2010 Census AIANSF Subjects

- Same subjects as Summary File 2
 - Age
 - Sex
 - Households
 - Families
 - Relationship
 - Housing Occupancy
 - Tenure
 - Group Quarters
- Census Bureau releases statistics for largest number of American Indian and Alaska Native (AIAN) groups to date

Types of Tables

- “**PCT**” tables – **Population** subjects available down to the **census tract** level (47 PCT tables)
- “**PCO**” tables – **Population** subjects available down to the **county** level (10 PCO tables)
- “**HCT**” tables – **Housing** subjects available down to the **census tract** level (14 HCT tables)

Types of Tables

- “**QT**” tables – **Quick Tables** contain frequently requested information (7 Quick Tables)
- “**DP**” table – **Demographic Profile** contains an overview of multiple topics (1 Table)

Detailed Iteration Groups

1,570 iteration groups, including:

- Total Population
- AIAN Tribal Groupings
- Specific American Indian tribes
- Specific Alaska Native groups

Characteristic Iterations

This appendix lists the 1,570 possible iterations for the American Indian and Alaska Native Tables. The iterations comprise the total population; the total American Indian and Alaska Native population (both alone, and alone-or-in-combination); and 1,567 additional specified American Indian and Alaska Native tribes.

In order for any of the tables (matrices) for a specific group to be shown in this file, the data must meet a minimum population threshold. In general, a national-level population threshold of 100 (based upon 2010 Census counts) was used to determine the eligible set of American Indian tribes and Alaska Native villages selected for the iterations list. In order for the data tables to be shown for a specific tribe or tribal grouping in a particular geography, there had to be at least 100 people in that tribe or tribal grouping, in that geographic area. For example, if there are 100 or more people based on the 2010 Census tabulated as “Sioux alone” and 100 people tabulated as “Sioux alone” in County A, then all matrices for the iteration “Sioux alone” are shown in this file for County A.

Please note that each group listed below has a corresponding characteristic iteration code, shown in the first column. In the summary file, these codes are located in the characteristic iteration (CHARITER) field of the geographic header record.

Population Thresholds

Two-Step Process

- **Iteration list** for the 2010 AIANSF represents all AIAN tribes, villages, and tribal groupings with **at least 100 people** in the **United States**
- All AIANSF **tables** are shown for each AIAN tribe, village, or tribal grouping with **at least 100 people** in a **particular geographic area**

No Blocks or Block Groups

Comparability with ACS AIAN Tables

- 2010 Census AIANSF data provide a **snapshot** of the AIAN population on April 1st, 2010
= Best for AIAN population group counts and basic characteristics
- 5-Year American Community Survey AIAN Tables provide **period estimates** covering 2006-2010
= Best for detailed social, economic, and housing characteristics of AIAN population
