


# Summary

New orders for manufactured goods in April decreased \$6.3 billion or 1.7 percent to \$356.9 billion, the Department of Commerce, Census Bureau reported today. This followed a 5.0 percent March increase.

Shipments, down three of the last four months, decreased \$1.7 billion or 0.5 percent to \$361.2 billion. This followed a 4.2 percent March increase.

Unfilled orders, up eight of the last nine months, increased \$2.7 billion or 0.5 percent to \$520.3 billion. This followed a 1.4 percent March increase. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio was 3.95, up from 3.90 in March.

Inventories, up five consecutive months, increased \$1.6 billion or 0.4 percent to \$446.2 billion. This followed a 0.4 percent March increase. The inventories-to-shipments ratio was 1.24, up from 1.22 in March.

#### **New Orders**

New orders for manufactured durable goods in April decreased \$6.4 billion or 3.2 percent to \$191.0 billion, revised from the previously published \$5.7 billion decrease.

Transportation equipment, down following two consecutive increases, had the largest decrease, \$2.7 billion or 4.8 percent to \$54.5 billion. Computers and electronic products, down following four consecutive increases, decreased \$1.4 billion or 4.2 percent to \$31.7 billion, due to electromedical, measuring, and control instruments.

New orders for manufactured nondurable goods, increased \$0.1 billion to \$165.9 billion.

### **Shipments**

Shipments of manufactured durable goods in April, down following two consecutive increases, decreased \$1.8 billion or 0.9 percent to \$195.3 billion, revised from the previously published \$1.7 billion decrease.

Transportation equipment had the largest decrease, \$2.2 billion or 3.9 percent to \$54.0 billion.

Shipments of manufactured nondurable goods, up seven of the last eight months, increased \$0.1 billion to \$165.9 billion. Food products had the largest increase, \$0.9 billion or 2.3 percent to \$39.9 billion and was at the highest level since the series began in 1992.

### **Unfilled Orders**

Unfilled orders of manufactured durable goods in April, up eight of the last nine months, increased \$2.7 billion or 0.5 percent to \$520.3 billion, revised from the previously published \$3.0 billion increase.

Fabricated metal products, up nine consecutive months, had the largest increase, \$1.3 billion or 3.0 percent to \$44.2 billion.

#### **Inventories**

Inventories of manufactured durable goods in April, up five consecutive months, increased \$1.2 billion or 0.5 percent to \$266.8 billion, revised from the previously published \$1.3 billion increase.

Computers and electronic products, up four of the last seven months, had the largest increase, \$0.4 billion or 0.8 percent to \$47.6 billion.

Inventories of manufactured nondurable goods, up four consecutive months, increased \$0.4 billion or 0.2 percent to \$179.4 billion. Basic chemicals, up four consecutive months, had the largest increase, \$0.3 billion or 0.6 percent to \$55.3 billion. Basic chemicals was at the highest level since the series began.

By stage of fabrication, April materials and supplies increased 1.5 percent in durable goods and 0.2 percent in nondurable goods. Work in process increased 0.3 percent in durable goods and 0.7 percent in nondurable goods. Finished goods decreased 0.4 percent in durable goods and increased 0.1 percent in nondurable goods.

## **Survey Description**

This report is compiled from results of the U.S. Census Bureau's Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) survey. This survey provides statistics on manufacturers' value of shipments, new orders (net of cancellations), end-ofmonth order backlog (unfilled orders), end-of-month total inventory (at current cost or market value), and inventories by stage of fabrication (materials and supplies, work-in-process, and finished goods). The M3 includes approximately 3,500 reporting units. Units may be divisions of diversified large companies, large homogenous companies, or singleunit manufacturers in 89 industry categories. Due to the small monthly sample, these 89 categories have been combined into 59 publication levels. The survey methodology assumes that the month-to-month changes of the total operations of those companies in the monthly survey effectively represent the monthto-month movements of all establishments that make up the category. The current coverage levels in the survey show that reported data in the monthly survey represent approximately 60 percent of the shipments estimates at the total manufacturing level. Data published represent manufacturing in a calendar month. The data collection is based on a voluntary survey authorized by Title 13 of the United States Code.

The data presented in this release are based on data obtained from a panel of 3,500 reporting units and provide an indication of the activity within the manufacturing sector. The results differ from what would be obtained from a complete enumeration of all manufacturing companies. In addition, a different panel of 3,500 companies would yield different results. The M3 panel is comprised of companies with \$500 million or more in shipments and a limited number of smaller companies. From a statistical perspective, the panel is not a probability sample; therefore, the sampling errors that are normally provided with sample surveys cannot be measured. Nonsampling errors are attributable to many sources. The use of company or divisional reports to estimate the monthly change for establishments is one source of nonsampling error. The use of primarily large companies to represent the month-to-month movement of all companies is another potential source.
