# Current Industrial Reports

Figures in text, other than year to date, are in seasonally adjusted current dollars and exclude data for semiconductor manufacturing.

## **Summary**

New orders for manufactured goods in April decreased \$9.4 billion or 2.9 percent to \$320.0 billion, the Department of Commerce, Census Bureau reported today. This was the largest percent decline since November 2001. This followed a 2.1 percent March increase. Year to date, new orders for 2003 were 2.9 percent above the same period a year ago.

Shipments decreased \$7.1 billion or 2.2 percent to \$320.6 billion. This was the largest percent decline since February 2002. This followed a 1.6 percent March increase. Year to date, shipments for 2003 were 2.2 percent above the same period a year ago.

Unfilled orders decreased \$0.6 billion or 0.1 percent to \$477.4 billion, following a 0.4 percent March increase. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio was 4.03, up from 4.01 in March.

Inventories increased \$0.1 billion to \$432.6 billion, following a 0.2 percent March decrease. The inventories-to-shipments ratio, the highest since March 2002, was 1.35, up from 1.32 in March.

#### **New Orders**

New orders for manufactured durable goods in April decreased \$3.9 billion or 2.3 percent to \$169.1 billion, revised from the previously published 2.4 percent decrease.

Transportation equipment had the largest decrease, \$2.7 billion or 5.1 percent to \$49.7 billion, led by defense aircraft and parts, which decreased by \$1.5 billion. Machinery decreased \$1.1 billion or 4.7 percent to \$21.7 billion.

New orders for manufactured nondurable goods decreased \$5.5 billion or 3.5 percent to \$150.8 billion.

# **Shipments**

Shipments of manufactured durable goods in April decreased \$1.6 billion or 0.9 percent to \$169.8 billion, revised from the previously published 0.7 percent decrease.

Transportation equipment had the largest decrease, \$1.5 billion or 2.9 percent to \$49.7 billion. This decline was led by nondefense aircraft and parts, which decreased by \$0.7 billion, and light trucks and utility vehicles, which decreased by \$0.6 billion.

Shipments of manufactured nondurable goods decreased \$5.5 billion or 3.5 percent to \$150.8 billion. This was the largest percent decline since February 2002. Petroleum and coal products had the largest decrease, \$4.6 billion or 19.3 percent to \$19.0 billion.

## **Unfilled Orders**

Unfilled orders for manufactured durable goods in April decreased \$0.6 billion or 0.1 percent to \$477.4 billion, revised from the previously published 0.3 percent decrease.

Machinery, down twenty-nine of the past thirty-one months, had the largest decrease, \$0.4 billion or 0.9 percent to \$44.6 billion.

## **Inventories**

Inventories of manufactured durable goods in April decreased \$0.3 billion or 0.1 percent to \$263.2 billion, unrevised from the previously published 0.1 percent decrease. This was the twenty-sixth decrease over the past twenty-seven months.

Computers and electronic products, down eight of the last nine months, had the largest decrease, \$0.6 billion or 1.5 percent to \$39.9 billion.

Inventories of manufactured nondurable goods, at the down nine of the last eleven months, increased \$0.5 billion or 0.3 percent to \$169.5 billion. Plastics and rubber products had the largest increase, \$0.2 billion or 1.2 percent to \$18.4 billion. Beverage and tobacco products also increased \$0.2 billion.

By stage of fabrication, April materials and supplies decreased 0.7 percent in durable goods and increased 0.4 percent in nondurable goods. Work in process increased 0.8 percent in durable goods and decreased 0.5 percent in nondurable goods. Finished goods decreased 0.7 percent in durable goods and increased 0.5 percent in nondurable goods.

With the cooperation of the Semiconductor Industry Association and many of its member companies, the Census Bureau will again be able to publish shipments data on this important sector of our economy. The Census Bureau will not publish orders data and will only publish inventory data at higher level aggregates. The first monthly press release which will contain the semiconductor data is the July advance report on durable goods to be issued on August 26. However, historic data up through June 2003 for all data series will be released, along with benchmark revisions, on August 19, 2003.

# **Survey Description**

This report is compiled from results of the U.S. Census Bureau's Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) survey. This survey provides statistics on manufacturers' value of shipments, new orders (net of cancellations), end-ofmonth order backlog (unfilled orders), end-of-month total inventory (at current cost or market value), and inventories by stage of fabrication (materials and supplies, work-in-process, and finished goods). The M3 includes approximately 3,500 reporting units. Units may be divisions of diversified large companies, large homogenous companies, or singleunit manufacturers in 89 industry categories. Due to the small monthly sample, these 89 categories have been combined into 59 publication levels. The survey methodology assumes that the month-to-month changes of the total operations of those companies in the monthly survey effectively represent the monthto-month movements of all establishments that make up the category. The current coverage levels in the survey show that reported data in the monthly survey represent approximately 60 percent of the shipments estimates at the total manufacturing level. Data published represent manufacturing in a calendar month. The data collection is based on a voluntary survey authorized by Title 13 of the United States Code.

The data presented in this release are based on data obtained from a panel of 3,500 reporting units and provide an indication of the activity within the manufacturing sector. The results differ from what would be obtained from a complete enumeration of all manufacturing companies. In addition, a different panel of 3,500 companies would yield different results. The M3 panel is comprised of companies with \$500 million or more in shipments and a limited number of smaller companies. From a statistical perspective, the panel is not a probability sample; therefore, the sampling errors that are normally provided with sample surveys cannot be measured. Nonsampling errors are attributable to many sources. The use of company or divisional reports to estimate the monthly change for establishments is one source of nonsampling error. The use of primarily large companies to represent the month-to-month movement of all companies is another potential source.
