

## **Summary**

New orders for manufactured goods in September increased \$1.7 billion or 0.5 percent to \$331.1 billion, the Department of Commerce, Census Bureau reported today. This is the fourth increase in the last five months and follows a 0.3 percent August decrease. Year to date, new orders for 2003 were 2.5 percent above the same period a year ago.

Shipments increased \$4.5 billion or 1.4 percent to \$336.2 billion. This is the fourth increase in the last five months and follows a 1.7 percent August decrease. Year to date, shipments for 2003 were 1.8 percent above the same period a year ago.

Unfilled orders, up seven of the past eight months, increased \$0.7 billion or 0.1 percent to \$490.8 billion. This followed a 0.8 percent August increase. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio was 4.00, down from 4.09 in August.

Inventories, down five consecutive months, decreased \$1.9 billion or 0.4 percent to \$437.8 billion, following a 0.3 percent August decrease. This was the lowest level since July 1997. The inventories-to-shipments ratio was 1.30, down from 1.33 in August.

#### **New Orders**

New orders for manufactured durable goods in September, up four of the last five months, increased \$1.9 billion or 1.1 percent to \$176.8 billion, revised from the previously published \$176.3 billion.

Computers and electronic products, up five consecutive months, had the largest increase, \$1.1 billion or 3.6 percent to \$31.8 billion.

New orders for manufactured nondurable goods decreased \$0.3 billion or 0.2 percent to \$154.2 billion.

#### **Shipments**

Shipments of manufactured durable goods in September, up four of the last five months, increased \$4.8 billion or 2.7 percent to \$182.0 billion, revised from the previously published \$181.6 billion.

Transportation equipment had the largest increase, \$3.1 billion or 6.2 percent to \$53.0 billion, led by light trucks and utility vehicles, which increased \$1.0 billion. This was the largest percent increase in transportation equipment since April 2002.

Shipments of manufactured nondurable goods decreased \$0.3 billion or 0.2 percent to \$154.2 billion. Petroleum and coal products had the largest decrease, \$0.8 billion or 3.9 percent to \$20.0 billion.

#### **Unfilled Orders**

Unfilled orders of manufactured durable goods in September, up seven of the past eight months, increased \$0.7 billion or 0.1 percent to \$490.8 billion, revised from the previously published \$490.7 billion.

Computers and electronic products, up five consecutive months, had the largest increase, \$1.9 billion or 1.5 percent to \$127.2 billion. This was the largest percent increase in computers and electronic products since June 2000. Transportation equipment decreased \$1.6 billion or 0.7 percent to \$246.3 billion.

#### **Inventories**

Inventories of manufactured durable goods in September, at the lowest level since April 1995, decreased \$1.8 billion or 0.7 percent to \$261.2 billion, revised from the previously published \$261.3 billion. This was the thirty-first decrease over the past thirty-two months.

Primary metals, down seven consecutive months and at the lowest level since February 1992, had the largest decrease, \$0.4 billion or 2.3 percent to \$17.4 billion, led by iron and steel mills, which decreased \$0.4 billion.

Inventories of manufactured nondurable goods decreased slightly to \$176.6 billion. Basic chemicals had the largest decrease, \$0.2 billion or 0.4 percent to \$52.7 billion.

By stage of fabrication, September materials and supplies decreased 0.7 percent in durable goods and increased 1.1 percent in nondurable goods. Work in process decreased 1.1 percent in both durable goods and nondurable goods. Finished goods decreased 0.2 percent in durable goods and 0.4 percent in nondurable goods.

### **Survey Description**

This report is compiled from results of the U.S. Census Bureau's Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) survey. This survey provides statistics on manufacturers' value of shipments, new orders (net of cancellations), end-ofmonth order backlog (unfilled orders), end-of-month total inventory (at current cost or market value), and inventories by stage of fabrication (materials and supplies, work-in-process, and finished goods). The M3 includes approximately 3,500 reporting units. Units may be divisions of diversified large companies, large homogenous companies, or singleunit manufacturers in 89 industry categories. Due to the small monthly sample, these 89 categories have been combined into 59 publication levels. The survey methodology assumes that the month-to-month changes of the total operations of those companies in the monthly survey effectively represent the monthto-month movements of all establishments that make up the category. The current coverage levels in the survey show that reported data in the monthly survey represent approximately 60 percent of the shipments estimates at the total manufacturing level. Data published represent manufacturing in a calendar month. The data collection is based on a voluntary survey authorized by Title 13 of the United States Code.

The data presented in this release are based on data obtained from a panel of 3,500 reporting units and provide an indication of the activity within the manufacturing sector. The results differ from what would be obtained from a complete enumeration of all manufacturing companies. In addition, a different panel of 3,500 companies would yield different results. The M3 panel is comprised of companies with \$500 million or more in shipments and a limited number of smaller companies. From a statistical perspective, the panel is not a probability sample; therefore, the sampling errors that are normally provided with sample surveys cannot be measured. Nonsampling errors are attributable to many sources. The use of company or divisional reports to estimate the monthly change for establishments is one source of nonsampling error. The use of primarily large companies to represent the month-to-month movement of all companies is another potential source.
