

# MONTHLY FULL REPORT ON MANUFACTURERS' SHIPMENTS, INVENTORIES AND ORDERS FEBRUARY 2025

Release Number: CB 25-40 M3-2 (25)-02

**April 2, 2025** — The U.S. Census Bureau announces the February full report on manufacturers' shipments, inventories and orders:





# **Summary**

New orders for manufactured goods in February, up two consecutive months, increased \$3.6 billion or 0.6 percent to \$594.0 billion, the U.S. Census Bureau reported today. This followed a 1.8 percent January increase. Shipments, up four consecutive months, increased \$4.2 billion or 0.7 percent to \$596.8 billion. This followed a 0.5 percent January increase. Unfilled orders, up seven of the last eight months, increased \$2.1 billion or 0.1 percent to \$1,402.7 billion. This followed a 0.2 percent January increase. The unfilled orders-to-shipments ratio was 6.81, down from 6.84 in January. Inventories, up four consecutive months, increased \$1.3 billion or 0.1 percent to \$864.9 billion. This followed a 0.1 percent January increase. The inventories-to-shipments ratio was 1.45, down from 1.46 in January.

### **New Orders**

New orders for manufactured durable goods in February, up two consecutive months, increased \$2.8 billion or 1.0 percent to \$289.4 billion, up from the previously published 0.9 percent increase. This followed a 3.4 percent January increase. Transportation equipment, also up two consecutive months, led the increase, \$1.5 billion or 1.5 percent to \$98.4 billion. New orders for manufactured nondurable goods increased \$0.8 billion or 0.3 percent to \$304.5 billion.

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# Shipments

Shipments of manufactured durable goods in February, up three consecutive months, increased \$3.4 billion or 1.2 percent to \$292.3 billion, unchanged from the previously published increase. This followed a 0.7 percent January increase. Transportation equipment, also up three consecutive months, led the increase, \$2.0 billion or 2.1 percent to \$96.7 billion. Shipments of manufactured nondurable goods, up five consecutive months, increased \$0.8 billion or 0.3 percent to \$304.5 billion. This followed a 0.3 percent January increase. Chemical products, up twelve of the last thirteen months, led the increase, \$0.6 billion or 0.8 percent to \$83.7 billion.

#### **Unfilled Orders**

Unfilled orders for manufactured durable goods in February, up seven of the last eight months, increased \$2.1 billion or 0.1 percent to \$1,402.7 billion, unchanged from the previously published increase. This followed a 0.2 percent January increase. Transportation equipment, also up seven of the last eight months, led the increase, \$1.7 billion or 0.2 percent to \$904.2 billion.

#### **Inventories**

Inventories of manufactured durable goods in February, up four consecutive months, increased \$0.4 billion or 0.1 percent to \$533.0 billion, unchanged from the previously published increase. This followed a virtually unchanged January increase. Transportation equipment, also up four consecutive months, led the increase, \$0.3 billion or 0.2 percent to \$175.2 billion. Inventories of manufactured nondurable goods, up four consecutive months, increased \$0.9 billion or 0.3 percent to \$331.8 billion. This followed a 0.2 percent January increase. Petroleum and coal products, also up four consecutive months, led the increase, \$0.4 billion or 0.9 percent to \$48.9 billion. By stage of fabrication, February materials and supplies increased 0.2 percent in durable goods and 0.8 percent in nondurable goods. Work in process decreased 0.3 percent in durable goods and increased 0.2 percent in nondurable goods. Finished goods increased 0.4 percent in durable goods and decreased 0.1 percent in nondurable goods.

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#### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

Figures in text are adjusted for seasonality, but not for inflation. Figures on new and unfilled orders exclude data for semiconductor manufacturing.

"Virtually unchanged" indicates that the change is less than 0.05 percent for a percent increase or decrease.

