## Full Report on Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories and Orders July 2005

#### **Summary**

New orders for manufactured goods in July decreased \$7.5 billion or 1.9 percent to \$387.8 billion, the U.S. Census Bureau reported today. This was the largest percent decrease in fifteen months and followed a 0.9 percent increase.

Shipments, up for the third consecutive month, increased \$2.9 billion or 0.7 percent to \$389.3 billion. This was at the highest level since the series was first stated on a NAICS basis in 1992 and followed a slight increase in June.

Unfilled orders, up for the third consecutive month, increased \$5.7 billion or 1.0 percent to \$580.5 billion. This was at the highest level since the series began and followed a 2.8 percent June increase. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio was 4.16, up from 4.09 in June.

Inventories, up eighteen of the last nineteen months, increased \$2.3 billion or 0.5 percent to \$463.8 billion. This followed a 0.1 percent June increase. The inventories-to-shipments ratio was unchanged at 1.19.

#### **New Orders**

New orders for manufactured durable goods in July, down following three consecutive monthly increases, decreased \$10.6 billion or 4.9 percent to \$204.7 billion, unchanged from the previously published 4.9 percent decrease. This followed a 1.9 percent June increase.

Transportation equipment, down for the second consecutive month, had the largest decrease, \$5.9 billion or 8.8 percent to \$61.9 billion.

New orders for manufactured nondurable goods increased \$3.1 billion or 1.7 percent to \$183.1 billion.

#### **Shipments**

Shipments of manufactured durable goods in July, down following two consecutive monthly increases, decreased \$0.2 billion or 0.1 percent to \$206.3 billion, unchanged from the previously published 0.1 percent decrease. This followed a 0.2 percent June increase.

Fabricated metal products, down for the second consecutive month, had the largest decrease, \$0.3 billion or 1.3 percent to \$23.6 billion.

Shipments of manufactured nondurable goods increased \$3.1 billion or 1.7 percent to \$183.1 billion, led by petroleum and coal products, which increased \$1.8 billion or 5.6 percent to \$33.9 billion. Chemical products also increased \$1.6 billion or 3.5 percent to \$46.4 billion. Shipments of manufactured nondurable goods were at the highest level since the series began.

#### **Unfilled Orders**

Unfilled orders for manufactured durable goods in July, up for the third consecutive month, increased \$5.7 billion or 1.0 percent to \$580.5 billion, unchanged from the previously published 1.0 percent increase. This was at the highest level since the series began and followed a 2.8 percent June increase.

Transportation equipment, up for the third consecutive month, had the largest increase, \$4.7 billion or 1.7 percent to \$290.0 billion. This was at the highest level since the series began.

#### **Inventories**

Inventories of manufactured durable goods in July, up seventeen of the last eighteen months, increased \$1.7 billion or 0.6 percent to \$282.2 billion, unchanged from the previously published 0.6 percent increase. This followed a 0.4 percent June decrease.

Machinery, up nineteen of the last twenty months, had the largest increase, \$0.7 billion or 1.5 percent to \$47.2 billion.

Inventories of manufactured nondurable goods, up six of the last seven months, increased \$0.6 billion or 0.4 percent to \$181.6 billion. This was at the highest level since the series began and was due to petroleum and coal products, which increased \$1.3 billion or 5.8 percent to \$24.2 billion.

By stage of fabrication, July materials and supplies decreased 0.3 percent in durable goods and 0.2 percent in nondurable goods. Work in process increased 1.6 percent in durable goods and decreased 0.1 percent in nondurable goods. Finished goods increased 0.5 percent in durable goods and 0.9 percent in nondurable goods.

Figures in text, other than year-to-date, are in seasonally adjusted current dollars. Figures on new and unfilled orders exclude data for semiconductor manufacturing. #### **Survey Description**

This report is compiled from results of the U.S. Census Bureau's Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) survey. This survey provides statistics on manufacturers' value of shipments, new orders (net of cancellations), end-ofmonth order backlog (unfilled orders), end-of-month total inventory (at current cost or market value), and inventories by stage of fabrication (materials and supplies, work-in-process, and finished goods). The M3 includes approximately 4,000 reporting units. Units may be divisions of diversified large companies, large homogenous companies, or singleunit manufacturers in 89 industry categories. Due to the small monthly sample, these 89 categories have been combined into 59 publication levels. The survey methodology assumes that the month-to-month changes of the total operations of those companies in the monthly survey effectively represent the monthto-month movements of all establishments that make up the category. The current coverage levels in the survey show that reported data in the monthly survey represent approximately 60 percent of the shipments estimates at the total manufacturing level. Data published represent manufacturing in a calendar month. The data collection is based on a voluntary survey authorized by Title 13 of the United States Code.

The data presented in this release are based on data obtained from a panel of 4,000 reporting units and provide an indication of the activity within the manufacturing sector. The results differ from what would be obtained from a complete enumeration of all manufacturing companies. In addition, a different panel of 4,000 companies would yield different results. The M3 panel is comprised of companies with \$500 million or more in shipments and a limited number of smaller companies. From a statistical perspective, the panel is not a probability sample; therefore, the sampling errors that are normally provided with sample surveys cannot be measured. Nonsampling errors are attributable to many sources. The use of company or divisional reports to estimate the monthly change for establishments is one source of nonsampling error. The use of primarily large companies to represent the month-to-month movement of all companies is another potential source.
