

# **Summary**

New orders for manufactured goods in January, at the highest level since May 2001, increased \$6.6 billion or 2.1 percent to \$327.1 billion, the Department of Commerce, Census Bureau reported today. This followed a 0.3 percent December increase.

Shipments, also at the highest level since May 2001, increased \$7.1 billion or 2.2 percent to \$328.1 billion. This followed a 0.6 percent December decrease.

Unfilled orders, down five consecutive months, decreased \$1.0 billion or 0.2 percent to \$476.4 billion, following a 0.1 percent December decrease. This was the lowest level since September 1996. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio was 3.92, down from 4.05 in December.

Inventories decreased \$0.1 billion to \$430.8 billion, following a 0.6 percent December increase. The inventories-to-shipments ratio was 1.31, down from 1.34 in December.

#### **New Orders**

New orders for manufactured durable goods in January increased \$4.9 billion or 2.9 percent to \$174.0 billion, revised from the previously published 3.3 percent increase.

Transportation equipment had the largest increase, \$2.4 billion or 5.0 percent to \$51.2 billion, due to motor vehicle bodies, parts, and trailers, which increased by \$2.3 billion. Machinery increased \$0.9 billion or 4.4 percent to \$22.7 billion.

New orders for manufactured nondurable goods increased \$1.8 billion or 1.2 percent to \$153.1 billion.

## **Shipments**

Shipments of manufactured durable goods in January increased \$5.3 billion or 3.2 percent to \$175.1 billion, revised from the previously published 3.5 percent increase.

Transportation equipment had the largest increase, \$3.7 billion or 7.6 percent to \$52.0 billion, due to motor vehicle bodies, parts, and trailers, which increased by \$2.5 billion. Transportation equipment had the largest percent increase since May 2001. Computers and electronic products, with the largest percent increase since January 2000, increased \$1.2 billion or 4.5 percent to \$26.8 billion.

Shipments of manufactured nondurable goods increased \$1.8 billion or 1.2 percent to \$153.1 billion. Petroleum and coal products had the largest increase, \$1.0 billion or 5.0 percent to \$21.3 billion, due to petroleum refineries, which increased \$1.0 billion. Basic chemicals increased \$0.6 billion or 1.6 percent to \$36.6 billion.

#### **Unfilled Orders**

Unfilled orders for manufactured durable goods in January, down five consecutive months, decreased \$1.0 billion or 0.2 percent to \$476.4 billion, unrevised from the previously published 0.2 percent decrease. This was the lowest level since September 1996.

Transportation equipment had the largest decrease, \$0.8 billion or 0.3 percent to \$247.3 billion. Fabricated metal products, at the lowest level since February 1997, decreased \$0.2 billion or 0.5 percent to \$37.6 billion.

#### **Inventories**

Inventories of manufactured durable goods in January decreased \$0.5 billion or 0.2 percent to \$264.7 billion, revised from the previously published 0.1 percent decrease. This was the twenty-third decrease over the past twenty-four months.

Computers and electronic products, at the lowest level since July 1994, had the largest decrease, \$0.6 billion or 1.3 percent to \$41.7 billion. Machinery decreased \$0.2 billion or 0.5 percent to \$44.5 billion, led by turbines, generators, and other power transmission equipment, which decreased \$0.1 billion.

Inventories of manufactured nondurable goods increased \$0.4 billion or 0.2 percent to \$166.1 billion. Petroleum and coal products had the largest increase, \$0.4 billion or 2.8 percent to \$14.0 billion, due to petroleum refineries, which increased \$0.4 billion.

By stage of fabrication, January materials and supplies decreased 0.4 percent in durable goods and increased 1.9 percent in nondurable goods. Work in process increased slightly in durable goods and 0.3 percent in nondurable goods. Finished goods decreased 0.2 percent in durable goods and 0.9 percent in nondurable goods.

Effective with this release there are some minor changes to the publication. Year-to-date comparisons in the text are based on the sum of data that has not been seasonally adjusted. On tables 1, 2, and 5 the percent change column that compared same month current year over prior year has been removed. A new column now shows percent change of year-to-date data for shipments and new orders. Table 5 still shows the same month year over year for unfilled orders and inventories.

One major component of survey error is nonsampling error, which includes errors of coverage, response, and nonreporting. Since the survey panel is not a probability sample, estimates of sampling error cannot be calculated. # **Survey Description**

This report is compiled from results of the U.S. Census Bureau's Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) survey. This survey provides statistics on manufacturers' value of shipments, new orders (net of cancellations), end-ofmonth order backlog (unfilled orders), end-of-month total inventory (at current cost or market value), and inventories by stage of fabrication (materials and supplies, work-in-process, and finished goods). The M3 includes approximately 3,500 reporting units. Units may be divisions of diversified large companies, large homogenous companies, or singleunit manufacturers in 89 industry categories. Due to the small monthly sample, these 89 categories have been combined into 59 publication levels. The survey methodology assumes that the month-to-month changes of the total operations of those companies in the monthly survey effectively represent the monthto-month movements of all establishments that make up the category. The current coverage levels in the survey show that reported data in the monthly survey represent approximately 60 percent of the shipments estimates at the total manufacturing level. Data published represent manufacturing in a calendar month. The data collection is based on a voluntary survey authorized by Title 13 of the United States Code.

The data presented in this release are based on data obtained from a panel of 3,500 reporting units and provide an indication of the activity within the manufacturing sector. The results differ from what would be obtained from a complete enumeration of all manufacturing companies. In addition, a different panel of 3,500 companies would yield different results. The M3 panel is comprised of companies with \$500 million or more in shipments and a limited number of smaller companies. From a statistical perspective, the panel is not a probability sample; therefore, the sampling errors that are normally provided with sample surveys cannot be measured. Nonsampling errors are attributable to many sources. The use of company or divisional reports to estimate the monthly change for establishments is one source of nonsampling error. The use of primarily large companies to represent the month-to-month movement of all companies is another potential source.