# Description of the survey

This report is compiled from results of the U.S. Census Bureau's Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) survey, which is a voluntary survey authorized by Title 13 of the United States Code. This survey provides statistics on a calendar-month basis for manufacturers' value of shipments, new orders (net of cancellations), end-of-month order backlog (unfilled orders), end-of-month total inventory (at current cost or market value), and inventories by stage of fabrication (materials and supplies, work-inprocess, and finished goods). Data published from the M3 survey are based on a panel of approximately 5,000 reporting units that represent approximately 3,100 companies and provide an indication of monthto-month change for the Manufacturing Sector. These reporting units may be divisions of diversified large companies, large homogenous companies, or single-unit manufacturers in 92 industry categories, which are combined into 65 publication levels due to the small monthly panel size. The survey methodology assumes that the month-to-month changes of the total operations of the reporting units in the M3 panel effectively represent the month-to-month movements of all establishments that make up the category. The companies for which shipments data are currently reported or imputed in the M3 survey represent approximately 60 percent of the total value of shipments for manufacturing establishments in the 2017 Economic Census, and these companies include roughly 61 percent of the manufacturing companies with \$500 million or more in shipments in the 2017 Economic Census. The companies for which shipments data are currently reported in the M3 survey represent approximately 51 percent of the total value of shipments for manufacturing establishments in the 2017 Economic Census. Statistics based on the M3 panel differ from the results that would be obtained from a complete enumeration of all manufacturing companies. The M3 panel is not based on a probability sample; therefore, the sampling errors that are normally provided with sample surveys cannot be measured. Nonsampling errors are attributable to many

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sources. The use of company or divisional reports to estimate the monthly change for establishments is one source of nonsampling error. The use of primarily large companies to represent the month-to-month movement of all companies is another potential source. Any corrections will be published in the full report. Corrections received after the full report will be released in the next month's advance report. Any revisions made later than two months will be reflected in the annual benchmark publication. # **Special Notice:**

As part of the ongoing effort to improve the Advance Total Manufacturing estimates, beginning with the September 2024 data released on October 25, 2024, the file includes the addition of the Food products and Chemical products early shipments and inventories estimates from the monthly Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories and Orders Survey. These estimates are available on both a seasonally adjusted and not seasonally adjusted basis and are included on the M3 website under the "Latest Monthly Advance report on Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories and Order", Monthly Advance Report on Durable Goods Manufacturers' Shipments Inventories and Orders - Press Releases (census.gov).

#### Benchmark notice:

Revised historical data from the Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) Survey will be issued on May 16, 2025. These revisions result from:

- Benchmarking the M3 shipments and inventories data to the 2022 Economic Census (EC) data on a 2017 NAICS basis, as well as to revised ASM data from 2018 through 2021, resulting from benchmarking the ASM to the 2022 Economic Census;
- Incorporating the unfilled orders to shipments ratios obtained for 2021 and 2022 from the Manufacturers' Unfilled Orders (M3UFO) Survey by applying these ratios to the respective ASM and EC shipments data, as well as incorporating revised unfilled orders to shipments ratios for prior years;
- Adjusting the new orders data to be consistent with the benchmarked shipments and unfilled orders data;
- Correcting monthly data for late receipts, reclassifications of reported data, and revisions to previously reported data;
- Updating the seasonally adjusted data based on the results of benchmarking and the recent annual review of the seasonal adjustment models.

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These revisions will span the seasonally adjusted data for January 2012 through March 2025 and the data not seasonally adjusted for January 2017 through March 2025. An updated Press Release will contain revised monthly tables for January 2025 through March 2025.

Estimates of shipments and new orders are for the duration of the period, while estimates of unfilled orders and total inventories are for the end of the period. Not seasonally adjusted estimates of shipments and new orders are for the duration of the period, while estimates of unfilled orders include adjusted data for non-calendar reporters. Seasonally adjusted estimates include concurrent adjustments for holiday and trading-day differences, where appropriate, as well as seasonal variation, based on the results of the latest annual review of the model parameters. Estimates are not adjusted for price changes.

Estimates and percent changes of shipments for the semiconductor industry are included in computers and electronic products, and all other applicable aggregate totals.

Note: Estimates of manufacturers' shipments, inventories and orders are subject to survey error and revision. One major component of survey error is nonsampling error, which includes errors of coverage, response, and nonreporting. Since the survey panel is not a probability sample, estimates of sampling error cannot be calculated.
