revised from the previously published 0.9 percent increase. This follows a 2.2 percent April decline and is the sixth increase in the last seven months. Industrial machinery and equipment, up five of the last six months, increased \$0.6 billion or 2.1 percent to \$30.8 billion, following a 0.6 percent April decrease. Electronic and other electrical equipment increased \$0.6 billion or 2.4 percent to \$25.4 billion, following a 1.1 percent April decrease. Stone, clay, and glass products increased \$0.4 billion or 6.2 percent to \$7.0

billion, following a 6.0 percent April decline. Instruments and related products increased \$0.3 billion or 2.6 percent to \$11.6 billion, following a 2.8 percent April decline. Primary metals increased \$0.3 billion or 1.7 percent to \$15.2 billion. This follows a 2.5 percent April decrease and is the fourteenth increase in the last sixteen months. Transportation equipment, down for the fourth consecutive month, declined \$0.8 billion or 2.0 percent to \$37.4 billion; both motor vehicles and parts and aircraft and parts declined.

Shipments of nondurable goods in May increased slightly to \$137.4 billion, following a 0.3 percent April increase. The largest increases were for chemicals and allied products, \$0.2 billion or 0.8 percent to \$30.2 billion and paper and allied products, \$0.2 billion or 1.8 percent to \$13.9 billion. Food and kindred products, down four of the last five months, had the largest decline, \$0.5 billion or 1.4 percent to \$35.8 billion.

Unfilled Orders

Unfilled orders for durable goods in May increased slightly to \$436.1 billion. This follows a 0.6 percent April decrease and is the eighth increase in the last nine months. Electronic and other electrical equipment increased \$1.2 billion or 2.4 percent to \$52.5 billion, the ninth consecutive monthly increase. Industrial machinery and equipment increased \$0.5 billion or 0.7 percent to \$72.3 billion. This follows a 0.1 percent April increase and is the twenty-second increase in the last twenty-three months. Fabricated metal products, up for the seventh consecutive month, increased \$0.3 billion or 1.2 percent to \$21.4 billion. Transportation equipment had the largest decline, \$0.9 billion or 0.5 percent to \$199.0 billion. This follows a 1.3 percent April decline and is the third consecutive decline. Since reaching a peak in March 1991, unfilled orders of transportation equipment have declined nearly every month. Instruments and related products, down for the third consecutive month, declined \$0.6 billion or 1.3 percent to \$46.4 billion. Primary metals declined \$0.5 billion or 1.8 percent to \$28.6 billion. This follows declines in April and March of 1.0 percent and 0.4 percent respectively and fifteen consecutive increases.

Inventories

Inventories for durable goods in May increased \$1.5 billion or 0.6 percent to \$256.8 billion, with increases in nearly all categories. This is the fifteenth increase in the last seventeen months. Industrial machinery and equipment increased \$0.6 billion or 1.1 percent to \$52.3 billion, the fourth increase in the last five months. Transportation equipment was up \$0.5 billion or 0.8 percent to \$59.3 billion, the third consecutive increase. Electronic and other electrical equipment increased \$0.2 billion or 0.6 percent to \$43.2 billion. This follows a 1.0 percent April increase and is the seventeenth consecutive increase. Instruments and related products declined \$0.1 billion or 0.7 percent to \$21.8 billion, the first decline since January.

Inventories for nondurable goods in May increased \$1.1 billion or 0.7 percent to \$151.4 billion, the eighth consecutive monthly increase. Chemicals and allied products had the largest increase, \$0.4 billion or 1.2 percent to \$35.7 billion. Printing and publishing and paper and allied products also had large increases.

By stage of fabrication, finished goods increased 0.5 percent in both durables and nondurables. Work in process increased 0.6 percent in durables and 0.9 percent in nondurables. Materials and supplies increased 0.7 percent in durables and 0.9 percent in nondurables.

Note: Estimates of manufacturers' shipments, inventories and orders are subject to survey error and revision. One major component of survey error is nonsampling error, which includes errors of coverage, response, and nonreporting. Since the survey panel is not a probability sample, estimates of sampling error cannot be calculated. Further details on survey design, methodology, and data limitations are contained in our most recent annual benchmark publication, Current Industrial Reports: M3-1(92), "Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders: 1982-1992."




Total Manufacturing

Three Month Moving Averages




