


Current Industrial Reports Figures in text, other than year-to-date, are in seasonally adjusted current dollars. Figures on new and unfilled orders exclude data for semiconductor manufacturing.

Summary

New orders for manufactured goods in November, up six of the last seven months, increased \$4.5 billion or 1.2 percent to \$377.4 billion, the Department of Commerce, Census Bureau reported today. This followed a 0.9 percent October increase.

Shipments, up six of the last seven months, increased \$1.6 billion or 0.4 percent to \$379.0 billion. This was at the highest level since the series was first stated on a NAICS basis in 1992 and followed a 1.6 percent October increase.

Unfilled orders, up fifteen of the last sixteen months, increased \$5.8 billion or 1.1 percent to \$548.8 billion. This followed a 0.5 percent October increase. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio was 4.02, up from 3.95 in October.

Inventories, up twelve consecutive months, increased \$3.3 billion or 0.7 percent to \$469.7 billion. This followed a 0.9 percent October increase. The inventories-to-shipments ratio was unchanged at 1.24.

New Orders

New orders for manufactured durable goods in November increased \$2.7 billion or 1.4 percent to \$198.2 billion, revised from the previously published \$3.1 billion increase.

Transportation equipment had the largest increase, \$4.6 billion or 8.8 percent to \$57.3 billion, due to nondefense aircraft and parts which increased \$3.8 billion.

New orders for manufactured nondurable goods increased \$1.8 billion or 1.0 percent to \$179.2 billion.

Shipments

Shipments of manufactured durable goods in November decreased \$0.2 billion or 0.1 percent to \$199.8 billion, revised from the previously published \$0.5 billion decrease.

Machinery, down following two consecutive increases, had the largest decrease, \$1.1 billion or 4.1 percent to \$25.0 billion. Transportation equipment decreased \$0.5 billion or 0.9 percent to \$52.7 billion.

Shipments of manufactured nondurable goods, up seven of the last nine months, increased \$1.8 billion or 1.0 percent to \$179.2 billion. This was at the highest level since the series began in 1992. Basic chemicals, up seven of the last nine months, had the largest increase, \$0.8 billion or 1.8 percent to \$44.3 billion. This was also at the highest level since the series began in 1992.

Unfilled Orders

Unfilled orders of manufactured durable goods in November, up fifteen of the last sixteen months, increased \$5.8 billion or 1.1 percent to \$548.8 billion, revised from the previously published \$6.8 billion increase. This followed a 0.5 percent October increase.

Transportation equipment, up following three consecutive decreases, had the largest increase, \$4.6 billion or 1.8 percent to \$262.4 billion. This was at the highest level since June 2001 and followed a 0.2 percent October decrease.

Inventories

Inventories of manufactured durable goods in November, up twelve consecutive months, increased \$2.2 billion or 0.8 percent to \$282.3 billion, revised from the previously published \$2.7 billion increase.

Transportation equipment, up two consecutive months, had the largest increase, \$1.2 billion or 1.7 percent to \$69.9 billion. Machinery, up twelve consecutive months, increased \$0.5 billion or 1.2 percent to \$45.5 billion.

Inventories of manufactured nondurable goods, up ten of the last eleven months, increased \$1.1 billion or 0.6 percent to \$187.4 billion. Petroleum and coal products had the largest increase, \$0.5 billion or 2.7 percent to \$18.9 billion. This was at the highest level since the series began in 1992.

By stage of fabrication, November materials and supplies increased 0.9 percent in durable goods and decreased slightly in nondurable goods. Work in process increased 1.1 percent in durable goods and 0.2 percent in nondurable goods. Finished goods increased 0.2 percent in durable goods and 1.1 percent in nondurable goods.

One major component of survey error is nonsampling error, which includes errors of coverage, response, and nonreporting. Since the survey panel is not a probability sample, estimates of sampling error cannot be calculated. Further details on survey design, methodology, and data limitations are contained in our most recent annual benchmark publication, Current Industrial Reports: M3-1(02), "Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders: 1992-2002."

Survey Description

This report is compiled from results of the U.S. Census Bureau's Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) survey. This survey provides statistics on manufacturers' value of shipments, new orders (net of cancellations), end-ofmonth order backlog (unfilled orders), end-of-month total inventory (at current cost or market value), and inventories by stage of fabrication (materials and supplies, work-in-process, and finished goods). The M3 includes approximately 4,000 reporting units. Units may be divisions of diversified large companies, large homogenous companies, or singleunit manufacturers in 89 industry categories. Due to the small monthly sample, these 89 categories have been combined into 59 publication levels. The survey methodology assumes that the month-tomonth changes of the total operations of those companies in the monthly survey effectively represent the month-to-month movements of all establishments that make up the category. The current coverage levels in the survey show that reported data in the monthly survey represent approximately 60 percent of the shipments estimates at the total manufacturing level. Data published represent manufacturing in a calendar month. The data collection is based on a voluntary survey authorized by Title 13 of the United States Code.

The data presented in this release are based on data obtained from a panel of 4,000 reporting units and provide an indication of the activity within the manufacturing sector. The results differ from what would be obtained from a complete enumeration of all manufacturing companies. In addition, a different panel of 4,000 companies would yield different results. The M3 panel is comprised of companies with \$500 million or more in shipments and a limited number of smaller companies. From a statistical perspective, the panel is not a probability sample; therefore, the sampling errors that are normally provided with sample surveys cannot be measured. Nonsampling errors are attributable to many sources. The use of company or divisional reports to estimate the monthly change for establishments is one source of nonsampling error. The use of primarily large companies to represent the month-to-month movement of all companies is another potential source.
