## Full Report on Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories and Orders December 2012

### **Summary**

New orders for manufactured goods in December, up three of the last four months, increased \$8.6 billion or 1.8 percent to \$484.8 billion, the U.S. Census Bureau reported today. This followed a 0.3 percent November decrease. Excluding transportation, new orders increased 0.2 percent.

Shipments, up five of the last six months, increased \$1.8 billion or 0.4 percent to \$484.9 billion. This followed a 0.3 percent November increase.

Unfilled orders, up six of the last seven months, increased \$7.9 billion or 0.8 percent to \$991.7 billion. This followed a slight November increase. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio was 6.12, down from 6.13 in November.

Inventories, up following two consecutive monthly decreases, increased \$0.5 billion or 0.1 percent to \$615.5 billion. This followed a slight November decrease. The inventories-to-shipments ratio was 1.27, unchanged from November.

#### **New Orders**

New orders for manufactured durable goods in December, up seven of the last eight months, increased \$9.4 billion or 4.3 percent to \$230.0 billion, revised from the previously published 4.6 percent increase. This followed a 0.6 percent November increase.

Transportation equipment, up following two consecutive monthly decreases, had the largest increase, \$7.9 billion or 11.7 percent to \$75.6 billion.

New orders for manufactured nondurable goods decreased \$0.8 billion or 0.3 percent to \$254.8 billion.

#### **Shipments**

Shipments of manufactured durable goods in December, up five of the last six months, increased \$2.6 billion or 1.1 percent to \$230.1 billion, revised from the previously published 1.3 percent increase. This followed a 1.8 percent November increase.

Primary metals, up three of the last four months, had

the largest increase, \$1.2 billion or 4.0 percent to \$30.5 billion.

Shipments of manufactured nondurable goods, down two consecutive months, decreased \$0.8 billion or 0.3 percent to \$254.8 billion. This followed a 1.0 percent November decrease. Beverage and tobacco products, down following two consecutive monthly increases, led the decrease, down \$0.5 billion or 4.3 percent to \$12.2 billion.

#### **Unfilled Orders**

Unfilled orders for manufactured durable goods in December, up six of the last seven months, increased \$7.9 billion or 0.8 percent to \$991.7 billion, unchanged from the previously published increase. This followed a slight November increase.

Transportation equipment, also up six of the last seven months, drove the increase, up \$9.0 billion or 1.5 percent to \$588.6 billion.

#### **Inventories**

Inventories of manufactured durable goods in December, down following fourteen consecutive monthly increases, decreased \$0.1 billion to \$374.5 billion, unchanged from the previously published increase. This followed a 0.1 percent November increase.

Machinery, down four consecutive months, drove the decrease, down \$0.4 billion or 0.5 percent to \$66.1 billion.

Inventories of manufactured nondurable goods, up following two consecutive monthly decreases, increased \$0.6 billion or 0.2 percent to \$241.0 billion. This followed a 0.3 percent November decrease. Chemical products, up three of the last four months, drove the increase, up \$0.6 billion or 0.8 percent to \$72.2 billion.

By stage of fabrication, December materials and supplies decreased 0.3 percent in durable goods and increased 0.4 percent in nondurable goods. Work in process increased 0.4 percent in durable goods and decreased 0.9 percent in nondurable goods. Finished goods decreased 0.3 percent in durable goods and increased 0.6 percent in nondurable goods.

## **Survey Description**

This report is compiled from results of the U.S. Census Bureau's Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) survey. This survey provides statistics on manufacturers' value of shipments, new orders (net of cancellations), end-of-month order backlog (unfilled orders), end-of-month total inventory (at current cost or market value), and inventories by stage of fabrication (materials and supplies, work-in-process, and finished goods). The M3 includes approximately 4,300 reporting units. Units may be divisions of diversified large companies, large homogenous companies, or single-unit manufacturers in 89 industry categories. Due to the small monthly sample, these 89 categories have been combined into 65 publication levels. The survey methodology assumes that the month-to-month changes of the total operations of those companies in the monthly survey effectively represent the month-to-month movements of all establishments that make up the category. The current coverage levels in the survey show that reported data in the monthly survey represent approximately 60 percent of the shipments estimates at the total manufacturing level. Data published represent manufacturing in a calendar month. The data collection is based on a voluntary survey authorized by Title 13 of the United States Code.

The data presented in this release are based on data obtained from a panel of 4,300 reporting units and provide an indication of the activity within the manufacturing sector. The results differ from what would be obtained from a complete enumeration of all manufacturing companies. In addition, a different panel of 4,300 companies would yield different results. The M3 panel is comprised of companies with \$500 million or more in shipments and a limited number of smaller companies. From a statistical perspective, the panel is not a probability sample; therefore, the sampling errors that are normally provided with sample surveys cannot be measured. Nonsampling errors are attributable to many sources. The use of company or divisional reports to estimate the monthly change for establishments is one source of nonsampling error. The use of primarily large companies to represent the month-to-month movement of all companies is another potential source. Any corrections will be published in the full report. Corrections received after the full report will be released in the next month's advance report. Any revisions made later than two months will be reflected in the annual benchmark publication.

Revised historical data for Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders will be issued on May 17, 2013. These revisions reflect:

- benchmarking the shipments and inventories data to the 2011 Annual Survey of Manufactures (ASM) data, as well as revised ASM benchmarks for prior years;
- incorporating the unfilled orders to shipments ratios obtained from the 2010/2011 Manufacturers' Unfilled Orders Survey by applying these ratios to the respective ASM shipments data, as well as incorporating revised unfilled orders to shipments ratios for prior years;
- adjusting the new orders data to be consistent with the benchmarked shipments and unfilled orders data;
- correcting monthly data for late receipts, reclassifications of reported data, and revisions to previously reported data;
- migrating the data processing environment from a server having a Linux Red Hat 4 operating system that supports SAS® 9.1.3 to a server having a Linux Red Hat 5 operating system that supports SAS® 9.2; and
- updating the seasonally adjusted data, based on the results of benchmarking and the recent annual review of the seasonal adjustment models.
