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## Full Report on Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories and Orders June 2005

## **Summary**

New orders for manufactured goods in June increased \$3.9 billion or 1.0 percent to \$400.5 billion, the U.S. Census Bureau reported today. This was at the highest level since the series was first stated on a NAICS basis in 1992 and followed a 3.6 percent May increase.

Shipments, down following three consecutive monthly increases, decreased \$0.4 billion or 0.1 percent to \$391.8 billion. This followed a 0.3 percent May increase.

Unfilled orders, up for the second consecutive month, increased \$15.8 billion or 2.8 percent to \$580.7 billion. This was at the highest level since the series began and followed a 2.1 percent May increase. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio was 4.05, up from 3.93 in May.

Inventories, down for the third consecutive month, decreased \$0.1 billion to \$483.4 billion. This followed a 0.2 percent May decrease. The inventories-to-shipments ratio was unchanged at 1.23.

#### **New Orders**

New orders for manufactured durable goods in June, up three consecutive months, increased \$4.2 billion or 2.0 percent to \$216.7 billion, revised from the previously published 1.4 percent increase. This followed a 6.4 percent May increase.

Computers and electronic products, up four of the last five months, had the largest increase, \$3.8 billion or 10.8 percent to \$38.9 billion. This was led by communications equipment, which increased \$2.1 billion.

New orders for manufactured nondurable goods decreased \$0.3 billion or 0.2 percent to \$183.9 billion.

#### **Shipments**

Shipments of manufactured durable goods in June, down following three consecutive monthly increases, decreased \$0.1 billion to \$208.0 billion, revised from the previously published 0.1 percent decrease. This followed a 0.2 percent May increase.

Machinery, down following two consecutive monthly increases, had the largest decrease, \$0.2 billion or 0.9 percent to \$26.1 billion.

Shipments of manufactured nondurable goods decreased \$0.3 billion or 0.2 percent to \$183.9 billion, due to basic chemicals, which decreased \$0.5 billion or 1.0 percent to \$43.9 billion.

#### **Unfilled Orders**

Unfilled orders for manufactured durable goods in June, up for the second consecutive month, increased \$15.8 billion or 2.8 percent to \$580.7 billion, revised from the previously published 2.6 percent increase. This was at the highest level since the series began and followed a 2.1 percent May increase.

Transportation equipment, up for the second consecutive month, had the largest increase, \$10.3 billion or 3.8 percent to \$279.4 billion.

#### **Inventories**

Inventories of manufactured durable goods in June, down two of the last three months, decreased \$1.0 billion or 0.3 percent to \$290.9 billion, unchanged from the previously published 0.3 percent decrease. This followed a slight May increase.

Transportation equipment, down two of the last three months, had the largest decrease, \$0.5 billion or 0.7 percent to \$71.3 billion.

Inventories of manufactured nondurable goods, up following two consecutive monthly decreases, increased \$0.9 billion or 0.4 percent to \$192.6 billion.

By stage of fabrication, June materials and supplies decreased 0.1 percent in durable goods and 0.2 percent in nondurable goods. Work in process decreased 0.3 percent in durable goods and increased 0.9 percent in nondurable goods. Finished goods decreased 0.6 percent in durable goods and increased 0.7 percent in nondurable goods.

## **Survey Description**

This report is compiled from results of the U.S. Census Bureau's Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) survey. This survey provides statistics on manufacturers' value of shipments, new orders (net of cancellations), end-ofmonth order backlog (unfilled orders), end-of-month total inventory (at current cost or market value), and inventories by stage of fabrication (materials and supplies, work-in-process, and finished goods). The M3 includes approximately 4,000 reporting units. Units may be divisions of diversified large companies, large homogenous companies, or singleunit manufacturers in 89 industry categories. Due to the small monthly sample, these 89 categories have been combined into 59 publication levels. The survey methodology assumes that the month-tomonth changes of the total operations of those companies in the monthly survey effectively represent the month-to-month movements of all establishments that make up the category. The current coverage levels in the survey show that reported data in the monthly survey represent approximately 60 percent of the shipments estimates at the total manufacturing level. Data published represent manufacturing in a calendar month. The data collection is based on a voluntary survey authorized by Title 13 of the United States Code.

The data presented in this release are based on data obtained from a panel of 4,000 reporting units and provide an indication of the activity within the manufacturing sector. The results differ from what would be obtained from a complete enumeration of all manufacturing companies. In addition, a different panel of 4,000 companies would yield different results. The M3 panel is comprised of companies with \$500 million or more in shipments and a limited number of smaller companies. From a statistical perspective, the panel is not a probability sample; therefore, the sampling errors that are normally provided with sample surveys cannot be measured. Nonsampling errors are attributable to many sources. The use of company or divisional reports to estimate the monthly change for establishments is one source of nonsampling error. The use of primarily large companies to represent the month-to-month movement of all companies is another potential source.
